May Reflection

John 15:6 "Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned."

I don't know if you could hear the voices of United Methodist from all over the world raised this past week. I'm not sure if within the cadence of the wind you could hear the refrain of "And Are We Yet Alive," the anthem to open every conference of the Methodist Movement since the first Christmas conference in 1768, "Let us take up the cross till we the crown obtain and gladly reckon all things loss so we may Jesus gain." But Charlotte has been visited by Methodist from all over the world.

Like locust upon the harvest, they have descended from every corner of the earth, Africa, Asia, Australia, North and South America, and Europe. They have come together for General Conference, the first general conference since 2016, and they have come during a time in which our church has been in great upheaval. These past few years have been challenging to say the least for the United Methodist Church, debates about human sexuality among a myriad of other issues have splintered the church. Where at one point in time we were the largest Protestant denomination, we no longer are. Where Western North Carolina used to have 1,200 United Methodist Churches, we now only have 900.

I will admit that I have been anxious about this date, I have been dreading the general conference and the changes that are sure to arise from it. I have been fearful because I don't like change, I tend to be more fearful of new things, in many respects I crave consistency and homeostasis. But in the midst of my anxiety and my fear surrounding General Conference, I came across John 15 in my morning devotionals.

John 15 is smack dab in the middle of the farewell discourse of Jesus. It contains four of the seven "I am" statements from Jesus, (each of which is beautifully represented on our stained glass), I was struck by 15:6. This teaching from Jesus, comes from Jesus' self-revelation "I am the vine." Every time I have come to this teaching from Jesus, I have always focused on how Jesus tells us that we as gentiles have been grafted into the vine. For some reason verse 6 has never jumped out to me. This week it stood out like a sore thumb.

Jesus says, "Whoever does not abide in me is cut off and thrown out." At first glance this teaching from Jesus seems too heavy handed. It doesn't seem to flow with all the teachings from Jesus about grace, love, and mercy, how could Jesus be so callous as to throw out someone just because they weren't producing fruit? How long does Jesus give someone to produce fruit before they are cut off? What kind of fruit does Jesus expect the disciples to produce?


But then the more I pondered on this question the more I saw the answers right in front of me. Since 1968 the UMC has declined in membership by about one percent per year. That is fifty-six years of decline! Maybe it was time for some paring down. In Western North Carolina, 1 in 4 churches has not had a baptism in the past three years. Maybe it was time for some paring down. Of the roughly 300 churches that are left, 250 of them had not had a new member join in the past five years. Maybe it was time for some pairing down.

Maybe just maybe I had been reading the situation of our church wrong. Perhaps fear and anxiety were not the right response, and instead of being afraid, I should have been curious as to what God was up to in this season. Instead of dreading the future and shunning newness, I should have been celebrating the fact that God still cares enough about the church to shake us to our core. I learned that one of the main reasons you would prune a grapevine is because pruning allows for new growth and new fruit.

I'm not sure as I sit here typing what the future of the church will be. I don't know what the UMC will look like in five years, but what I do know is that it will be a little bit different, and that's a good thing. During this season we have been carefully pruned, our church is not exempt from feeling some of these pains, yet what lies ahead is a more faithful and fruitful church. I have decided that going forward, instead of being fearful about the future, I'm going to be joyful. Jesus Christ has not called us to a life of comfort or ease, he has called us to a life of discipleship, a life of bearing fruit. Our church has seen much fruit over this past year, and I so look forward to seeing what God is going to do with us in the future, as we continue to make disciples and transform this community and this world!


