



Sept 30-St. Jerome-A Biblical translator and monastic leader, St. Jerome is probably best known for translating most of the Bible into Latin. A doctor of the Church, he lived for a time as a hermit, became a priest and served as secretary to Pope Damasus I.

Oct 1-St. Therese of the Child Jesus-Also known as St. Therese of Lisieux and "The Little Flower," St. Therese of the Child Jesus was a French Catholic Discalced Carmelite nun. "My mission - to make God loved - will begin after my death," she said. "I will spend my heaven doing good on earth. I will let fall a shower of roses." Roses have been described and experienced as Saint Therese's signature. *www.littleflower.org*

Oct 2-The Holy Guardian Angels-The mission of the Guardian Angels is, as Saint Paul tells us, to serve the future heirs of salvation. Every kingdom, country, diocese, church and religious order has its protecting Guardian Angel. So has every person. Each bishop of the Catholic Church has two Guardian Angels. Our Guardian Angel is given us at the moment of our birth, stays with us all through life, comforts us in Purgatory, and escorts us, if we are saved, into Heaven. There is a special angel in each church to record all distractions and irreverences that occur there. The greatest joy any of us can give our Guardian Angel is to receive Holy Communion and make our breast a tabernacle of the Eternal God before Whom this angel can adore. *-www.catholicism.org*

Oct 4-St. Francis of Assisi-Patron saint of animals, St. Francis of Assisi was born into a wealthy family and spent much of his youth partying with friends. When he was riding off to battle in Perugia, God came to him in a dream and told him to return home. While he never became a Priest (he was ordained a Deacon) he is considered the founder of the Franciscan order. He and his companions would go out two by two to preach about God's love.

Oct 5-BI. Francis Xavier Seelos-A German redemptorist, Bl. Francis Xavier Seelos was a missionary working in the United States "frontier." He cared for victims with yellow fever until he succumbed to the same disease in 1867 in New Orleans.






Gracious and loving God, we thank you for the gift of our priests. Through them, we experience your presence in the sacraments.

La parábola del hombre rico y Lázaro es una historia poderosa y dolorosa de advertencia. La narrativa del Evangelio dibuja una imagen vivida. Podemos imaginar al hombre pobre, Lázaro, tirado a la puerta del hombre rico. Podemos ver al rico hombre con nuestra mente, bien vestido y bien alimentado. El hombre rico pasa cerca de Lázaro todos los días, pero en realidad nunca lo ha mirado. Aunque conoce por nombre a Lázaro, no le interesa al hombre rico. Sin embargo, le importa a Dios. El hombre rico no solamente falló en cuidar en vida a Lázaro. Él esperaba que Lázaro le sirviera en la vida del más allá. Él está tan enfocado en sí mismo. Solamente después de que se da cuenta de las consecuencias eternas de su falta de atención, piensa en sus hermanos. E incluso entonces, ¡él espera que Lázaro sea su mensajero! El hombre rico pasó por alto el punto de los mandamientos y el testimonio de los profetas, en la vida y en la muerte.

Lázaro. Es imposible escuchar esta parábola sin pensar en los pobres y desamparados, los sin techo en nuestras ciudades y en nuestras calles. Quizá no los conozcamos, pero ellos también tienen nombres. Quizá no sepamos sus circunstancias, pero ellos son nuestros hermanos y hermanas. La vida de Jesús y enseñanzas nos muestran que el camino de Dios es el camino del amor. Jesús sacrificó todo en la cruz, y nos guía a dar más allá de lo que pensamos, podemos o debemos, a darnos por el bien de los demás. ¿Qué tan parecidos somos al hombre rico? No podemos resolver todos los problemas de la pobreza y los sin techo en nuestras ciudades, país y el mundo. Pero estamos llamados a hacer algo, a poner atención, a verdaderamente cuidar, a defender la justicia y la imparcialidad, para ver y amar a la persona de la calle, como persona. Como Lázaro.



HOW GOD INTENDS US TO LIVE

Today's readings are again directed to believers, communities of faith. As in last week's reading, Amos confronts us with a condemnation of those whose lives are focused on pleasure and self-absorption. The psalm contrasts that focus with the Lord's—justice for the oppressed; food the hungry; freedom for captives; sight to the blind; raising of those who are bowed down; loving the just; protecting strangers, orphans, and the widow; and by doing so, thwarting the way of the wicked. Timothy urges the pursuit of righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. Luke tells the familiar tale of the wealthy man and the poor beggar at his doorstep, who experience life very differently in this world and in the next. We are once again being given clear indications about how God intends for us to live our lives. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.




TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Over the past century, a desire to recover a deep sense of unity among all believers in Christ has grown. The "ecumenical movement" (from the Greek word meaning the "the whole inhabited world") began among Protestant Christians, but was given great energy in 1920 with a letter from the Orthodox Patriarch of Constantinople, calling for closer dialogue and cooperation among Christians. In 1960, Pope John XXIII invited Protestant and Orthodox observers to the Second Vatican Council. In 1964, the Council's Decree on Ecumenism named these Christians "separated brethren," a huge leap forward from the time of labeling them as "outside the Church." A year later, a new pope, Paul VI, and the Orthodox Patriarch officially nullified the condemnations that walled off East from West for nine hundred years.

The pace and optimism of the 1960s has sadly waned, and the signs of progress toward unity are few; yet there are wider agreements on sharing Communion among various Christian denominations, and among Protestants agreements regarding sharing of ecclesiastical life and ministry.
