CONGREGATIONAL MEETING....

Sunday, February 11th, 2018 Immediately following Worship

The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) has extended the Call to Rev. Dr. Leanne Simmons to serve as our next Installed Pastor and an agreement has been reached on the Terms of Call. Arrangements are being made to introduce Rev. Simmons to the congregation at the worship service on February 11th, 2018. Rev. Simmons will lead worship that day and a Special Congregational Meeting has been scheduled following worship for the purpose of a congregational vote on the acceptance of Rev. Simmons and the Terms of Call. A reception is planned in the Parlor following the congregational meeting when members will have the opportunity to meet and greet Rev. Simmons.

Leanne Simmons is currently serving as Pastor of All Saints Presbyterian Church in Columbus, GA. She has held this position since 2009. Rev. Simmons is originally from Sioux City, IA. She still has family living in Sioux City and indicates she has hoped she may have the opportunity to move back to the upper Midwest to be closer to her family in Sioux City.

Rev. Simmons attended and earned degrees from Central Bible College and the Assemblies of God Theological Seminary in Springfield, Missouri. She then served as Campus Minister at Morningside College in Sioux City, IA. After several years at Morningside, Rev. Simmons attended Princeton Theological Seminary in Princeton, NJ where she earned her Master's Degrees in Divinity and Theology as well as a Doctorate Degree in Philosophy. While in Princeton, NJ she served as Chaplain at Trenton Psychiatric Hospital in Trenton, NJ and Associate Pastor at Princeton Baptist Church at Penns Neck in Princeton, NJ. She then served as adjunct professor at several universities extending from Princeton Theological Seminary to Columbus Theological Seminary in Decatur, GA, LaGrange College in

LaGrange, GA and Auburn University in Auburn, AL until beginning her ministry at All Saints Presbyterian Church in Columbus, GA in 2009. Rev. Simmons is currently a member of the Flint River Presbytery that covers the Columbus, GA area. She has been a very active member of that presbytery. She was ordained as a PCUSA

Presbyterian Minister in 2011.

Rev. Simmons has been married and divorced and currently is a single mother of a 13 year old daughter, Audrey, who was adopted from China when she was 2 years old. Leanne and Audrey visited Bismarck for the first time December 8th—11th when they were hosted by the PNC and when Leanne preached at First Presbyterian Church of Mandan. During that visit the PNC and Rev. Simmons and Audrey had the opportunity to get to know each other better and Leanne had the opportunity to visit our church and to meet and visit briefly with office and child care center staff and to meet and visit with Pastor Reiter.

The PNC is very pleased that Rev. Simmons has accepted the Call to serve as our next Installed Pastor. It is believed that she will be a great "fit" for our church. Rev. Simmons will be moving to Bismarck in May after school is out in Columbus, GA and she will begin her ministry in Bismarck on June 1st, 2018. Until that date we will be served on Sundays with Pulpit Supply as we were prior to the arrival of Pastor Reiter.

Please join the PNC in welcoming Rev. Simmons on February 11th!!

PER CAPITA PAYMENTS DUE

Each year the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly assess our church a Per Capita fee for every member of the congregation. The Per Capita fees are essentially dues for the services received from these governing bodies of the Presbyterian Church.

For 2018, First Presbyterian's assessment is **\$44.00** per member, which the church pays regardless of how much is collected. Please take **\$44.00** times the number of church members in your family and send that amount in a separate check made out to First Presbyterian, with "Per Capita" in the memo line.

The difference between what First Presbyterian owes and what is collected from the congregation will come out of the church budget. Thank you for taking care of this so that the church can take care of its many other budget needs.



PASTOR'S MESSAGE...

As of February 1—I am no longer "Pastor David" or "Pastor Reiter." To some I may always be "Reverend Reiter." Or just David or Dave. Before long I probably will become "that last guy." Or, maybe even "What's his name." But for sure, I no longer will be the Pastor of the church.

