Godly Wisdom

Several weeks ago the Adult Bible Study Sunday School lesson was on the third chapter of the book of James. (See James 3:13-18). The title of the lesson was "Living Wisely."

In the passage James lifts up the virtue of "wisdom" in the life of the Christian. In writing about "wisdom" he is not using the term to mean being smart. It is not wisdom in terms of knowledge, being educated. Though this kind of wisdom is valuable that is not the virtue he says is essential to Christian living and Christian community.

Wisdom as James writes about it is ones basic approach to life – the lens through which one views life. He contrasts "godly" and "worldly" wisdom. Godly wisdom looks at life as God looks at it. Worldly wisdom views everything through the lens of "I". Things are good or bad on the basis of how they affect me. I am the center of everything.

During the week before this lesson I was listening to a talk radio station as I was on a trip across Montgomery. The subject of the conversation was the State of Alabama's financial woes. A woman called in and said that gambling, a lottery in particular, was the answer to the state's problems. She said that we ought to have gambling because she likes to gamble. That was the sole reason it was right in her eyes. She likes to do it and that makes it OK. There was no consideration for any other concern regarding gambling. Because she likes to do it we ought to have gambling in Alabama.

Her conversation was the perfect example of "worldly" wisdom – seeing everything through the lens of "I."

We should all yearn to be Godly wise – to see everything as God sees it. To have His perspective on our own lives and all that goes on in the world around us. Such wisdom is essential to our work together in Emmaus. What is important is not how I see things – what I think is right and best – but how God sees what we plan and do and seek to accomplish.

BUBBASAYS:

Dear Bubba,

Someone said there had been some changes made by the Emmaus Board of Directors that would affect how things were done on a Walk. Can you help me understand some of these? Signed,

In Question

Dear I.Q.:

I can try. I have a basic knowledge of a few of them, so we'll go from there. We have a model, given to us from the Upper Room, that we try our best to follow concerning a Walk. The changes you are asking about are not really changes at all, but instances where CAEC has tried to "improve" what has worked so well for so many years. Sometimes the changes made were just little ones, but the longer they stayed in place, the larger they became until we all thought that was how things should be done.

If you remember that it is really all about the Pilgrims and their experience as a cloistered community, I think you'll agree that it makes sense to get squared-up with the model (one more time). If you've been around long enough, this was probably how it was done on your Walk anyhow.

Agape: No names of individuals as donors. That's simple. We are the agents of God's agape love - delivering His gift, not ours. Agape isn't for individual recognition, it's to show God's agape love to the Pilgrim. We're His hands and feet - remember the talk? So, please identify a Cluster or Reunion group instead.

Pilgrim letters: The 10-12 most important letters are to be selected and tied together by the sponsor with a ribbon.

All letters are important, but since there's never enough time to read them all at camp, the ones from family and closest friends are the ones the Pilgrim needs to see first.

Refreshments: Servers or preparers are not to be seen at all. This removes the temptation for us to personally check out how things are going for the Pilgrims and take their mind off what is really important. It reminds them of ball game scores or other things best left behind for 72 hours.

Meal service: This should be another instance of agape love in action, not an opportunity to identify yourself or your church. The cloistered environment can be fragile, and meal times are times for the Tables to get to know each other and interact within the conference room environment.

I know there are other items, but let me just narrow it down so you can't go wrong. It's all about the Pilgrims. If you or your vehicle are seen in a way that takes the Pilgrims mind off the Walk, please don't be upset if someone reminds you to be invisible. If you are upset that "you" are not being recognized in some manner, please examine your heart. It's all about the Pilgrims. It's all about invisible service - working as God's hands and feet. Set your heart for service and remember how it was on your Walk when you were so amazed at all the things being done for you - and you had no idea who provided the kindnesses and services. It was wonderful to feel all the love - from strangers as agents of God. The heart of a servant is the goal, not recognition. I think you can see that these are really very small alterations, and shouldn't really affect the workers at all.


