No Minimum Length Requirement. Maximum Length: 1000 words

The Young Writers Experience

- Student writers will be assigned a teacher mentor to guide the student through the writing process.
- The writing will be compiled into a hardcover book.
- Students will share their writing remotely with their teacher mentor and a small group of their peers.
- Students and families will be invited to webinars with children's authors.
- In May there will be a special recognition program honoring the writers. (Format and date TBD.)
