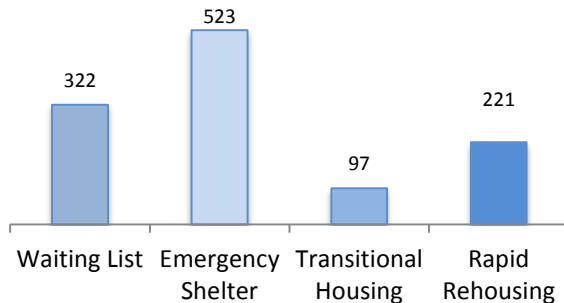

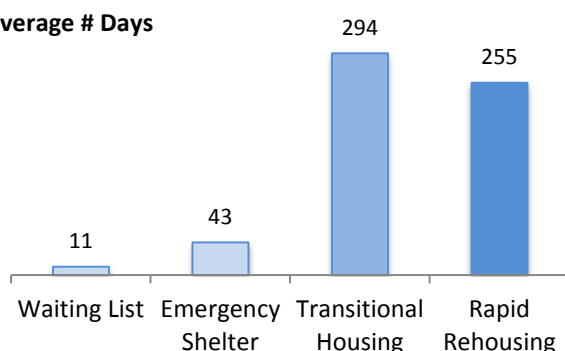

TYPE & DURATION OF HOUSING

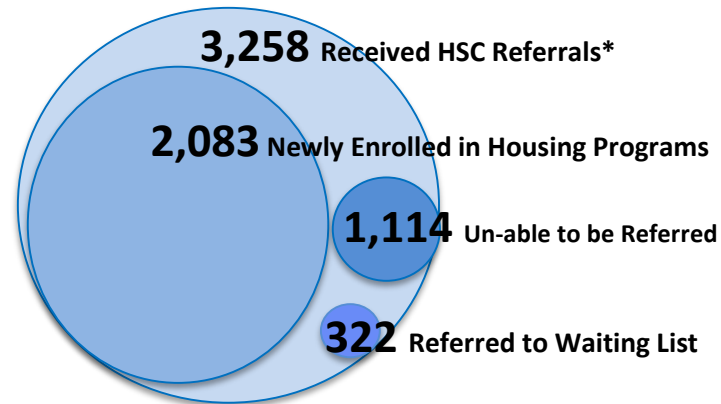

HOUSEHOLDS ASSISTED

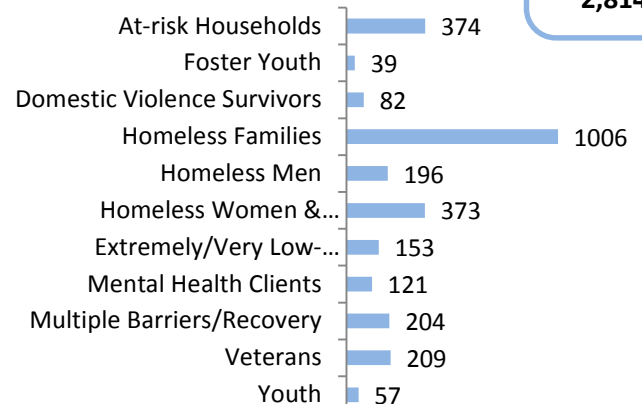
