- Interprets state and federal laws and commission rules and regulations for agency staff, industry personnel and the general public; responds to complaints concerning pipeline operations and enforces existing rules and regulations; makes recommendation concerning modifying rules and policies to reflect changes in industry technology.
- Reviews operational reports, test results, construction reports, operations manuals and procedures and engineering reports and data; assists in preparing exhibits and testimony for Commission hearings; provides testimony at hearings as required.
