Guidelines for Sizing

Size 1 - \$65.00 Minimum 34" x 34" Maximum 45" x 45" (2025 sq. in. or less) Size 2 - \$85.00 Minimum 45+" x 45+" Maximum 60" x 60" (over 2025 sq. in.)

Note: These are just guidelines for your use. If you choose to make a quilt larger than 60" x 60", that is fine, just be aware that the price will be \$85.00.

Participation in the quilt program is volunteer only. No one should feel any pressure to participate.

CHQ April 16th 2023 PROGRAM

Workshop: Charity Sew-in hosted by Barbara Slaton Time: 11:00 to 4:00 pm (with ½ hour break for lunch)

Location: Hunterdon County Complex, 314 State Route 12, Building 2, Flemington NJ

We will be making pillowcases for Ryan's Case for Smiles (formerly Conkerr Cancer). Ryan's Case for Smiles delivers over 200,000 pillowcases to local hospitals each year. The idea behind this is to help children with cancer and other life changing illnesses feel better to heal better. Check out their website <u>caseforsmiles.org</u> and watch the video to see how it all got started.

This will be a great opportunity to go through your stash of kid friendly fabrics - only two are needed for each pillowcase. Instructions can be found on their website, CHQ Resource page and in this Newsletter. Supplies to bring: Sewing machine, neutral or thread to match your fabric and general sewing supplies. 100% cotton novelty fabric for boys and girls ages 2-17, no flannel please. 3/4 yd for the body and 1/3 yd for the border. Both should coordinate well, be cheerful and appealing to young children. Some kits will be available to sew that day if you do not have your own.

Please consider participating in this worthwhile event. If you can't make it that day, perhaps you can make a few at home. Bring to either the April or May meeting and give to Barbara Slaton. Pillowcases must be washed, ironed, and placed in quart Ziplock bags. Please use unscented detergent. NO fabric softener or dryer sheets and check for pins or open seams. If you don't have unscented detergent, no worries, just make your pillowcase and someone will take it home to wash and iron.

From the design, with Jill Ferrari leading the effort; to Cathie Giambalvo opening her home hosting several months of sewin's; to many members lugging machines to make over 2000 blocks; to all the members attending the November workshop to make the border and most



importantly to Cathie again for the many hours of longarm quilting. There are so many interesting quilting patterns to be found that Cathie designed as one-of-a-kind specific to this quilt. I'm sure you all agree, it turned out beautiful and it's sure to sell lots of Raffle Tickets!!



"Hot Dog" Approach to Sewing a Pillowcase

Supplies:

- Fun, bright fabric with kid-friendly designs
 - 1/3 yard of border fabric (this will be the "bun")
 - 3/4 yard of main pillowcase fabric (this will be the "hot dog")
- Spool of thread that matches fabric

Preparation:

- Cut the "bun" into a strip that's 10
 ½ inches by 40 ½ inches
- Cut the "hot dog" in a strip that's 26
 inches by 40 ½ inches

9 Step Process:

Step 1:

With the border of the pillowcase laying right side up on the surface in front of you, take the body of the pillowcase and place it right side down on top of the border.

Step 2:

Match up the corners of the short 26 ½" end of the body to the 40 1/2" end of the border, so that you can no longer see the border in front of you. Make sure to keep the two edges of the fabrics together for the next few steps.

Step 3:

Roll up the other short end of the body until you are about an inch or two away from the other end.

Step 4:

You should see the other end of the border peeking out from underneath the body. Take that edge of the border and fold it over the rolled-up body aligning its corners with the other two pieces of fabric on the other side.







Step 5:

Pin these three layers of fabric together and sew a 1/2" seam along that edge taking out the pins as you go along. You will begin to see the "hot dog" and "bun" analogy, with the body rolled up as a "hot dog" inside the border which is acting as the "bun."

Step 6:

On either end of this "bun" piece, you will see the rolled-up body inside the sewed-up border.

Step 7:

Roll back the border while simultaneously pulling out the body from within.

