

EL SANTUARIO DE LOS POBLADORES- DEDICATED TO THE MYSTERIES OF THE ROSARY.



Weather permitting, the last quadrant of the Mysteries of the Rosary will be completed in approximately two weeks.

The interior of each of the quadrants will then be arranged with bronze shrines depicting all 20 occurrences in the life of Christ and the Blessed Mother. Donor plaques for each shrine, kneelers and benches will be made part of each nicho. Adobe donation plaques are in progress and will be encircled in the courtyard in this design shown in this bulletin. Each mission statue, also in bronze, will surround the outer walls of the shrine. The following contributions have already been received for St. Augustine church—\$14,500 and the statue is currently in the process of being sent to the foundry; San Miguel Church—\$2,800; Ortiz Church—\$3,550; Las Mesitas—\$859; Lobatos—Pd. in full, statue completed; San Antonio—\$0, and we are currently seeking a volunteer(s) to ask for donations for San Antonio; San Rafael—\$0

The fees for the mission statues are: Antonito, San Antonio, Ortiz, Las Mesitas and San Rafael—\$14,500. The fee for San Miguel is \$15,500.

Gracing the entrance to the shrine will be statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe, a 9-foot bronze plus, with moon and cherub and rays, done in a multicolored patina. This will cost \$50,000. A 7-foot scale figure of St. Juan Diego, kneeling with Our Lady in relief on his white tilma, and colored roses tumbling out, also done in a multicolored patina will cost 50,000. In addition to completing this sector of the project, we are accepting donations for inscriptions for the walkway from Our Lady of Guadalupe statue to the entrance of the shrine.

We continue to ask that you honor Our Lady of Guadalupe, our ancestors and our faith with a donation to El Santuario de Los Pobladores, a chapel dedicated to the Mysteries of the Rosary, our long tenure here in the southern part of Colorado and as a testament to our faith. The Santuario de Los Pobladores will be a living and lasting testament to Our Lady of Guadalupe, our ancestors and to you and your family.



Adobe dedication plaques will be housed under this structure. Plaques will be displayed the panels represented here.

MASS READING REFLECTION

FIRST READING

Gn 11:1-9

[Dangers of Human Pride]

Using a folktale, the writer brings out that pride (making a name for one-self) results in confusion. This is the reversal of the Pentecost narrative, which states that God's Spirit overcomes human divisiveness and confusion, caused by misunderstanding.

SECOND READING

Rom 8:22-27

[The Spirit Our Helper]

Reapplied, the Responsorial Psalm says: "If you God take away their [creatures'] breath, they perish and return to their dust. When you send forth your spirit, they are created, and you renew the face of the earth." Paul picks up this trend of thought. Without the Spirit, "all creation is groaning in labor pains." And even though we have the Spirit, we too groan, while we await full redemption in the hereafter.

God, the Holy Spirit, is the animating principle of all life. Without the help of the Holy Spirit we cannot even pray as we ought. So many Christians nowadays complain about the difficulty they have in praying! They should turn to the Holy Spirit!

PENTECOST SUNDAY



Theme: The Spirit at Work

We know how difficult it would be to explain the intricacies of a computer or the complexity of ballistics used for space flights to a person without formal education. For such a person lacks the very concepts that would be needed to understand such things. We face somewhat the same problem when we apply our limited hearts and minds to the contemplation of the infinite God and outpouring of his Spirit. We should therefore realize that all the Bible can do is attempt to say some meaningful things about the Spirit of God in limited human terminology. Human speech cannot possibly express adequately who God is. The Bible readings for both the Vigil and the Day of Pentecost bring out the function of the Holy Spirit. This evening, Old Testament images are used that have also inspired New Testament passages on the Spirit. First, the Spirit is seen as a *unifying force*. It "has filled the whole world" (Wis 1:7: Entrance Antiphon of the Day Mass). Hence, the first of the four texts for the First Reading concerns the confusion of speech at Babel, a reversal of the Pentecost narrative where the Spirit unites by overcoming division caused by misunderstanding (different tongues!). This is symbolism, of course, but entirely meaningful. Secondly, the Spirit is seen as the principle of love. Hence, the symbolism of fire is used. In the second text from Exodus, the Lord came down in fire, as on the disciples at Pentecost. "Come, Holy Spirit, ..and kindle in them the fire of your love" (Gospel Acclamation). Thirdly, the Spirit is seen as life-giving, as the "rah Yahweh"-the breath (spirit) of the God-Creator hovering over the water (Gn 1:1). Hence, the third text is the famous passage from Ezekiel where the spirit (breath) of the Lord reanimates dry bones, which stand for the house of Israel, God's people. Fourthly, the Spirit is seen as a strong driving wind inspiring people to preach the Gospel. Hence, the fourth text is from Joel: "I will pour out my spirit [breath] upon all flesh. Your sons and daughters shall prophesy; as the apostles did on Pentecost: speaking "in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim" (First Reading for the Day Mass). The point of all these readings (God's word) is that we should apply this to the Church of today, to ourselves! your faithful" (Gospel Acclamation).

Pentecost

In the Christian tradition, Pentecost is the celebration
of the person of the Holy Spirit coming upon the
Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who
were gathered together in the Upper Room.

A "strong, driving" wind filled the room where they were gathered, and tongues of fire came to rest on
their heads, allowing them to speak in different languages so that they could understand each other. It
was such a strange phenomenon that some people thought the Christians were just drunk - but Peter
pointed out that it was only the morning, and said the phenomenon was caused by the Holy Spirit.
The Holy Spirit also gave the apostles the other gifts and fruits necessary to fulfill the great commission -
to go out and preach the Gospel to all nations. It fulfills the New Testament promise from Christ (Luke
24:46-49) that the Apostles would be "clothed with power" before they would be sent out to spread the
Gospel. The main event of Pentecost (the strong driving wind and tongues of fire) takes place in Acts
2:13, though the events immediately following (Peter's homily, the baptism of thousands) continue
through verse 41
