The Hatton Half: No Condemnation (Cont. from last week)

Rom. 8:2 For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death. The "law of the spirit of life" (v. 2) is the law to which the Christian is amenable. It is: (a) a law of no condemnation due to the justification produced by the atoning death of Jesus; (b) the conduit of life into and within the in-Christ sphere; (c) freedom from the "law of sin and death"; (d) designated "the law of the Spirit" because it has been conveyed by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit (it is the equivalent of the "law of Christ" [Gal. 6:2; cf. 1 Cor. 9:21; Jas. 1:25]); (e) in remarkable contrast to the "law of sin and death" (i.e., the Mosaic law primarily but any other law, practically speaking), which could only define and expose sin, but could not permanently remedy it" (Jackson 279).

The law of the Sprit of life is not a direct operation, but a mode of teaching (Mosher Notes). One must keep in mind Paul's thesis (Rom. 1:16) (Mosher Notes). There is something the law of the Spirit of life does. It helps to make someone free from the law of sin and death (Mosher Notes). What is the law of sin and death? When Adam sinned in the garden, death was the consequence of that sin (Rom. 5:12) (Mosher Notes). We did not get death as the result of Adam's sin, but as the penalty for such (Mosher Notes). Death is the punishment for sin (Rom. 6:23) (Mosher Notes). This relationship can be described as that of a parent and a child. One could list certain tasks that a child should do while the parents are at work. If those tasks are not done, consequences could be added to the list beside the chores. One speaker stated it like this: "God's response to man's sin was not a reaction, but a readiness for it." That response was uttered with the illustration of a doctor telling someone they have cancer, but that the remedy for such is on site. This is the action of the law of Spirit of life. It is the remedy for the consequence of Adam's sin. We can stand justified in the sight of the Almighty.
