





Remember your word to your servant, in which you have made me hope. This is my comfort in my distress, that your promise gives me life.


The arrogant utterly deride me, but I do not turn away from your law.

righteousness, but heard a cry!



COMMUNION


The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you.





AS the conflict between Hamas and Israel continues, the humanitarian crisis in the Holy Land continues to worsen. More than half of Gaza's residents are displaced, and resources such as food, water and medical supplies are in short supply. The death toll has far surpassed those of previous conflicts in the region in recent decades.

The ELCA has a longstanding relationship with partners in the region, including Augusta Victoria Hospital and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land. Lutheran Disaster Response is supporting these partners and others in providing humanitarian aid, psychosocial support and financial assistance to those within and outside Gaza.
