### **New Colony Folk Singers Rock the House** Will Perform Sunday in Amana

Last year they brought the house down at Oktoberfest. This year, packing wireless microphones with technical sound board support by volunteer Robert Brost, the New Amana Colony Folksingers and the riveting Schuhplattlers are "bringing it!"

Don't let the traditional Bavarian folks dresses and lederhosen fool you, this Amana Colony song and dance troupe is bringing the rousing, 21st century, Munich Bierhalle sing-along to Amana and yes, Des Moines, stages. Their new, hour-long show features an engaging mix of German folk classics, plus a few beloved songs from stage and film and brand-new content that will rock the fest - Amana-style!

Colony residents have the opportunity to see their show at the dress rehearsal, Sunday, Sept. 15 at 3 p.m. on the street in front of the Millstream Brau Haus in Amana.

They are performing at the Des Moines Oktoberfest, downtown near the Hessen Haus restaurant, at 7 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 27. A few Amana residents will be heading to the Oktoberfest to support the group.

Then at Amana's Oktoberfest they will be performing Friday, Oct. 4 at 7 p.m. in the Festhalle and Saturday, Oct. 5 at 11:30 a.m. at Millstream Brau Haus in Amana.

The group got together in 2017 and have since added the 8-man dance troupe, Die Schuhplattlers, and have increased the size of the band that accompanies them. This year the addition of wireless microphones for the singers, plus more audience participation songs and new material for the dancers and singers is expected to delight audiences.

The troupe started rehearsing last winter and have stepped up their rehearsals as their fall performances near. "This is an all-volunteer group and they really have had to work hard to learn the German songs, the many dances and to coordinate the performance," says Carol S. Zuber, who provides technical support and vocal/ language coaching.

Piner and Colletta are excellent together generating their own sunny, romantic vibe and bringing so much heart to the show. Kudos indeed to all the young people in this show – each one of them shines in their own way and we were charmed.

Meanwhile veterans Nikki Savitt, Dion Stover, Sean McCall and Carrie SaLoutos all deliver rock solid performances with new guy, Kyle Yampiro as the long lost Sam who returns to mend his relationship with Donna. Yampiro's strong vocals enhance many a scene.

There are big laughs in this show and one of my favorites was the duet featuring Savitt and McCall – never was a romantic proposal delivered in quite this way and it was so much fun to watch.

So wonderful was this show that it has definitely made my top five, all time favorite Old Creamery shows ever. Director Keegan Christopher, music director Janelle Lauer and choreographers Christopher and Colleta have nailed it. This is a nearly flawless production featuring strong vocals and super charged, entertaining dance numbers. The dance numbers are particularly well done and serve to power the plot and drive the production. The audience ate it up with a spoon and asked for more as the two act musical extended into a mini, post show dreamscape featuring some surprise appearances.

You don't have to be a Super Trooper fan of ABBA to love this show because there is just so much about it that is entertaining. "Mamma Mia!" music and lyrics by Benny Anderson and Bjorn Ulvaeus with Stig Anderson based on the book by Catherine Johnson.
