Winter Tips to Keep You Safe from PCFD

Winter can be a particularly dangerous time of year when it comes to public health and safety. Here are some tips from the Painesville City Fire Department to make you winter ready:

Use space heaters with caution and keep heaters away from curtains, drapes and other objects within 3 feet of the unit. DO NOT use power strips or extension cords with electric heaters as they can melt and cause a fire. Make sure you have adequate ventilation if using a kerosene heater and never add fuel to a kerosene heater indoors. Also make sure you are using the correct fuel in your kerosene heater as gasoline can cause a violent explosion.

If the power goes out and you choose to run a generator, DO NOT run a generator indoors in an enclosed area (like a garage, carport, etc). This can cause a buildup of exhaust and create a carbon monoxide hazard. Run your generator away from your home, where there is plenty of fresh air.

Have a working carbon monoxide detector in your home. Carbon monoxide is a silent killer and anything that burns fuel can make carbon monoxide. This includes gas stoves, gas water heaters, gas or oil furnaces and fireplaces.

If you think you have Covid-19, and you are able,

please meet our EMS personnel outside your home. This limits our exposure to your home and your family's exposure to our EMS personnel. We understand that often because of medical issues, you may not be able to come outside. Please let the 9-1-1 dispatcher know this and meet us outside only if you are able to.

Parking Bans

All residents and visitors are reminded to move vehicles off the street during heavy snowfall to allow for plowing. Whenever there is a snow fall of two inches or more within a 24 hour time period, an emergency snow ban takes effect and parking is prohibited on the street.

Painesville Utility Shut-offs Resume March 1st options available:

Painesville Electric and Water customers are advised that utility shut-off for non-payment will resume again starting on March

Throughout the Covid-19 pandemic, the City of Painesville suspended disconnection of utility services due to nonpayment to align with best practices around the State of Ohio. As of March 1, we will resume termination of services for non-payment.

If you need financial assistance to pay your utility bill, there are

• Call Lifeline, Inc at 2-1-1 to be connected to a list of Lake County assistance agencies. There are multiple funding

sources dedicated to helping those who need utility help in the winter months and during the Covid-19 pandemic. Lifeline can help walk you through what you may qualify for.

• If you are not eligible for funding assistance or are unable to pay the past-due balance on your bill, you can contact our Utilities Billing office to make

suitable payment arrangement/ plan to bring your account current. We are willing to work with you if a realistic payment plan is in place, however, we urge customers to contact our offices as soon as possible to make these arrangements. Our business hours are 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday at 440-392-5797.

If you cannot meet an established payment plan or simply do not pay your past-due status in full, your utilities will be shut off beginning March 1.

Council Passes Amendment to Allow Business Parks

Council Painesville City passed an amendment to zoning ordinances at the January 4 council meeting to allow for mixed-use commercial and industrial business parks. The goal is to create more development opportunities by creating a business park development, which allows businesses with light industrial use, research and development activities, offices

and/or commercial features to have a campus like atmosphere.

"There are a few undeveloped larger commercially properties within the city that the property owners have expressed a desire for a mixed-use development," said Lynn White, City Planner. "The intent is to grow community wealth, build stronger anchor businesses and influence a better quality of life for those who live, work, play, visit and learn within the City of Painesville."

This amendment change will affect two large properties in city limits: a parcel of land between Richmond Street and Richmond Road near Grand River and land on Shamrock Boulevard near State Route 44.

Reminder: Always Stop for School Buses

According to the National Safety Council, approximately 26 students are killed and 9,000 are injured each year in incidents involving school buses. Keeping alert, knowing traffic laws and watching out for children can help keep our community safe.

• Never pass a school bus with flashing lights. In the state of Ohio you must stop when driving from in both directions on a two-lane

either direction (does not apply to multiple-lane or highways) until the children are safely off the street and the school bus lights stop flashing.

• You must stop for a school bus

road or two-lane-with-a-turninglane road (which are most roads in Painesville). Motorists can receive up to a \$500 fine and possible suspended license for up to a year for failure to stop.

• Be aware of children entering or exiting the bus. A majority of school bus related accidents occur when children are crossing

Make a Plan for Winter Storms

Make a Plan for Winter Storms Painesville is no stranger to severe winter weather. Whether it's a lake effect snow dump or an ice storm, being prepared for an emergency can easy your worry and potentially save your life.

Severe storms mean you could lose electricity and heat for several hours, so take time to create an emergency plan for severe winter weather. Here are some tips from FEMA:

- Stay indoors and off the roads. If you must drive, keep emergency supplies in your car
- Close off rooms in your home to consolidate and retain heat
- Dress in layers and use blankets to help keep warm

- Never use a generator, camp stove, charcoal grill or gasoline/ propane heater indoors, as these items can start accidental fires, cause electric shock and/or cause deadly carbon monoxide poisoning
- · Never heat a home with a cooktop or oven
- Monitor local news and alerts for additional emergency information and instructions

Remember to only call 9-1-1 if you have an actual emergency during a winter storm. Report power outages to Painesville Electric by calling 440-392-5954 and follow the City's social media pages (@CityofPainesville) for updates.

Smart Meter Installs Continue for Painesville Electric Customers

Painesville Electric's Smart Meter installs continue into the month of February. This advanced technology will provide more accurate timely data to the customer and provides two-way communication for improved efficiencies, distribution automation and improved power quality and reliability.

