From the Hearts and Hands of Session

HONOR GOD - Memorial Banners - the Worship Team would like to procure hanging banners for the sanctuary that would be rotated about once a month during Lent through Ordinary Time. We've created the option for families/members to purchase a hanging banner (2' x 5') in memory of a loved one. The relevant information would be included on the backside of the banner, and in the printed announcements/postscripts for the respective period it is displayed. The average cost is \$70/banner. (Please see the image to get an idea). If you are interested in purchasing one to be used in our yearly worship, please contact Rev. Kilbert to see the options. Thank you. **GROW IN FAITH** - Church-Wide study! 3 of our Life Groups plan on using The Chosen video series and Bible Study guide, starting in early January. Using video clips and discussion of both the book of Isaiah and the Gospels, we will discuss what it means to be "chosen." Pastor Brian will be preaching from corresponding passages with occasional reference to the series. We invite you to join this church-wide effort by joining one of the current small groups or, even better, volunteer to facilitate a new group. The video series can be accessed many ways: 1) downloading "The Chosen: Stream the Series" in the App Store (free on your mobile device or smart TV) ... or 2) free streaming from *Peacock* or 3) purchase a DVD for your group – please note, the episodes are quite long (averaging 35 to 40 minutes) so using an option where participants can watch in their own time before meeting as a group is recommended if your group will only be meeting for an hour or so. The books can be purchased from Amazon and the Discipleship budget will pay for ½ the cost of the study guides. Contact Pastor Brian to preview the materials or with questions.

IMPROVE OUR COMMUNITY AND WORLD - The various ministry committees brought several ways that we can, together as a church, serve locally and globally: *Operation Christmas Child (shoeboxes) – the Fellowship Team and Deacons have graciously offered to use their funds to pay for the shipping cost (\$10/box) in order to help increase the number of boxes we can send to children around the world – with a focus on children in Ukraine. *The goal is 50 boxes* – please take a box, fill it and return it *before* Nov. 13th. In addition, please join us in volunteering to help the local drop-off center at Grace Presbyterian (Nov. 14-21st – call Steve Lester at 412-251-1207 to sign up for a time to help). Thank you. *Burrell S.D. Students – we are intentionally seeking out school functions of various kinds to show "in-person" support of our students – not just the football games in the fall, but winter plays (Dec. 1-3) and sports, spring concerts and more – please keep your eye out for the specific events we're promoting, or better, contact the Outreach team for more information. *TryLife Angel Tree – before you know it, it will be time to support our local partner through taking the angel tags and bringing back gifts for children in our area, so keep that in mind and on your heart.

We had another great month with our youth group – doing a lot outside to take advantage of the weather (and the light) before it gets colder and darker. We had 13 students for our outing to Turf Attack on 10/16, and we're happy to report that a few new faces have joined our ranks by students inviting friends. The youth group participated in a service project, raking leaves at the home of the Guyers, on Oct. 23rd, with additional helping hands from the members of Puckety, and then a meal afterward back at Faith Hall ("Thanks, Irene!"). We finished off the month with a *Joint Halloween Party* with the youth group of Grace Presbyterian on October 30th – we want to thank Maria and Rodney Schafer for their enthusiasm, time and additional leadership to help with that event, as well as our other volunteers who have helped in many ways over the last month. We could still use a few more adult volunteers to give two hours of their time once every 6 weeks – contact Pastor Brian. If that's not possible, consider signing up for one of the open slots for snacks on the bulletin board. Please continue to be in prayer for this ministry. Thank you.

A Devotional For You - Read John 1:12-13 & ... Galatians 4:1-7

I would like to share something I included in our "New & Seasoned Members" class that meets on Wednesdays. We discussed what it means to be God's "adopted" daughters and sons. In addition to the normal lesson, I mentioned some suggested reading from J.I. Packer's classic, *Knowing God*. Packer writes the following: "The gift of 'sonship' to God becomes ours not through being born, but through being *born again* ... If you want to judge how well a person understands Christianity, find out how much he/she makes of the thought of being God's child, and having God as their Father. If this is not a thought that prompts and controls his worship and prayers and whole outlook on life, it means they do not understand Christianity very well at all."

Now, that may sound a bit unfair (maybe even arrogant), but let me say that Dr. Packer backs up his statement *fully and convincingly* from Scripture. In fact, if we assume that "all people are God's children," we will inevitably miss the unique and precious quality of the new relationship we now have with God through Christ. Packer unpacks some of this cherished status this way: "In John's Gospel, we see God's fatherly relation to Jesus, and the epistles explain how several aspects of this now extend to God's adopted children ... 1) first fatherhood implies *authority* ... 2) second, fatherhood implies *affection* ... 3) third, fatherhood implies *fellowship* ... and 4) fourth, fatherhood implies bestowed *honor*. In, through and under Jesus Christ their Lord, we are *ruled*, *loved*, *companied with* and *honored by* our heavenly Father." Packer goes on to show how this proves adoption is the highest privilege of the Christian – more than justification (*no offense to Martin Luther*) because to be right with God the Judge is a great thing, but to be loved and cared for by God the Father is greater.

After a long (and excellent) chapter about how our adoption affects our conduct and faith, he concludes with the practical questions that arise. I'll only include a brief summary here:

- *Do I, as a Christian, understand my own real identity? My own real destiny?
- *Do I understand my adoption? Do I value it/daily remember my privilege as a child of God?
- *Do I treat God as my Father in heaven, loving, honoring and obeying him, seeking his fellowship, and trying to do everything to please him?
- *Do I love my Christian brothers and sisters with whom I live day by day, in a way that I shall not be ashamed of when in heaven I think back over it? Does the 'family likeness' appear in me?

After answering these questions, make it a habit of telling yourself each day: "I am a child of God. God is my Father; Christ is my brother; every Christian is my sibling; heaven is my home; every day is one day nearer." And ask that you may be enabled to live as one who knows it is all deeply and completely true. That will give us all something to share around the table at Thanksgiving this year. Amen. ~ Pastor Brian
