

Dressage Judge Activities Update

In South Australia we are facing a shortage of Dressage Judges and we desperately need to have knowledgeable riders and coaches putting up their hand to take on Judge training. Also, many of our Judges are on the 60+ age group and may want to "retire" in the next ten years or so. But it will take 5-10 years of training for enough new Judges to fill this gap. Without enough Judges, competitions will be limited and too much demand on too few. If you are interested in expanding your knowledge and giving back to your sport, please contact one of the Dressage Judges Sub-committee and find out more. Judges' Education Opportunities

The following Seminars are planned for 2021 and hopefully there will be no program changes due to COVID19! Judges at all levels, Coaches and riders are all welcome to attend. Seminars are a great opportunity for everyone to learn about how dressage training is assessed.

Fast Track Judging

Recent rule changes have made the Judges' "fast-track" option more attractive as these Judges start at F level (Novice) while they train to E (Elementary) or D (Medium) level.

Riders who have competed at PSG/Int level and gained three scores of more than 62% in the last eight years can fast-track to Elementary. Or with scores of more than 60% at Int A/B, Int2 or GP, they can fast track to Medium – it depends on your FEI level and scores. Level 2 General and Dressage Coaches can also take this path.

To get started the fast-track Judge does an Open Rule Book Test and attends a seminar at E (for E fast-track) or D level (for D fast-track). They are then a qualified F level judge and ready to take on judging Preliminary and Novice classes while working towards the E or D Theory and Practical exams. We hope more of our FEI riders will consider this option, see section 12.14 of the Rule book.

EADJC Directive Re Travers and Renvers Movements

The EADJC recently received a query regarding the use of the word "crossing" in reference to Travers and Renvers. When describing how these movements should be ridden they feel 'moving' is a more appropriate word, instead of "crossing". To provide clarity on the requirements and wording regarding these movements they have developed a Directive that will be available on the EA website:

Education>Official>Dressage>Useful Documents for all Judges & Riders.

A summary is shown here.

EADJC Letter: If we look at the diagrams for the above movements in both the FEI Handbook and the Dressage Rule book 2.12.2 & .3 (and they are the basis for understanding the mechanics of the movements) they exactly show the ideal tracks ie. four tracks, but that they are NOT equally spaced. If we looked at the tracks of a half pass it would be vastly different! However, it is correct to say in a very general way that the outside legs move in front of the inside legs as opposed to the leg yield where it is the inside hind leg which moves (crosses) in front of the outside legs.

In Travers the horse's quarters are brought into the arena so that the outside hind leg moves a little inside the track of the inside foreleg in line behind the inside shoulder. Hence the diagram which shows 4 tracks but note that it is not 4 equally apart tracks. The inner tracks are closer together. And they become even closer together the more collected and submissive to bend in body the horse is. The outside legs move in front of the inside ones, with hind legs moving close together and sweeping towards the centre of gravity — ie. under the rider in collected trot. The inside hind leg carries more weight and is more bent in all joints because the horses mass/body is moved sideways across it.

The biggest mistake is if the quarters are brought too far into arena then the outside legs have to move too far over the inside legs to maintain balance. The inside hind leg escapes sideways rather than increasing the bend and carrying and collecting. Often far too much emphasis is put on the word "crossing" – for definition of Renvers and Travers, "moving/stepping" better describes the action of the horse.

With the Renvers, again the outside hindleg moves and steps in front of the inside hindleg. Too much angle (usually too much bend in the neck only) will sacrifice the collecting process as the inside hind leg escapes. As in all three lateral movements (Shoulder-in, Travers and Renvers), the key to collecting ability is the position of the inside hind leg - taking more weight and supporting and consequently bending more through the hind leg joints.



2021 Dressage Rules and Rule Changes

Each year a new version of the Dressage Rules is released and it is important to download and check on changes. The Rules and a summary are available at www.equestrian.org.au/dressage-rules.

