The roof replacement on the pistol and target shed has been completed. The roofers used 8 sheets of plywood to replace rotted wood around the edges of the roof. The new metal roof will give us many years of service.

We have a logger coming out soon to remove the trees that came down during the winter storms. Several of the trees are near the west wide of the 200-yard target line on the rifle range, so we will experience intermittent rifle range closures while he does his work. The times will be announced on our website as soon as we get the information.

We had several broken pipes in the pump house over the winter due to the long spell of cold weather. A plumber was called out to replace the damaged pipes and valves to get us back in service. He also found the rust filter plugged, so that was changed while he was on site. The well/pump house water system is used for irrigation of the grounds around the property.

We are in the process of replacing the aging "Danger Rifle Range" signs on the perimeter fence. The existing signs have been in place for many years and are showing their age.
