What next?

Unfortunately, no one can know exactly how things are going to pan out over the coming weeks and that is very unsettling. On Thursday England goes back into lockdown. Although this lockdown will not be as restrictive as the one we lived through from March to July it will impact on our daily lives. We will no longer, except in very limited circumstances, be able to meet up with other people outside our own households. **Sadly, our church buildings are to be closed again** and below is the guidance regarding places of worship copied **from the government website.**

Places of Worship will be closed, unless they are being used for:

- ! Funerals
- ! To broadcast acts of worship
- ! Individual prayer
- ! Formal childcare or where part of a school
- ! Essential voluntary and public services, such as blood donation or food banks
- ! Other exempted activities such as some support groups

Funerals can be attended by a maximum of 30 people, (because of the size of our church building and the need to social distance the limit will be 24) and it is advised that only close friends and family attend. Linked ceremonial events such as stone settings and ash scatterings can also continue with up to 15 people in attendance. Anyone working is not included. Social distancing should be maintained between people who do not live together or share a support bubble.

Weddings, civil partnership ceremonies will not be permitted to take place except in exceptional circumstances.

We are told that this period of lockdown will end on Wednesday 3rd December.

I have no other information at the moment and wait for clarity over the next few days. I will record next Sunday's worship, an Act of Remembrance, and it will be put onto our church website www.st-edmunds.co.uk. Any updates will appear on both our Facebook page and website. I will endeavour to deliver out a weekly mailing to those without internet access.
