Tidings of Hope

Dear Hope family It is soon Thanksgiving Day in Canada – the second Monday in October is when it occurs. I was thinking about people in my life for whom I am thankful. My family, of course, and you, the people of Hope and Fosston and area. But just now I am remembering with thanks just five of the many people who have influenced my faith and life. In no particular order... 1. Loren Teig, director of Wapogasset Lutheran Bible Camp, Amery, Wisconsin. Loren was the director of the camp I worked at for four summers, and was a part of Lutheran Youth Encounter, a youth ministry organization based in Minneapolis. Loren, my sister Becky, and four others went to East and South Africa, singing in churches and schools in the early 70's. Loren had a passion for sharing the Gospel that impressed me, a servant's heart in all he did, and in 1977 he asked me to go to India for four months, and I went. It changed my life. 2. Pastor Leslie Lurvey, my father, always shared the Gospel, loved and served Jesus and His church, and even in his death and in his absence, teaches me to rely on God who fails us never. My father taught me that pastors are human. One time, it was after church and the sanctuary was empty save for him and me, and he wondered aloud, "How many somersaults can a person do down the aisle?" Then he did it, Sunday-go-tomeeting-suit and all. The answer was about 26 – it was a long aisle. 3. Helena Tenhunen, a friend from my home church since we were five. We grew up in the church together. She got me a job in the bank at which she worked. And she went as a missionary to Murree Christian School, in northern Pakistan, near the Afghan border. Why did she go? She loves Jesus, and our youth group at church had always talked about the call to

missionary service. "We' ve talked enough," she said. "It' s time someone went."

4. Rovasti Armas and Mariam Korhonen. Armas was a retired Finnish pastor from my home church in Toronto. (*Rovasti* is an honorary title given to some clergy in the Finnish Lutheran Church.)

1. Call to Order: President Joan D. called the meeting to order.

2. Devotions: Sarah J. (Family/Youth/Education Board) read a devotion about patience based on James 5:8.

3. Approval of Agenda: Joan requested that the Women of Hope business be moved from New Business to before the brief committee reports. Motion by Dan C., seconded by Tom K. to approve agenda as amended. Approved unanimously.

4. Approval of Secretary's Report: Motion by Sarah J., seconded by Tom K. to approve the secretary's report as written. Approved unanimously.

5. President's Report: Joan reported that she received a call from the current president of the Rodness Church, LCMC located rural Erskine. Their pastor had just finished his last Sunday and they were looking for any guidance/help in going forward in ministry. They were given a list from the Deacons that Hope had used previously for pulpit supply.

Pastor's letter continued...

He and his wife had been missionaries in China, sharing the Gospel with people who did not know Jesus. They fled Mao and the Chinese Communist Revolution of 1949. It seemed like a great defeat for the Church at the time. But the Chinese Church thrived and grew, even under persecution, as it still does today. Despite the Chinese authorities closing churches and jailing pastors, the church is growing. It is because of the witness of people like Miriam and Armas and that of countless others that China may have 100 million Christians today.

Children's Hospital in St. Paul, Minnesota. We worked as chaplains in the hospital. David was in the neonatal intensive care unit – born early, a day old, with no kidney function. Helpless. Tiny. I was on call, so I went, got gowned up head to toe, got some sterilized water and a cotton swab.

reached into the incubator and baptized him in the Names. His mother was "fiddeen"-years-old, her cousin was by her side, and the nurses, bless them, how they prayed and cried.

He was as big as my hand. And loved? Why, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are still crazy in love with him. He fell asleep the next day and awoke in the arms of Jesus. I buried him the day after that, and I was all elbows and knees and thick-tongued at my first funeral.

5. David Alan B., was the first child I baptized. I was still studying to be a pastor, doing a class called *Clinical Pastoral Education* at the Gillette
