Tidings from Timothy

When I was growing up they used to say that when you didn't put forth much effort to do something that you just gave it "a lick and a promise." This not only meant it was a half-hearted effort, but that it was incomplete and might as well not have been attempted at all. I am afraid that this is what many are attempting in religion. They only give partial obedience. This will not get it done with God. The morning's sermon is entitled "Obey All" and is loosely based on the story in 2 Kings 13:15-19.

Tonight at the 6pm worship. I want us to study on an important topic for all those interested in the future of the church: Evangelism in the modern age. I believe you will find this instructive.

We are a Bible centered, mission minded, and family oriented church. Thank you for coming, and please return at every opportunity.

The second link in the chain is the second person of the Godhead, Jesus the Christ. Jesus is truly the word in the flesh (John 1:1-3). Why did the Holy Spirit decide to employ the description of Jesus as found at John 1:1-3? Guy N. Woods offers the following explanation of the terminology employed: The “Word” is identified as that “which became flesh and dwelt among us” the “only begotten son of the Father” (John 1:14, 18). Jesus is called “the Word” because a word is both the revelation and expression of an idea; and he is the full and complete revelation of deity (the divine nature) to the world (Col. 2:9; Heb. 1:1-3). It is asserted in John 1:18 that he “declared” the Father, literally, *interpreted him*, made him known to man. Before Jesus came into the world it is possible that some might have complained that God is unknowable since he can neither be seen nor directly approached by sinful man (1 John 4:12; 1 Tim. 6:16); but no more (Woods 22). Amen, brother Woods! God initiated the plan for revelation by creating the world. Now, Jesus is the one who manifested the fullness of the Godhead in a bodily form (Col. 2:9). Our Lord is the very embodiment of the Old Testament prophecies. He is the suffering servant who arose as a root out of the dry ground (Isa. 53). He is the one said to “bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives” (Isa. 61:1). He is the ruler who sprang up from Bethlehem Ephratah (Mic. 5:2). He is the One who set up His kingdom on this earth, which is His church (Mat. 16:13-20; Isa. 2:1-4; Dan. 2:44; Joel 2:28-32).

Class assignments and schedule: It is tricky with two morning services to find a good Time for Bible class. Here’s the way we will try it next week. If we change details on this it will be announced:

After Sunday morning 1st service. We will dismiss at ~9:50 and classes will convene no later than 10am. Receiving Comfort From God Through His Children
“God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. {2} Therefore will not we fear, though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea; {3} Though the waters thereof roar and be troubled, though the mountains shake with the swelling thereof. Selah. {4} There is a river, the streams whereof shall make glad the city of God, the holy place of the tabernacles of the most High. {5} God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved: God shall help her, and that right early. {6} The heathen raged, the kingdoms were moved: he uttered his voice, the earth melted. {7} The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. Selah. {8} Come, behold the works of the LORD, what desolations he hath made in the earth. {9} He maketh wars to cease unto the end of the earth; he breaketh the bow, and cutteth the spear in sunder; he burneth the chariot in the fire. {10} Be still, and know that I am God: I will be exalted among the heathen, I will be exalted in the earth. {11} The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. Selah.” (Psalms 46)

How do we take refuge in the comfort that comes from God? How does God provide for His children in this day and age? “By Divine Providence,” you say. But if this be true, then it must also be true that we are used by God to accomplish His will on earth.

You see, as Christians, we are to present ourselves as a living sacrifice to God (Rom. 12:1ff). A part of that dedicated life is to “*Love thy neighbor as thyself.*” Do you do this?

When was the last time that you visited with a sick person? When is the last time you comforted someone who has lost a loved one?

Do you realize how impressive it is to people to have **the whole church** respond with acts of love when the time comes to do so? We serve a great God, that is true. But for others to see His greatness, they need to see Christ living in you by your obedience to the Gospel. “*Unto him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus throughout all ages, world without end. Amen.*” *Ephesians 3:21.*

The world needs to see love of God in people who care so much that they cannot stay silent about sin. They need to see the love of God in a fervent dedication to each other in the church. This means that we should be ever vigilant to keep the church pure and well taken care of. We should look out for our own in a very special way. People will see this and God will be praised. And when they see our righteousness, let us invite them to be a part of us. “*Honour all men. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honour the king.*” *(1 Peter 2:17)*