Step 8:


Your pillowcase is almost complete! All that's left is two more seams, which are done by folding the pillowcase in-half with the wrong side facing out and sewing along the bottom and side of the pillowcase.

Step 9:

Turn the pillowcase inside-out, and you finally have your finished pillowcase!

Wasn't that easy?

Make a perfect smile by finishing your seams.



Check with your regional coordinator for specific washing instructions for your hospital and whether they accept flannel pillowcases.







We will be reviewing the bylaws this year. Gina stated there is no specified date by which the update for the bylaws need to be completed. Patty suggested starting in May and targeting completion by September. Patty has a slide presentation. Dyan suggested putting the slides in Google drive.

Board is made up of executive officers and chairs of the committees each of whom get a vote with the exception of the nominating committee who do not get a vote.

There was discussion about how board members work together and at what level decisions are made. Hypothetical scenarios were posed with the question of "what would you do?" to ensure that board members were in agreement with roles. There was significant discussion about the board wanting to be transparent to membership.

Next Month's meeting we need to discuss the Boutique committee chair position, we will ask Sue Garcia to be a guest speaker at the board meeting. Gina will give financial information for the Fall event. We will also discuss the 4H Fair.

Gina Krejsa called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM.

January Board Minutes: Al Accettola made a motion to approve the January minutes, Lauren Lupica seconded the motion. Approved unanimously, eleven board members present.

Sue Garcia's perspective on Boutique:

Gina asked Sue to talk about how the board can best support the next Boutique Chair and what are the biggest challenges.

- 1. Sue thought she had enough help, people are needed to lift and move items.
- 2. There were a lot of items that needed to be stored. Availability of storage space was the biggest issue faced by Boutique. (Storage unit is 10x10 and has not traditionally held the boutique fabric)
- 3. Boutique did well selling books and magazines and most people were looking for bargains. Higher end items will not sell.
- 4. The room at the mill was too dark and needed more light in the back corner.
- Sold a lot of fabric and novelty items for the next show, we will need more space and time to stage everything. Needed to rent a 20 foot U-haul and needed lots of people to load and unload.
- 6. Gina proposed asking people to take a couple of bins to store. Sue stated we need to make sure they don't place in a damp basement and we would need to take inventory.
- 7. This last show had four years worth of donations. The next show will not have this volume, however Sue suggested we measure, fold, label and place fabric in bins as it is received and not wait until show date.
- 8. Boutique did not get support from the Show chair until it was time to get ready for the show. Sue thought it was okay for Boutique to be under the Show chair. Boutique gets donations every month. Sue had members come over periodically to measure and organize donations. Mainly used the committee to set up and take down at the Show.

Old Business:

 -Net income to the guild from the 2021 Fall event was \$1300.00.
 Additionally, \$600.00 was given to Safe Harbour.
 - -There is no financial need for the guild to hold a Fall event in 2023 and we do not have sufficient inventory from Boutique to supply.

Gina Krejsa made a motion to not have the 2023 Fall Event, Al Accettola seconded the motion. Approved unanimously.

The Baby Quilt program was a test by the guild for the past 2 years. Through the program the guild has been able to donate \$1900.00 to Safe Harbor. In non-show years there is no requirement for members to contribute boutique items, however some members felt pressured to contribute to the baby quilt program. Nine quilts were left over for the Show which can be sold at the 4H fair. Patty proposed taking a poll to see if members want to contribute to the Baby quilt program. Questions to ask:

- 1. Are you willing to make a baby quilt?
- 2. Did you think the price was appropriate?
- 3. Do you think we should price the Quilts by size?
- 4. Should we expand the program and not just do baby guilts?
- 5. Would you prefer doing a workshop and working on parts of the guilt?

Since we are already committed to hanging quilts at the 4H fair should we also sell items? Should there be an Ad-Hoc committee for the 4H fair? The President can appoint an ad-hoc committee so we do not need to vote. Propose Joanne comes to the next meeting to educate the board on the roles and responsibilities of the Licensing Committee.

AL Accettola Moved to Adjourn the Meeting at 8:55 Gina Krejsa seconded, meeting adjourned.
