SUMMARY OF SEMINAR SESSIONS

PARENT LEADERSHIP 101

This session will focus on parent leadership and the roles and responsibilities within various parent organizations, including Parent Advisory Councils, Local School Councils, Bilingual Advisory Council, Parent Teacher Organizations, Parent Teacher Associations, and Parent Teacher Student Organizations. ACTION PLANS I & II
