It was decided in conjunction with WAIS to cancel the WAIS DS Winter Round of Scholarships due to the uncertainty of International travel & lack of National and Domestic events.

Two DSF Scholarship holders from our last round Nina Kennedy and Timothy Putt have both been selected on their respective Australian Squads for Tokyo and will travel to the Games as part of the Australian Team vying for selection in their events.

Nina 22 yrs set an Australian Record in the Pole Vault jumping 4.81m at the Sydney Track and Field Classic in March 2021. A WAIS scholar



and targeted Olympian, Nina has jumped the Olympic qualifying height 3 times and has been unable to travel to International pre-Olympic competition in Europe due to the Pandemic.

Tim 21yrs won a DS Scholarship as a year 12 student when competing in the World Junior Water Polo Championships. Tim is a WAIS scholar and this DS Scholarship will assist him to focus on training and recovery with the Australian Squad in Sydney for Tokyo 2021.
