Jeanie Pollard Kline returned to Old Dominion University in 2011 and is currently launching an Office of Summer Studies for the University. She had previously served as Assistant Vice President for Distance Learning at Old Dominion. In that role, Dr. Kline helped to develop of the University's award-winning distance learning program, created articulation agreements with community college partners, supervised site directors in Georgia, North Carolina, Illinois, Arizona, Washington, and the District of Columbia, and maintained oversight of accreditation and licensure for all out-of-state operations.

Dr. Kline also worked at the University of Mary Washington in Fredericks-burg, VA, as Associate Dean of the College of Graduate and Professional Studies. In her role there, she served as a liaison to the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. She assisted faculty with developing new programs and oversaw ad-vising, marketing and campus operations. She drafted a plan for sustainability structures at UMW, worked on Continuity of Operations planning, and worked with the Fredericksburg Regional Chamber of Commerce Education Foundation.

Dr. Kline has served on the Executive Board of the Virginia Network since 2004, holding the role of State Coordinator from 2008-2011. She has also served on the Women's Caucus at ODU and on the Presidential Council on Sustainability, the Teaching/Learning Technology Resource Board, and the Leadership Colloquium for Professional Women at UMW.

Dr. Kline is very proud of the degrees she earned throughout the state of Virginia: a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration at Virginia Tech; a Master of Education and a Master of Business Administration at Virginia Commonwealth University; and an Educational Specialist and Doctor of Education at the College of William and Mary. She also holds a Certificate in the Teaching of Writing, and serves as an adjunct assistant professor in the College of Arts and Letters at Old Dominion University.
