



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BY LAWS OF THE Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc. ARTICLE VII

Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- Creation and Formation.
- Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation.
- Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.
- Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
- Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.
- Washing of Feet.
- Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers.
- Do not condone divorce and remarriage.
- Destruction of the Wicked
- Conditional Immortality.
- Rapture of the Man Child Class.
- Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.
- A ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not in consistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

Cracks in the Walls

The phone rang and I picked it up. The voice on the other end said, "I've got a problem. There are cracks in my walls and ceilings." Not the first time I've heard this and certainly won't be the last. Over 16 years I wish I had just a dollar for every time I'd heard it. Politely, I ask if they've looked to see if this problem is addressed in their warranty booklet they got at closing on their house. I already know they didn't look because they wouldn't have called me if they had. Again, politely, I tell them this problem is addressed under their warranty coverage. I then explain to them that what they are seeing, the hair line cracks in their raised ceiling angles and wall corners, is nothing to worry about, but to be expected as a result of the fact that their slab and everything we've built upon it are moving.

I go on to explain that their slab is designed to be basically a floating slab, reacting to the movement of the expansive soils it was built on. In times of drought the ground shrinks and the slab falls. In times of heavy rains the ground swells and the slab rises. And many times both situations exist at the same time on the same slab and its falling in one area and rising in another. This kind of movement will manifest itself inside the house by hair line cracks in sheetrock joints, where there is nothing but a layer of hardened joint compound over joint tape. I reassure them that their slab is doing what it was designed to do. That their foundation is fine. And what they are seeing inside is only natural, not warrantable, and their responsibility to take care of. I tell them they simply need to run a little calk along the hair line crack and touch it up with paint. Furthermore, I explain to them some things they can do to even out the moisture in the ground around their slab and protect their slab and minimize the evidence of slab movement.

It strikes me that our Christian walk is sometimes similar to this. Maybe you can relate to this. Something happens in our life, maybe nothing big, just a little problem. Immediately we're on the phone to God. We're almost accusatory in our tone with Him as we ask why this had to happen, like He planned for it to. Like nothing bad should ever happen and our life was supposed to be perfect just because we have this new life in Jesus Christ. We have what I like to call the apartment mentality, that somebody should fix our every problem because I'm just renting and we forget that now we own something and along with ownership comes a certain responsibility to maintain something on our own. After all, we expect the apartment manager to maintain what's his!

God knows, but He asks us anyway; "Have you read my word? You know it addresses every problem you'll ever have and some you never will. It's your guide, your handbook, your warranty. It contains my promises to you and I've never failed to keep a promise. But you know, I never promised you wouldn't have problems. I did promise you I'd deliver you from some and I'd see

you through the rest. I'd never leave you or forsake you. There's not a problem that my Son, Jesus Christ, didn't already face and defeat for you if you'll just believe in Him!"

Why is it when the problems, the cracks in our perfect lives, appear, that we start to question the foundation of our faith? We feel God has somehow abandoned us or won't see us through it. We feel we've been sold a bill of goods that we've gotten a lemon. How easily our boat gets rocked. How quickly we forget that Jesus is the cornerstone the sure and true foundation, that He can and will do what He was designed to do and what He purposed to do if we will just believe in Him and trust Him.

Why do we feel our lives should be perfect and without trials when Jesus' wasn't? Satan assailed him as soon as He came out of the Jordan with John the Baptist. He tempted Him and tried Him. so we too will have to go through the times of drought, our testing in the desert and it will seem like our foundation is falling, but if our faith is secure in Jesus it will hold and perform and function as God intended. And likewise when we go through times of abundance and satan tempts us with all the good things in life and perhaps we start to swell up and think we're something, God brings us back to the reality that we are what we are, we have what we have, through Jesus Christ. As long as we know that we know who we are in Jesus Christ, as long as He is our foundation, the chief cornerstone of our lives and our faith then will be okay.

God has made provision for our problems and it's the blood of Jesus Christ, His only Son. Are you going to accept the responsibility for your life and apply the covering of the blood to those cracks, those problems or are you going to do as Job's wife suggested and curse God, deny your faith and tell everyone what a lousy builder He is. Cracks happen, life isn't perfect, nothing on this earth ever will be until Christ comes back again. He is perfection and He's preparing a place of perfection for us. But we've got to deal with this life here and now. Everyone is going to have cracks, problems in their lives. Where does your assurance lie? Out of what have you built your foundation? If your belief is in yourself or other men you're going to be very sorry. Maybe not today but someday that foundation will fail you and it won't be little cracks but major structural failure that you'll be experiencing. Get your eyes on Jesus Christ. Realize that He will see you through the droughts and the storms of life if He doesn't deliver you from them. Maintain and preserve your sure foundation by keeping your faith constant and consistent. Pray, read, sin not, and love one another, give yourself, all of yourself, to the Lord and trust in Him and He will be that sure foundation for vou.


