TREASURER'S REPORT

We are still doing well through the end of July. Total expenses are about \$16,413 under budget, the bulk of that attributable to the landscape budget item. This is not unusual, however, since we usually incur higher landscape expenses in the fall season, when tree maintenance and fall plantings occur. We are also under budget in the utilities and pool expense items, and just about on budget in the general/administrative category. We are over budget in maintenance and repairs. mainly due to having paid for the backflow inspections for the entire community (as mentioned in last month's newsletter). This was overlooked during the budget planning process last year, but will be included in future planning sessions. Our operating cash position of about \$66,000 should be sufficient to cover any surprises. Last but not least, our delinquent accounts situation has

of August we had only one delinquent homeowner who owed more than \$500. This was quite a difference from the previous month when we had eight delinquent accounts totaling about \$8900. We have clarified delinquency procedures, and hope that improved communication between all parties will keep this problem to a minimum going forward. ~ Ron Yamato