A summary of some of the changes is below:

3.12.2 Riding in competition, warm-up and exercise areas

i) a maximum duration of pre-competition warm-up or training of one hour is the standard; riders require permission from the Chief Steward (which will be granted only in exceptional circumstances) to extend a training session beyond one hour. The warm-up or training session must include relaxation periods, they do not include walking on a loose rein, to or from stables, or for exercise prior to or post warmup. Riders are also reminded that post-test repetition of movements may not exceed 10 minutes NOTE: Chief Steward in consultation with OC may reduce maximum duration due to welfare of horse e.g., extreme weather conditions

5.2 Headgear and helmets

h) black or may be same colour as coat, a reflective strip (not to entire helmet) permitted.

Note: Approved helmet is compulsory at <u>all</u> levels. Top hats are no longer permitted.

7.7 Unmarked movement

a) if a mark has not been recorded and the judge cannot recall the movement, or cannot be found, or if a rider

- omits a movement and has left the arena, the mark allotted should be the average of the collective marks at the end. In relation to the FEI tests where there is only one collective mark the average of the body of the test, excluding the collective, should be made
- b) for both EA and FEI tests if a rider omits/forgets a movement and the Judge at C doesn't notice (i.e. at the end of the test there is a mark missing and the rider has left the arena) a mark equal to the average for the whole test (excluding collectives) is given, with no error of course, as the Judge would have been responsible for stopping them

10.14 State Dressage Championships

- all ponies must hold current EA registration and must provide an EA approved height certificate as part of the conditions of entry
- m) measuring services must be provided to ensure all exhibits have the opportunity to be measured prior to the event

12.17.4 Ways for a candidate to do assessed sit-ins

- h) tutoring/mentoring may take place from outside the competition arena eg. in a quiet place in the stands. For an upgrading/assessed sit-in the following applies:
 - must take place with a Judge Educator or approved Mentor applicable to their level
 - no more than 2 candidates at a time
 - each candidate to propose marks for a minimum of 6 horses i.e., need at least 12 horses in the competition if there are 2 candidates
 - sit-in assessment form to be completed for each candidate

New Theory Training Options For Judge Seminars

The EADJC has completed the review of the seminar PowerPoint Presentations and has implemented two new processes for the delivery of the generic theory component of a seminar. The generic theory seminar material will be available in two formats – the traditional power point presentation and now a pdf.

The generic theory section of the seminar can be delivered in one of three ways:

- The traditional face to face as a part of a practical Seminar;
 or
- 2. With a JE via a video conference, e.g. Zoom or Microsoft Teams or similar; or
- 3. The Judge candidates/refreshers can work through the relevant topics and modules in their own home. NOTE: the EA office has yet to finalise the online delivery of the quizzes so at this stage Option 3 is not yet available.

Please note Options 1 or 2 are compulsory for G and F levels. Also, all practical Judge training MUST be undertaken face to face with live horses.

This means that for Judges at E and above, they can do the theory part of the Seminar in the comfort of home. We can plan for these Seminars to cover more practical demos and videos etc and also take less time out of the day.

Gillian Rolton Youth Development 2020 Scholarship - Dressage

The Dressage Gillian Rolton Youth Development programme for 2020 was run on the 3rd and 4th of January. This year's programme was designed by Sam Coleshill, a previous GRYD participant herself, with the support of her fellow Dressage SA Committee. It was fantastic to see Sam at only 22 yo herself take on this event with the ideas and ways to improve from her own first hand experiences: she genuinely wanted the riders to get the most out of a jam packed programme!

The focus of the event was co-efficient movements in tests. All the participants were asked to come prepared knowing what and where the co-efficients were in their test along with some of their own tests to discuss in their lessons with Julia.

It was wonderful to see all the riders start their programme together with a very informative talk and demo on bitting and bit fitting with Jane Tscharke from Equine Bit Fit Australia. Then it was straight into a theory session with Tamsin on co-efficient movements in the Preliminary / Novice tests, followed by a demo session of these movements with Mary Nitschke (also a former GRYD participant herself) and her new horse. The Preliminary / Novice riders then all had a turn at riding their test for Tamsin, pencilling for Tamsin and a turn at Shadow Judging with Tamsin. It was wonderful to look out over the arena and see the group talking together discussing the test and then the rider having another test ride.