Because of the very meaningful, personal, and spiritual nature of the congregation and pastor relationship, it is important, and especially is healthy, that there will always be a clear understanding of the real difference that takes place when that relationship "dissolves" (common Presbyterian terminology).

Instead of the term, I prefer to think of it as *a completion* of a shared ministry relationship. The calling from God for you and for me to serve together will have come to its particular completion when I retire on February 1. Of course, meaningful relationships and friendships do not end so abruptly, and should not be so easily compartmentalized and switched off.

That is why Presbyterians have Separation Ethics policies—which is true of our Presbytery of the Northern Plains. The text can be found on the presbytery's website under "About" and "Policies." Also a printed copy is available in the church office. There is a section that provides important reminders for both congregation and former pastors. Five essential points are:

- a. All pastoral and professional relationships and responsibilities of the pastor with the congregations will end as of the effective date of dissolution.
- b. The pastor will not be involved in any way in the selection process of the next pastor.
- c. The pastor, after leaving, will not become engaged in conversations with church members or staff, which in any way, offer opinions of criticism about the life of the congregation or the performance of any subsequent pastors.
- d. Any desire on the part of members of the congregation for the departing pastor to participate in congregational life or services should be discussed not with the departing pastor, but with the subsequent pastor.
- e. The departing pastor may participate in an event of the congregation, after the date of dissolution only upon the invitation of the subsequent pastor.

Separation ethics are meant for the good of the church, and its future pastor and congregation relationship—which I appreciate and totally respect.

But also...the policy continues with great understanding:

"This does not mean that friendships must come to an end. Friendships are priceless and are to be preserved, but there is a special responsibility on the part of the departing pastor to prevent friendships from becoming confused with the pastoral relationship."

So...Do you know what I plan to call you after I retire? My Good Friends!



NURSE'S NOTES...

Well, 2018 is here. January was very cold...how cold was it? You ask...It was so cold I had to break the smoke off my chimney and if you baked a cake, all you had to do was set it in the window. Two minutes later it was frosted! Now that is cold!

Some of us make New Year's resolutions; I promised myself I would start this year off with offering strengthening exercises to you every Monday and Thursday at 10 a.m. This is a way to start the year moving. Any movement will assist us in getting healthier. Come join me in fun, music and moving!

It's never too late to learn too. So my goal in 2018 is to provide skills and information toward healthy living. Alzheimer's research and awareness in protecting yourself. And everyone in the community is invited. You just need to let us know if you are coming so we know the size of the class. You may sign-up on the Volunteer Board in the Narthex or call the church office to sign-up. If you have a request for knowledge in another area let me know.

The monthly newsletter is a perfect source to include awareness: February is American Heart Month. Here are some Heart Disease facts from The National Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion at CDC and the CDC Division for Heart Disease and Stroke Prevention:

What is Heart Disease?

Heart disease is referred to several types of heart conditions. The most common type is coronary artery disease, which can lead to a heart attack. Other kinds of heart disease may involve the valves in the heart, or the heart may not pump well causing heart failure. Some people are born with heart disease.

Anyone including children can develop heart disease. It occurs when a substance called plaque builds up in your arteries. When this happens your arteries can narrow over time reducing blood flow to your heart. Smoking, eating an unhealthy diet and not getting enough exercise; increase your risks for having heart disease. Having high cholesterol, high blood pressure (**hint:** Once a month on a Sunday at FPC there is a BP clinic offered at church 9-10 a.m. and 11-12 p.m.), or diabetes can increase your risk for heart disease. Ask your doctor about preventing or treating these medical conditions. The symptoms vary depending on the type of heart disease. For many people, chest pain or discomfort or a heart attack is the first sign.

Risk Factors

High blood pressure, high LDL cholesterol, and smoking are key heart disease risk factors for heart disease. About **half of Americans** (49%) have at least one of these three risk factors.

Several other medical conditions and lifestyle choices can also put people at a higher risk for heart disease, including:

- * Diabetes * Overweight & Obesity
- * Excessive Alcohol Use

- * Poor Diet * Physical Inactivity

NURSE'S NOTES...(continued)

HEART ATTACK WARNING SIGNS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

Chest discomfort

Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.

