



Several months ago, we were informed that our HVAC system for the Sanctuary and basement was getting close to needing to be replaced. We are thankful that this system has given us great service for approximately 37 years. Unfortunately, the time has come for replacement.

Members of the Property Team, Finance Committee, and the Congregational Council have been researching the options and cost of replacement for this unit as well as financing options for the project. Several companies have recently submitted bids for this work. Because of the cost of this project, it must be approved by the Congregation at a called meeting. Therefore, a called Congregational meeting will be held on **April 28th immediately following the worship service** to present this information to the congregation. Council will make a recommendation for replacing the unit and financing the project. A congregational vote will then be held on whether to move forward with this project.

Please plan to attend this meeting to hear the information and vote on this project. As always, keep our congregation in your prayers as we move forward in this community to do God's work.