The Elementary / Medium group of riders had their lessons with Julia on the first day. Riders could sit and listen in on these lessons and all gained valuable insights, even the parent strappers said they could see the difference that Julia's instruction and exercises achieved. Julia's lessons were also recorded using the Pixio system and riders could take copies home with them. This group of riders also had their interviews with Anne Smith on the first day. Each rider was allocated a 20 minute interview time where Anne went through some basic dressage questions, horse husbandry and future goals and plans of the riders.

There were a lot of campers and it was fabulous to see the photos of all the girls out walking the horses, talking and chatting together as their horses grazed.

We went from beautiful sunshine to winter conditions on the second day. The day started with Tamsin's theory session but this time talking about the Elementary and Medium tests. Phoebe Foulkes (also a previous GRYD participant) was the demo rider this time. It was good to see the riders interacting with Tamsin and asking questions about different movements within the tests. Then it was time for them to ride, pencil and Shadow Judge tests with Tamsin.

The Preliminary / Novice riders had their training sessions with Julia with some fantastic improvements and learning. They all watched each other's lessons except when they were doing their interviews with Anne.

During the lunch break on the second day Phoebe did a demo ride of the Prix St George test on her FEI horse Fire and Magic (who she has trained herself). Julia called each movement of the test so all the participants and their parents could see and understand what the movements were. We were all then very appreciative of Wendy Schaeffer's talk on her journey as a Young Rider that took her all the way from Pony Club to Olympic Gold. It was wonderful to watch the riders' faces during this talk, especially when Wendy brought out her Gold medal for them all to see.

Wendy Schaeffer was the Selector for the event and it was great to see her jumping into the car with Tamsin to observe, then over to Julia to watch some lessons, then back to Anne to sit in on interviews. Tamsin, Julia and Anne were all given score sheets to rate the riders on the 5 topics, as per the grant. Each then presented their results and had a discussion / question time with Wendy so she could gather all the information she needed to make her decision on the Scholarship recipient.





Feedback from participants and their parents has been fabulous. Here's a few examples:

Good afternoon.

I just wanted to congratulate the organisers of the Gillian Rolton Dressage Development Days on such a great event. Having attended three of these events now, I must say that this was quite possibly the best. Having local Coaches who are invested in the sport made a real difference. The individual lessons allowed students to work more effectively at their level, along with being given things to take away and work on. It also provided the riders the opportunity to further develop their skills with the local coaches. The bit fitting demonstration was great, however it could have afforded more time to be of a greater benefit. The riding of a test and the reflection and opportunity to ride it again and make improvements, also was a great learning experience which also boosted confidence within the riders.

The only area of improvement I would recommend would be the opportunity for the riders to mix a little more. Commencing and finishing the day together would perhaps create a little more interaction and comradery between them all.

WENDY SCHAEFFER OAM - Selector

Wendy was an Olympic Gold medallist in the Eventing discipline at the 1996 Atlanta Olympics and a Shadow Team Member for the 2012 London Olympics for both the Jumping and Eventing Sports. She has successfully competed at Badminton, Burghley, Kentucky, Luhmuhlen and Pau Internationals, now 5* events. She won the Adelaide (first rider to win twice), Gawler, Sydney, Melbourne and Lakes & Craters International events and World Cup qualifiers in both the Eventing and Jumping sports.

Wendy is a Director of Sunburst Equestrian, an Equestrian services company. She is a professional horse trainer and an NCAS Level 2 Coach in both the Eventing and Jumping disciplines. Wendy has been a Motivational Speaker for companies such as National Australia Bank and Telstra. She is an Equestrian Physiotherapist, being the first South Australian to have graduated with a Masters in Animal Physiotherapy (University of Queensland).

Wendy is the current Vice-Chair of Equestrian South Australia and has been a board member since 2018.

