

REVIVAL SEASON MONICA WEST

Welcome back, Everyone. It has been a rough two months since we last spoke. We lost some good people from our church. Our hearts and prayers are with all who mourn. I ask again, what do people do who have no faith in God? How do they cope with loss?

So, how many of us suffer from arthritis? I am guessing there is a great show of hands here. I have an article in front of me on my desk, from who knows where, entitled "Living with Arthritis;" it reminded me that taking pain relievers is only one way to cope with the pain of arthritis. Some arthritis can be controlled to an extent through diet. While it is difficult to eat "completely clean," I keep reading that sufferers should stay away from white bread, pasta, rice, pizza and white sugar. Stress reduction and medicine, as well as dietary adjustments, help a person cope with it. Okay, you ask...how do I reduce stress? Learn to meditate, practice yoga, get involved with Reiki, breathe mindfully. Finally, don't get caught up in all the things you can't do. Instead, focus on all that you can do! Good luck.

Have you been trying to understand the members of the younger generation? Do you complain that they have no work ethic? That they don't come to church? As well as a raft of other complaints? I suggest you read "Gen Z and the Church" in the June /July 2022 Living Lutheran. The author Stephanie N. Grimoldby maintains that Gen Z-ers want relationships, mentors, authenticity and political engagement from their Church. They don't give two weeks' notice because if they think the job is toxic, they are done NOW! They get out of the situation they don't like. How can the church step up and reach out to the Gen Z-ers?

Think about what kind of world formed the members of this Generation, first born around 1997. Born about the same time as the terror attacks of September 11, 2001, they have "lived with a climate crisis, a police violence crisis, unprecedented presidential elections, and a global pandemic." (page 17) These young adults are surrounded by the internet 24-7.

I won't repeat the whole article. However, the article does give example of some Gen Zers uniting with some Millennials forming a small group Lutheran ministry.

The author sums up what would help get the younger generation to church: they need to feel seen, supported and validated. Unfortunately, these young people are "very aware of the systemic injustice in organized Christian churches...across all denominations." Re-engaging the young people is not a simple matter.

I strongly suggest you read the article, download the study guide and think how First Lutheran can break the chain.

I promised I would get back with you about the books I was beginning to read. Do read the Revival Season by West. Great church book club read. Don't bother with the Ten Questions Christians Are Asking by Dr. David Jeremiah. The Doctor feels these are heartfelt questions: how can I be sure of salvation? how can I overcome temptation how can I find forgiveness? is there only one way to God? why do Christians have so many problems? what is faith? what is the greatest commandment? Once I sat down with the book, I asked myself "Really?" My answers to these were simple and I did not read the book...Read the Bible. Go to Church. Read books that study the Bible. Read the Bible. (Oops, I already said that.) Okay, find a translation that works for you. Our church library has many different forms of the Bible.

Since the beginning of Russia's war against Ukraine on Feb. 24, millions of people have fled the country and are seeking refuge in neighboring countries including Hungary, Moldova, Poland, Romania and Slovakia. There are major humanitarian concerns for both internally displaced people and refugees. Many people fleeing their homes in Ukraine need shelter and basic necessities such as food, water and toiletries. Care for people also includes pastoral and psychological support to address the trauma they've endured.

Lutheran Disaster Response is accompanying our companions in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland, Romania, Slovakia and Moldova, as well as ecumenical partners such as Lutheran World Federation and Church World Service, in their humanitarian responses to the crisis created by Russia's war against Ukraine. These partners provide refugees with immediate support and supplies such as food, blankets, water and hygiene kits. Your gifts will support people impacted by the war. Gifts designated to "Eastern Europe Crisis" will be used in full (100%) for direct response to assist those affected.

First Lutheran Church has given two different gifts to LDS for the Ukrainian relief efforts. One gift of \$8,815 and another gift of \$11,276. These consist of individual donations from the congregation and funds from endowment. — Church Council

#### **Lutheran Disaster Response**

On the night of Dec. 10 and early morning of Dec. 11, an outbreak of at least 30 tornadoes swept through six states. Eighty-nine people were killed across five states, at least 75 of them in Kentucky. It will take months and years to recover. Lutheran Disaster Response is collaborating with the Indiana-Kentucky Synod and other partners in the area to assess the damage and develop a long-range recovery plan. This is one way LDR responds to disasters globally.

In 2021, ELCA members gave \$14.4 million in gifts to LDR [twice as much as was given in 2020]. Gifts totaling \$2.9 million were used in tornado aid.

At the end of 2021, the Council of the Northwestern Ohio Synod encouraged us to partner with Lutheran Disaster Response and endeavor to raise at least \$100,000 to help those who are struggling from natural disasters and war, here at home and around the world. The year-end ask was announced at the 2021 Synod Assembly, and congregations and individuals gave through the new year. The generosity was overwhelming, raising \$292,396.40 to support the work of LDR.

It was very meaningful to work alongside Lutheran Disaster Response, and support their remarkable mission. In 2020, Lutheran Disaster Response was active in 46 states and territories in the United States, and in 53 countries around the world, including our global companions in Mexico, Serbia, and Tanzania.