- Discomfort in other areas of the upper body
- Shortness of breath
- Other signs may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness

STROKE WARNING SIGNS ARE AS FOLLOWS: Spot a stroke F.A.S.T.:

- **Face Drooping:** Does one side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile.
- Arm Weakness: Is one are weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?
- **Speech difficulty:** Is speech slurred, are they unable to speak, or are they hard to understand? Ask the person to repeat as simple sentence, like "The sky is blue." Is the sentence repeated correctly?
- **Time to call 9-1-1:** If the person shows any of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 9-1-1 and get them to the hospital immediately.

CARDIAC ARREST WARNING SIGNS

- Sudden loss of responsiveness
- No response to tapping on shoulders
- No normal breathing

If these signs are present call 9-1-1



Are YOU at risk of a ^HEART ATTACK? Check all boxes that apply to you:
AGE AND SEX I am a man over 45 years old OR a woman over 55 years old.
FAMILY HISTORY My father/brother had a heart attack before age 55; OR my mother/sister had a heart attack before age 65; OR my mother, father, sister, brother or grandparent had a stroke.
HEART DISEASE I have coronary heart disease, atrial fibrillation, angina or other heart condition(s) OR I have had a heart attack.
BLOOD PRESSURE My blood pressure is 140/90 mm Hg or higher OR a health professional has said my blood pressure is too high OR I don't know what my blood pressure is.
TOBACCO SMOKE I smoke OR live or work with people who smoke regularly.
TOTAL CHOLESTEROL My total cholesterol is 200 mg/dL or higher OR I don't know my cholesterol level.
HDL CHOLESTEROL My HDL (good) cholesterol is less than 40 mg/dL OR I don't know my HDL cholesterol level.
LDL CHOLESTEROL My LDL (bad) cholesterol is too high OR I don't know my LDL cholesterol level.
PHYSICAL ACTIVITY I get less than a total of 30 minutes of physical activity on most days.
OVERWEIGHT I am 20 pounds or more overweight for height and build OR I have a body mass index (BMI) score of 25 or more.
DIABETES I have diabetes (a fasting blood sugar of 126 mg/dL or higher) OR I need medicine to control my blood sugar.
If you checked two or more boxes, please see a health care provider for a complete assessment of your risks!

Session approved the 2017 Presbytery Statistical Report with corrections. Thanks to Vickie Haas for completing this yearly report.

Jim Skaret, Chair of Business and Finance, reported that the investment portfolio for 2017 had a net increase of \$135,327.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Reiter urged Session to continue being strong, welcoming, flexible, collaborative, prayerful; to communicate with everyone and to love and serve Christ in all things.

COMMITTEE REPORTS (from minutes and meeting)

Outreach—A group of committee members will travel to Fargo on February 8th to observe and learn first-hand about their "power lunch". Session approved having Outreach host in the church parlor, a Higher Power Lunch on the third Wednesday of each month beginning in April. Downtown business leaders will be invited to attend. Session approved a presentation at FPC by Dr. Johnson on Sunday afternoon, October 7th in advance of the Presbytery meeting in Mandan on October 8th. Dr. Johnson will speak on social justice.

Worship and Music—University of Jamestown Choir will present a concert on March 4th, 4:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary. The committee will provide a meal after the concert. There seems to be a faulty connection in the cord to the pastor's microphone which needs to be fixed.

Membership—The committee will be meeting on the first Thursday of the month and has recruited several new members.

Administrative and Personnel—The committee completed evaluations of the four full-time staff members. Follow-up letters were mailed to all those removed

from the membership roll.

Christian Education—The committee welcomes the return of Ashley Greenwood in February. Teens will not be participating in Presbytery Rest Fest but have a lock-in instead.

Stewardship—To date, 151 pledges of \$303,716 were received. This compares to 169 pledges for \$328,000 last year. Special offerings in 2017 totaled \$7,300. The Christmas Eve offering for the Emergency Food Pantry was \$1,027.