Knowing These Things The First Epistle of Peter

They Are The Apple Of My Eye

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters." (Gen. 1:1-2) "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." (John 1:1) They were all there in the beginning. They? Sanctification

A man bought a new house. It was the first house he had ever owned. It had a sturdy foundation and lots of room. It was able to withstand any storm. His favorite part, though, was the part everyone who drives by sees... the yard. A house can be wonderful, but if the yard is bad, no one notices the house. So he mowed, mowed, edged, and fertilized. Then, one day, his whole world fell apart. He saw a dandelion. Then another. They were all over the place!

How do you get rid of dandelions? Easy, you pull them off. So, the yard is all pretty and green with grass, just grass. About two days later, though, there are more blooms once again. So, you pull them again. They'll go away this time for sure. But, two days later... THEY'RE BAAAAAACK. No matter how many times you pull those stupid flowers up, they will continue to come back.

As with most weeds that take over your yard, dandelions have a root system. To stop the flowers, you have to stop the root system. You can pull up the whole root system, but you would pull up the whole yard. You can also get a spray, but that may kill the grass along with it. Either way, it'll be alot of hard work getting the lawn back in order. Is it really worth it? You can probably drive around your neighborhood, or at least your town, and see someone who has found it isn't worth it. It may even be you! The yard has been taken over by weeds. The once green, plush grass has been choked, leaving bare or brown spots. You also see where people have even stopped mowing.

I illustrated this picture for you to aid in the subject of sanctification. When we are saved, it is like our new house. We have a foundation on the Word of God (Matthew 7:24-27). We have alot of room for God to fill us with His wonderful blessings. The part we most cherish though is that we have been forgiven. Our sins have been taken away.

What everyone sees is the things we do, and, since we have been forgiven, we are turned from our wicked ways. We will never commit a sin again. Then it slips. We cuss, or we take a drink of alcohol, or we get into a fight, or whatever our weakness was, we fall into it once again. We pray, and it's forgiven. We'll never do it again. Once again, though, we fall.

Just like the dandelions in the yard, we have to get to the root of our problems. The root of these sins that keep popping up is the sin nature embedded in us. To pull all of the root up, though, we have to change ourselves drastically. Then, after we dig up all of the sin, we have to repair the rest of ourselves. It's alot of work. Some either don't realize, yet, how to get rid of the root, or they don't want to go through all of that work. They either let the sins pop up and deal with them one at a time in vain, or they give up totally and let the sin overcome their lives, making their "homes" unnoticeable. When sin overtakes their lives, it kills off the once strong and pretty things God has placed there. Then it gets to

the point where God is separated from you by the sin (Isaiah 59:2).

In Isaiah 53, the prophet speaks of the servant of God. We know this, now, to be a prophesy of Jesus Christ, and His crucifixion. Verse 5 says, "...he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities..." Once again we see an underlying factor and an open air factor. A wound is an injury that involves broken skin. It brings the blood to the surface. Likewise, a sin, or transgression, is an act that is clearly seen. A bruise, however, is under the surface of the skin. It is detected by the blood discoloring the skin, but it is not directly seen. As is the sin nature, or iniquity, that lies within us. It is under the surface, but it is still detected, although not openly.

Sin is not evil doing. Sin is evil being. A man can reform himself in almost every way. We see many unsaved quit drinking, smoking, cussing, lying, stealing, etc. It's similar to what Jesus said to the Pharisees, "... ye make clean the outside of the cup and of the platter, but within they are full of extortion and excess."

"The essence of sin is the right to one's self," says Oswald Chambers. When the first sin was committed, it was not because of any reason except that Adam wanted to be greater than what he already was. He did not love God enough to obey Him, but he loved himself. All of the Ten Commandments focus on giving to God and other men before yourself. In Mark 12:30,31 it records Jesus saying the two greatest commandments are to love God and to love your neighbor. Verse 31 concludes with, "There is none other commandment greater than these." The only other commandment would be to love one's self, and there is nowhere in the Bible that it says that. In fact, it says to "deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow [Jesus]." (Matthwew 16:24)

When Adam esteemed himself more important than God, the sin nature was born in him. That nature is hereditary, and we are all now born with it. It is the nature that says, "I want...", and not "I will". It is the nature that Paul struggled with when he wrote Romans:

"For that which I do I allow not: for what I would, that do I not; but what I hate, that do I...Now then it is no more I that did it, but sin that dwelleth within me. For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with me; but how to preform that which is good I find not...So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God, but with the flesh the law of sin."