It takes approximately five

minutes or less to replace a typical electric meter. In order to do the work safely, your electric service will be turned off during this time. As long as the meter technician can access your meter outdoors, you do not need to be present. We will leave a door hanger notifying you that the work has been completed. If we are unable to access the meter, we will leave

another door hanger providing you information on how to reschedule.

High School Students Take Advantage of CCP Program to Save Thousands on College Education

Students in grades 7-12 have the opportunity to earn free college credit from Lakeland Community College while earning high school credits for the same classes by enrolling in the College Credit Plus (CCP) program.

The CCP program is free for high school students and they do

not pay for tuition or textbooks. They can complete classes on their high school campus or at Lakeland, earning high school and college credit at the same time. Many students take the first few semesters of a four-year degree while still in high school, saving thousands of dollars on a college

education!

Students who wish to begin focusing on an information technology & computer science or health care program, can start on a dedicated pathway within the CCP program.

Upon high school graduation, CCP students can continue to

complete an associate degree or certificate at Lakeland or transfer directly to any Ohio four-year college, including four-year partner programs available through Lakeland's Holden University Center.

Admission into the program is open to students who have clearly demonstrated the ability to handle college-level coursework. Successful CCP students typically have good self-management skills, excellent class attendance and no disciplinary problems.



Laketran Retrofits Dial-a-Ride Bus to Serve as Mobile Food Pantry

A new Mobile Food Pantry will be visiting communities throughout Lake County each week to provide fresh produce to seniors in need of food.

A retrofitted Laketran Dial-a-Ride bus, re-branded as the Lake County Mobile Food Pantry with vehicle graphics donated by Avery Dennison, will visit two locations each week on Tuesdays and Thursdays to distribute 60 boxes of fresh produce to senior participants.

Lake County seniors, 60 years and older, may register for one

pick-up per month by calling Lifeline at 2-1-1 or Lake County Council on Aging at 440-205-8111.

Offering completely contactless pick up process, Laketran employees volunteers from RSVP of Lake County will place groceries in the trunk of seniors' cars as they arrive. Volunteers are equipped with PPE to ensure all participants' safety.

Similar to Laketran's produce pick-up program organized last summer with Lake County Commissioners Senior Services, RSVP of Lake County, Council on Aging and Lifeline, the agencies worked together to secure food donations from the Greater Cleveland Food Bank and each play a role in taking reservations, sorting donations and distributing the food.

The Greater Cleveland Food Bank donations are purchased through the Ohio Association of Food Banks or supplied by the USDA funded Farm to Families Food Box program that purchases farm surplus and distributes it to those in need during the pandemic. Each month, 480 households

"Food assistance remains a top need among seniors during the coronavirus pandemic and while there are 40 food pantries throughout Lake County, this program is unique because it provides fresh produce," shared Laketran CEO Ben Capelle. "We're excited to be able to repurpose a bus to meet this community need. We have donations secured through March, but anticipate the program will continue with the support of the Cleveland Food Bank.

Puppy Socialization During the COVID-19 Pandemic

Socialization means introducing a pup to new situations and making them safe, positive, confidencebuilding experiences.

Many pet owners believed that getting a puppy during the pandemic would be ideal timing. The family is working from home and everyone has lots of time to spend with the puppy. Sounds great, right?

The home, however, is only part of a puppy's world. There are experiences that a puppy needs to have when being out and about: New and different sounds such as vehicles, construction equipment, and sirens; Meeting other nonfamily animals and lots of new people; Walking over, around and through different surfaces and objects. 

Irruptive Birds are in Audubon's Sights

Certain bird species are spending this winter in Northeast Ohio in especially high numbers. Blackbrook Audubon Society encourages everyone to connect with these rare visitors and record them, as well as resident birds, for the Great Backyard Bird Count February 12 -15.

Common Redpolls and Evening Grosbeaks have flown here from Canadian latitudes. They are part of a group known as irruptive species. Both of these finches visit feeders and are easy to spot. Participants in the GBBC are invited to count all bird species and individuals for at least 15 minutes on one or more days that weekend, regardless of age or birding skill level. Instructions, apps and bird ID tips are available at www. birdcount.org.

Blackbrook Audubon lists popular birding spots and links on the resources page of their website, blackbrookaudubon.org. Follow Blackbrook's Facebook page for current sightings. Contribute to this international count by adding the irruptive species to your list before they head back north and before the annual spring migration begins. Blackbrook wants participants to bird safely following the current Covid-19 guidelines.

Whether counters record birds at their feeder, in a park, or any other location, submitting these numbers will enhance the snapshot of bird distribution and abundance. This will help scientists answer questions on migration patterns, spread of diseases and the effects of weather and climate change. When the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and National Audubon Society launched GBBC in 1998, they created the first online citizenscience project to collect data on wild birds and display the results in near real-time. Birds Canada joined the effort in 2009. Birds observed locally can be compared to other reports in the region with maps on the project website during and after the count.

Last February, participants in almost 200 countries counted more than 6,900 species of birds on over 260,000 checklists. Make sure the birds in your favorite spot aren't overlooked!





Audubon Shares Threats to Birds in Columbia

Cleveland-area photographer and author Steve Cagan will introduce Blackbrook Audubon guests to the Colombian Pacific coast rain forest area of El Chocó in a virtual program Tuesday, February 16 at 7:00 p.m. He will describe the biodiversity of this natural treasure and the harm caused by mechanized gold mining and indiscriminate logging. His photographs also reveal how traditional human cultures are threatened by the

violence of the Colombian civil conflict and criminal gangs. Cagan will share how he contributes to community resistance to these threats with his camera.
