Sleepy Eye Milling Company

- 1883: The first mill was built capacity 700 barrels
- Operated from 1892 to 1921
- 1894: They made Cream, Apple Blossom, Gold & Snowflake, Chief & Cyclone Brands of flour.
- 1902: The second mill was built under President A.C. VonHagen capacity 5000+ barrels
- At one time the mill owned 27 elevators in MN and SD and had its own copper shop that made the barrels for the flour.
- Not all flour was sold in barrels, much was sold in cloth sacks.
- They also manufactured another brand of flour by the name of Hummer, which used hummingbirds as its trademark.
- 1904: Sleepy Eye Flour was the grand prize winner at the St. Louis Exposition
- 1917: mill was sold to Kansas Flour Mills
- The mill mainly produced flour although they also produced other cereal products, Pankako and Koffeeno from time to time.
- The mill was one of the largest and most famous in the country competing with flour all over the world.
- The mill had several collectible items that were placed in the flour sacks as a premium.
- The flour mill sold or gave away not only the pottery but a variety of other items including advertising cards, cookbooks, rulers, breadboard scrapers, silver spoons, table linen, wigwams and pillow tops, a brass Trademark Indian bust and barrel labels.