TAMSIN ADCOCK – Test Protocols

Tamsin arrived in South Australia from England in 1996 to establish a full-time career in Coaching and running an Equestrian Property in Echunga. ANNE SMITH - Interviewer

Anne is no stranger to the Youth Development Scholarship, having won it in 1997 and 1998 as well as being the Dressage Young Rider of the year in 1998. She is an EA Level 2 Dressage Specialist and Level 1 General Coach based at Angle Vale. She has been competing in Dressage for over 20 years up to and including Grand Prix level. Anne was the Equestrian Australia Coach of the Month in June 2019 and believes good test riding comes from confidence within the horse and rider as a combination.

She describes her way of training "modern classical", using the German training scale with an emphasis on relaxation and softness in the way the horses are going. She also has an interest in biomechanics and rider position and effectiveness of the rider's aids.

As Anne puts it: "It is a huge responsibility being a Coach. You want to pass on as much correct information as you can and support riders not only during the lesson, but at competitions and at any other time they may need you. It is a highly rewarding and satisfying job. Like anything in life the more you put in the more you get out."

JULIA WEIR - Coach

Julia is an EA Level 2 Dressage Specialist Coach, an EA Level 1 General Coach and a EA Coach Educator. She is very experienced in coaching young / green horses and riders through to FEI level and has bred and trained numerous horses from breaking in to FEI. Currently she has two horses on the South Australian FEI State Dressage Squad.

Julia has an excellent understanding of the application of correct animal behaviourism techniques to solve behavioural issues and has an interest in biomechanics with the combined result being calm, relaxed horses that have the best opportunity to stay sound and perform to their maximum capability throughout their careers. With a very thorough understanding of the requirements of performances for horses at all levels and the importance of sequential training, Julia can advise on training techniques and ringcraft to assist with gaining higher percentages in dressage tests.

During her life, Julia has travelled extensively throughout Europe and has attended Olympic Games, numerous WEGs, EDCs and Bundeschampionates as well as many other Grand Prix competitions. Also, amongst her experiences are visits to many training barns including those of Ingrid Klimke, Klaus Balkenhol, Jens Meyer, State Stud Celle and many famous

European studs, stallion shows and selection trials. Julia was fortunate enough to participate in a four day training course in Warendorf, Germany with over 180 Five Star "A" level dressage Judges from around the world who were updating their judging skills with some of Europe's best dressage riders as demonstration riders.

PHOEBE FOULKES - Demo Rider

The Youth Scholarship award is a great opportunity for SA young riders and it was a highlight to be the recipient in 2016.

Since then I have competed at the Young Rider Nationals twice. In 2018 I won the Medium Championship on Fire and Magic (Connor) and again in 2019 I competed in the FEI CDI-Y. My young horse Ellanbrae Jeniro was also the 2019 Prelim Reserve Champion at the Victorian Young Rider Championships. A career highlight would have to be winning the SA Small Tour Championships on Fire and Magic in 2019. I have trained Connor from a green broken 4YO and bringing on young horses is a true passion of mine.

MARY NITSCHKE - Demo Rider

I last participated in the GRYD program in 2018 and remember it being one of my favourite Youth events in South Australia.

Dressage SA Committee Update Horse of the Year 2021



The next HOTY event in the calendar is Dressage @ Dawn and Dusk followed closely by the State Championships at the end of March.

After much deliberation and collaboration DSA have been hard at it to come up with a wonderful competition for our AOR riders!

AOR riders now have two Horse and Rider of the Year awards. These are Annual Awards where riders gain points at different competitions throughout the year. The new Foundation Horse and Rider of the Year has been designed expressly for our grass roots AOR riders at the Preliminary and Novice levels, while the AOR Horse and Rider of the Year is for the more experienced AORs in Elementary through to Advanced. Entries to the 2021 HOTY awards are via Nominate.



