November 16th update on Fr Adam

Prayers are being answered and progress is being made! Adam is improving a bit each day. He has been able to remain on his back and been keeping steady oxygen levels since my last post. There's still a long way to go, but we'll take each and every improvement with praise and glory to God

The doctor recommended they do a tracheotomy on Adam since his lungs still need a bit more time to heal and he can't remain intubated for much longer. This will most likely happen the end of this week/beginning of next. After the trach is placed they will slowly wean him off of sedation and see how he handles breathing on his own.

The best news of the day though, is this: I happened to be in Fargo for work when my Mom called me to say Adam was allowed to have a visitor. I finished up my work, as quick as possible and ran straight to the hospital to see him. He may not have liked it (sister cooties, ya know) but I held is hand the entire time. It was such a blessing and the Lord has been so good. We're figuring out a schedule, but now my mom, myself or my brother will be able to be there moving forward.

Thank you all for your continued prayers. We are grateful and blessed to have every single one of them. Please keep all the covid patients, their families, and the doctors and nurses in your prayers. Thank you!