(Romans 7:15,17,18,25)

It is also the nature that Peter, James, and John struggled with at the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus saw this and told them, "Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." (Matthew 26:41)

This sin nature that says "I want" rather than "I will" is the nature even Jesus struggled with. In the Garden of

Gethsemane Jesus' prayer was, "Father, if thou be willing, remove this cup from me: nevertheless not my will, but thine, be done." (Luke 22:42) He had such a struggle with His flesh, His sin nature, that He sweat great drops of blood. Only in the most strenuous situations does that happen.

What these men taught us, though, by word and deed, is that we <u>are</u> more than conquerors in all these things. We must rid ourselves of all things exalting themselves against the knowledge of God. (II Corinthians 10:5) He called us to be holy. (I Thesselonians 4:7) Jesus' last prayer was for our sanctification:

"I pray not that thou shouldest take them out of the world, but that thou shouldest keep them from evil. They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth... And for their sakes I sanctify myself, that they also might be sanctified through the truth." . . . (John 17:15-17, 19)

The first part of this passage, Jesus prayed that we would be in the world, but not of the world. Paul discussed this also in Rom 12:2:

"And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God."

Then Jesus said we would be sanctified by the Truth, God's Word. We find in James 1 that the Word is used as a mirror. Some men read it, or hear it, and continue in their ways as if they hadn't.

God has made Himself very clear He wants us to be holy and righteouss and without sin, and unblemished and unspotted. Do you have any doubts? Read:

Exodus 19:21-21, Psalm 51, Isaiah 5:2, Isaiah 66:17, Matthew 19:28,29, Mark 12:30,33, Luke 1:74,75, John 1:11-13, John 3:3-6, John 9:31, John 15:1-5, Romans 6, Romans 8:1-18, Romans 12:1,2, I Corinthians 2:16-3:3, I Corinthians 6:11, I Corinthians 15:34, II Corinthians 7:1, Ephesians 1:4, Ephesians 4:20-24, Ephesians 5:25-28, Ephesians 6:14, Phillipians 1:11, Colossians 1:21-23, I Thess. 3:12-4:7, I Thess. 5:22, I Timothy 4:4-8, I Timothy 6:11, II Timothy 2;21,22, Hebrews 2:11 Hebrews 6:1, James 1:27, James 5:16, I Peter 1:15-19, I Peter 3:11-17, I Peter 4:1-4, I John 3:3,9, I John 5:3,4 and 18.

Bob was a bull-rider, a sailor, a successful business man with a career in sales. His last secular job was with Pitney-Bowes where he was consistently the salesman of the year.

He committed his life to the Lord fifteen years ago and founded a ministry called Island Missions. He was director of this ministry until his death. He distributed over two million Bibles, New Testaments and scripture books. He equipped fifteen Jesus film teams to minister in Cuba, Costa Rica, Jamaica, the Dominican Republic, Porta Rico, Trinidad, Guyana, Honduras, Guatemala, the Amazon River in Brazil, four films in Belize and one in Liberia, West Africa. In 1990, with his father Albert's help, he began a radio broadcast on the island of Roatan, Honduras, which is still ministering to an audience of 250,000 people on a daily basis. Robert also pastored a church in the country of Belize. He provided labor, equipment and beds for a hospital on the Mosquito Coast. Most recently, Robert raised funds for the construction for the first new church to be constructed in Havana since 1959. The list could go on and on but the one thing Bob held to be important was that people were hearing the Gospel and being saved.

Robert received his first ministers license from the Full Gospel Evangelistic Association. At his death, he was ordained by Greater Ministries International and by Anchor Bay Evangelistic Association. He was a member of the International Charismatic Bible Ministries. He was also a member of Zion Word Church in Anderson, Missouri.

Robert was a board member of the *Power and Light School of Evangelism* in Siloam Springs, Arkansas which also has a school in Havana, Cuba. He was a board member of *Caribbean Son Shine Ministries* located in Fort Wayne, Indiana, and he was on the board of elders of *Greater Ministries International Church* in Tampa, Florida.

Robert married Lawriece Roberts on July 22, 1988. She survives. He is also survived by three sons: Randy, Rick and Damon; two daughters Pam and Diana; two step-daughters, six grandchildren, two step-grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

He was buried in Union cemetery at Stella, Missouri.
