As always I encourage you to always remember your outdoor pets!



Summertime humidity and high temperatures are just around the corner. These weather conditions require extra care for your outdoor pets.

- Never leave an animal in your vehicle, as temperatures ٠ inside a vehicle can reach well over 120 degrees in a matter of minutes.
- Be alert to the signs of heat exhaustion. Look for ٠ excessive panting or general lethargy, which may be signs your dog is overheated.
- Always be certain outdoor pets have access to plenty of ٠ shade and fresh water.
- Please also remember ALL DOGS that live in the City Limits of Moran HAVE to be on a leash when being walked around town and if you are letting your dogs out in the yard that's okay, HOWEVER they need to stay in your yard. We know sometimes they venture but please help us keep this to a minimum.



7-303 SAME; EXCEPTIONS; DISCHARGES. (a) Section 7-302 of this article shall not apply to the fire or discharge of fireworks within the <u>City between the hours of 8:00</u> <u>AM and 11:00 PM on June 27th through July</u> <u>5th.</u>

(b) The governing body of the City may, in its discretion, grant permission at any time for the public display of fireworks by responsible individuals or organizations when such display or displays shall be of such a character and so located, discharged and fired as shall not be a fire hazard or endanger persons or surrounding property.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to give any public display of fireworks without having first obtained a permit thereof.

7-304. SAME; EXCEPTION; SALE OF FIREWORKS. Any person, firm, or corporation who or which has first obtained a valid permit to sell fireworks within the City may do so between the hours of 8:00 AM and 11:00 PM commencing June 27th and through July 5th of each year.

7-305. APPROVED FIREWORKS; BOTTLE ROCKETS PROHIBITED. (a) All fireworks offered for sale and discharged within the city shall be of a type that has been tested and approved for sale and use within the state by the state fire marshal. (b) Bottle rockets and other similar self propelled firework or fireworks devices consisting of a tube and attached guiding stock or rod shall not be sold or discharged in the city.

~SUMMER LAWN CARE TIPS~

- When mowing, leave the blades of your grass slightly longer by just a couple of inches. This will help shade their roots and reduced moisture evaporation from the soil. So raise the blades on your lawn mower.
- Consider letting the grass go dormant in the summertime.
- Water early morning, very early, like at 5 am This gives the lawn an opportunity to dry before nightfall, a time when certain types of fungus are most active. This is also usually a non-peak time for most communities' water supply.
- Hold off on the fertilizer this time of year, as this would only promote growth, which means more watering and mowing.

The City would like to remind homeowners to mow your grass in a manner so that the grass is not blown out onto the roadway. Grass accumulation on the roadway can damage the structure of the roadbed as accumulated grass clippings hold water and blocks proper drainage, thereby causing subsequent road
