The annual event, in collaboration with the National Park Service, was held at the Columbus Memorial in front of the Union Station in Washington, D.C.

Members of the public in attendance were treated to patriotic music, the national anthems of the United States, Italy, and Spain, remarks by various diplomats and dignitaries, as well as the reading of the winning essay and presentation of awards to Joseph Stetson, Steubenville, Ohio, this year's winner of the NCCA and the National Italian-American Foundation Essay Contest on Christopher Columbus. Together with many other prominent organizations, the IHL placed a wreath in front of the Columbus Memorial. 