2021 AOR CRITERIA

4.6.1 Amateur Owner Rider (AOR)

Amateur Owner Rider (AOR) is a division of Official Competitive riders. The intent of the division is to highlight and reward non-professional riders. For the purposes of this rule, a professional is someone who derives an income from activities in equestrian sport including breaking, training, coaching or riding horses. It does not however exclude riders who may also earn a living running an agistment property, work in the racing industry or saddlery for example. It is more about recognising riders with their own horses only to ride and train who are obliged to earn an income to support their sport outside of riding, coaching and training. All amateur owner riders must meet the following criteria:

- a) the rider must be a Competitive member of their state branch of Equestrian Australia
- b) the horse must have a life registration with Equestrian Australia
- the horse/pony registration lodged with Equestrian Australia must reflect the name of the amateur owner rider as owner or part-owner of the horse. Leased horses are eligible if the amateur owner rider competitor is reflected as the lessee on the EA horse registration of that horse
- the rider's income may only include sponsorship and occasional payment for coaching the horse/pony must be primarily ridden and trained by the rider/owner with only periodic ridden assistance by person(s) other than the owner, specifically during the period 4 weeks prior to the event
- e) the rider must be aged 21 and over can enter in the calendar year in which they turn 21
- the division is for Official Competitive competitions. The Organising Committees may run this division at any level (ideally at all levels Preliminary - GP) and it can be run either within the competition or separately
- g) Organising Committees must designate the AOR on the draw if there is a separate competition conducted within the one competition
- h) for a State/Regional/Club Leader Board it would be ideal to select several events at which scores will count towards the annual Leader Board
- i) if the OC receives evidence that the rider is in breach of these rules then this rider will forfeit any awards and prizes

Using The Scale of Marks - Stephen Clarke (UK 5* Judge)



The following was written by Stephen Clarke to give some indicators as to what each mark means.

O - NOT PERFORMED

I have only given a 0 when a horse continued in passage and did no piaffe because the rider knew he would resist. Neither the transitions nor the piaffe were performed, but this is very rare. Also once when a horse jogged or passaged through the entire walk movements. Usually there is always a fragment of the movement performed. For example if the horse trotted through a flying change there is still some canter to mark.

1 - VERY BAD & 2 - BAD

These marks are about severe resistance. For example if a horse stops, runs back or naps. Provided the nap is not for more than 20 seconds (when he would be eliminated) then the movement has to be bad or very bad.

3 - FAIRLY BAD

This could be given if there is fairly bad resistance, or a resistance combined with a lack of quality and/or other mistakes. If there is a total lack of quality and mistakes it would also be possible to give a 3 or even a 2.

4 - INSUFFICIENT

The most important thing when giving a 4 is that one thinks of the movement as 'insufficient'. If in the quality area the horse loses the regularity throughout the movement, such as half pass, through stiffness or resistance rather than unsoundness then it is a 4 or even a 3.

Serious mistakes like changing leg in a pirouette, breaking pace, dropping out of canter, jogging through part of a walk movement, not walking in a simple change are examples of when a 4 or even a 3 would be appropriate.

5 - SUFFICIENT

If the horse has achieved the movement it is usual to give a 5. Even if the movement is a somewhat restricted, earthbound, lacking suppleness or impulsion as long as the regularity is clear and the figure is fairly accurate, it can still warrant a 5. The important point is that in your remarks you state clearly why the movement is not 'satisfactory'.

When there is nothing wrong with the quality but there has been a fairly serious mistake it is also usually a 5. For instance if the quality of the reinback is good but there were two steps too many or too few and on the other hand it is still a 5 if the steps were correctly numbered but the quality was lost as if it is crooked.

When there is a mistake in the number of flying changes or a mistake in one of the changes but they are of a good quality then it is usually a 5. However, remember that it is not automatic to give a 5 for one mistake, as it could be 4 if the quality is not very good and a 6 of the quality is very high.

6 – SATISFACTORY

This covers a multitude of sins. It is normally a 6 when the movement is basically correct but lacking in quality – not supple enough, needing more engagement and balance, or maybe the contact is inconsistent. Also a 6 can be for a high quality movement with a small mistake or inaccuracy, for example a good quality walk or canter pirouette that is too big. Straightness issues often result in 6s as long as otherwise the quality is good.

7 - FAIRLY GOOD

There is usually nothing to really complain about when I give a 7. Normally everything needs a little more impulsion, suppleness, expression and/or cadence. The basic qualities are clear and show a certain amount of harmony and ease within the movement itself.

