Kirkwood Projects Update

Kirkwood Lift Station Diversion and Abandonment update

Phase 1 of the project is currently under construction along the Harris County Flood Control ditch west of Country Village. Phase 2 extending the work into Heathlake towards Carriage Hill will start this summer. The last phase will occur at Kirkwood from the fall of 2020 to the spring of 2021.

Kirkwood Paving and Drainage Project update

The first phase goes from Buffalo Bayou through the Briar Forest intersection. The project was bid last fall. We have been waiting for Public Works to finalize the construction contract and bring it to City Council for approval. We are now expecting this to be on the Council Agenda in April. Construction will start in the second quarter of 2020. A community preconstruction meeting will be announced by the Councilman's office.

- 4-6 fresh basil leaves


Combine all ingredients in blender on high until smooth and creamy, 3-60 seconds. Makes 2 servings.

- No glass containers of any kind are permitted within the pool enclosure. Broken glass in the pool will require the pool to be closed for cleaning.