8 - GOOD

For an 8 there must be no basic problems. The movement has been properly executed. Maybe there was an extended trot that was worth a 9 but it came down to 8 because the transition was not good enough. Usually it is the secondary part of the movement that stops it being a 9, like that transition or the collected trot along the short side. Or sometimes there could be more brilliance. A 20m working trot circle may be balanced and regular but could do with some more impulsion and elasticity.

9 - VERY GOOD

'Goose bump material' with most of the movement being excellent.

10 - EXCELLENT

For a 10 you cannot imagine that a movement could be done better. It is however something very special to give a 10 and if given too lightly will lose its significance.

USE THE RANGE

Our job as judges is to be fair and clear with the marks as we can. If we see a 'very good' or 'excellent' movement we should be brave enough to reward the competitor. However, if the movement is only worth a 6, then we can only give a 6. The main point is that when a movement is good enough go up to the 9s and even the 10s, and if you see major problems be prepared to go down to the lower marks.

Dressage Awards 2021



The Equestrian South Australia (ESA) Dressage South Australia (DSA) Committee makes an Award each year to the most successful Horse/Pony and Rider Combinations. The Awards are announced and presented at The Equestrian South Australia Annual Awards Night held at the end of January or early February each year. The winning combinations are awarded an embroidered rug.

These Awards are an aggregate of the below nominated competitions held at South Australian dressage competitions over the course of the year, as well as the Australian Dressage Championships, Australian National Young Rider Championships and the AOR National Championships held Interstate. Please refer to the DSA Calendar of events for the nominated events on the ESA Website: https://www.sa.equestrian.org.au/dressage-sa.

The Annual Awards are open to all ESA Competitive members and registered horses that hold a current Dressage License. The winner of each division will have the highest aggregate score from the selected competitions held during the year. Results are taken from the nominated competitions' official Competitive results on the ESA results database.

Riders are required to nominate for the 2021 Annual Awards via Nominate. Entries will open in Mid December 2020 and be advertised on the Dressage Facebook page. It will be a rolling intake, however points will not be backdated if you enter after you have competed at a nominated event.

There is an administration fee per Award for each horse and rider combination that includes **GST**: \$11 for the first horse \$8.80 for the second and \$5.50 for the third. One rider may enter the same Award on multiple horses or may enter different horses for different Awards but cannot ride the same horse in multiple Awards.

- FEI Dressage Horse & Rider of the Year: aggregate of FEI results from the nominated competitions where scores are over 60%
- EA Dressage Horse & Rider of the Year: aggregate of results Preliminary Advanced from the nominated competitions where scores are over 60%
- Adult Amateur Owner Rider & Horse of the Year: aggregate of AOR results Elementary Advanced from the nominated competitions where scores are over 60%
- ***NEW*** Foundation Horse & Rider of the Year: aggregate of AOR results Preliminary Novice from the nominated competitions where scores are over 60%
- Dressage Young Rider of the Year aggregate of results from all levels at the nominated competitions where scores are over 60%
- Dressage Pony of the Year aggregate of results from all levels at the nominated competitions where scores are over 60%

Criteria for the Awards

- Riders must be current ESA Members.
- Horses/Ponies must be EA (SA registered) and have a current Dressage Competition Licence/Card.
- Points are awarded individually to each horse/pony and rider combination placing in official tests at the nominated events.
- Riders with more than one horse/pony will accrue separate points for each horse/rider combination in their nominated award category.
- Points only awarded if 60% or over is obtained.
- Points only awarded on two tests per day.
- Participant, Closed Restricted, Closed Unrestricted, Freestyle, tests do not count.
- Pony dressage classes count for points.
- Youth Rider age is from the beginning of the calendar year in which the rider turns **10** years for horses and **8** years for ponies to the end of the calendar year in which the rider turns **21**. This is a combined group, based on current EA Rules for Juniors and Young Riders.
- Amateur Owner Rider: in order to qualify as AOR riders must declare that they meet the criteria as set out in the National Dressage Rules 4.6.1. It is the amateur owner rider's responsibility to make sure they have made it clear on their entries to ride as an AOR and the draw clearly states AOR this cannot be back dated, if not on draw as AOR a combination cannot accrue points for that specific competition The onus is upon the rider to make this clear prior to the competition.
