Granite City Bingo Opens in St. Cloud

St. Cloud's newest bingo hall is now open for business!

The St. Cloud City Council approved the organization's charitable gambling premises permit on Feb. 27. Granite City Bingo opened Monday, June 5 at 10:00 a.m. in the former Michael's Restaurant building at 510 U.S. Highway 10 S.

Joe Torbert is the Vice President of Gaming for the Minnesota Fishing Museum. He says they've been busy since acquiring the building.

“We've spent a lot of time painting and going through to freshen up the building. No construction, really, except for some wiring for the televisions,” says Torbert.

Players will have several charitable gaming choices including paper and electronic



bingo, pull tabs, E-tabs and maybe Texas Hold'em. Torbert says they will offer two bingo sessions to start, with the hope of adding additional sessions in the future.

“We have a noon bingo and

a 6:00 p.m. bingo and we'll run that schedule for a while until hopefully it's so packed we need to open up a 3:00 p.m. bingo session. That's our goal,” says Torbert.

Granite City Bingo will be open from 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. seven days a week and have seating for up to 200 people. Concessions will also be available. The initial menu will include sandwiches, pizza, and snacks. Anticipation for a new bingo hall in St. Cloud has been high in the area. St. Cloud hasn't had a bingo hall since Bingo Emporium closed its doors in the spring of 2015.

Proceeds from the operation benefit the Minnesota Fishing Museum Hall of Fame and Education Center in Little Falls.

Bingo News

Big Progressive Bingo Senior Spirit Win in Santa Ynez

A longtime regular Bingo player at Chumash Casino Resort in Santa Ynez, California—Shirley Bustillos of Santa Paula, California—hit a multi-progressive jackpot for the largest single payout in the 23 years the game has been played there. Bustillos, 75, won \$98,720. Chumash Casino Resort enhanced its Bingo two years ago by offering progressive jackpots during regular-session games. The jackpots build up as a result of multiple Bingo halls being linked to the program. Bustillos is the first player at Chumash Casino Resort to hit the highest-level progressive jackpot. Owned and operated by the Santa Ynez Band of Chumash Indians, Chumash Casino Resort's gaming floor features 2,300 slot machines, dozens of table games and poker, in addition to Bingo.

Muskingum Skilled Nursing & Rehabilitation in Beverly, Ohio, hosted a Community Bingo as part of National Nursing Home Week. This year's national theme was "The Spirit of America" and highlighted the bond among staff, volunteers and residents that captures the American spirit. The event featured Bingo, food, entertainment and music. Established by the American Health Care Association in 1967, National Nursing Home Week, which takes place in May, provides an opportunity for residents and their loved ones, staff, volunteers, and surrounding communities to acknowledge the role of skilled nursing care centers in caring for America's seniors and individuals with disabilities.

Bingo for Boys & Girls Club

The William S. Hart Pony Baseball and Softball Program of Santa Clarita, California, hosted its first Bingo Night at the local Boys & Girls Club. Hundreds of supporters turned out for the event, which generated more than \$8,000 for the program. The Hart Dugout Club, Santa Clarita Valley City Council, Santa Clarita Boys & Girls Club, and Hart Baseball parents and supporters were vital to making the fundraiser happen. Bingo Night chairman John Dow said that it was important to reach out and connect with the community, which responded very positively. Discussions have already begun on how to make the event bigger and better next year.



Business to Business Bingo

The Small Business Resource Collaborative (SBRC) of Albuquerque, New Mexico, designed a month-long West Central Business Bingo game, which ran in June, to increase cross-promotion among businesses along the corridor and to encourage residents to patronize multiple segments of the route from Louisiana to Coors for a chance to win prizes. The game launched at Bessie's Gift Shop & Craft Supplies—which was celebrating its 25th year in business—with live music, food vendors, giveaways and a canned food drive. Bingo cards and instructions for play were available there and at other area businesses, as well as on the SBRC website. When shoppers made a purchase of \$5 or more at participating locations, they were given a sticker to place on the square of their Bingo card that corresponded to the retailer's name. Players later presented their winning cards at an event at Peter Pipers Pizza, which were entered into a drawing for a variety of donated prizes.

Ducking for Cover in California

Hi Guy,

We have a Bingo manager running things at the Bingo that is closest to where I live who is out of control. She is incredibly intolerant of anyone who questions anything that goes on at the Bingo or who does anything that she does not like. She often yells at players very publicly and goes so far as to ban people from the Bingo all the time.

The littlest things set her off. Recently she threw a fit because the caller had announced that Bingo would be starting "soon" and she felt that people weren't getting to their seats fast enough.

One time a lady was sipping water, which went down the wrong way and she ended up in a coughing fit that she couldn't control. The manager came out of the back room, yelled at her that she was being too disruptive and that she had better stop coughing or she must leave.

Another time, a lady's phone went off (the rule is all phones must be turned off during Bingo). She was very apologetic and switched it off quickly—but not quickly enough. The manager came storming in, spotted the

lady, pointed at her and yelled, "You...OUT!" and made her leave the hall.

It's a little surprising, but in spite of her behavior, this Bingo gets a very good turnout, even during the slower summer months. I know that a number of players contacted regulators to complain about what a hot head she is, but my understanding was that they were told regulations only apply to legal aspects of the games and not how a particular person or organization chooses to run a hall.

Don't you think it's terrible that such a person is allowed to be in charge of an activity that should be fun and relaxing, but with her can be so tense and stressful? — **Ducking for Cover, California, via email**

Hi Ducky,

I understand where you are coming from; I've worked at jobs and attended organized activities like Bingo and other events where the person in charge seems to be borderline psycho, yet for some reason is allowed to stay in charge and continue to irritate the folks around them.

I suspect one of the reasons these people stay in charge is that they get results. You mention in your email that this is a well-attended Bingo year round—which means that lots of money must be coming in, and that is the primary point of running a Bingo.

You also note that this Bingo is closest to your home, but you do not say that it is the only Bingo in the area. This tells me that in spite of the volatile nature of the manager, you continue to attend this Bingo of your own volition. So there must be something about it that appeals to you.

Truthfully, I suspect that lots of players go to this Bingo BECAUSE

With this particular Bingo, it might be a similar type of situation. What mood will the manager be in tonight? Will someone anger her? How will she react? Will she scream and shout? Throw something? Ban yet another unsuspecting player from the games?

Healthcare as Close as the Drugstore

If you're a veteran in Arizona and you need medical care, why not just head on down to the drugstore? You soon may be able to do just that. The Department of Veterans Affairs has partnered with CVS to give veterans another place to go for care. The pilot program will give approximately 120,000 veterans in the Veterans Choice Program access to care at the 24 CVS MinuteClinic locations in the Phoenix area.

You won't be able just to stroll in, however. First you'll need a referral from a nurse at the Phoenix VA. Which means you'll need to get someone at the VA on the phone and then get permission.

What care will you get at a

MinuteClinic? You'll get treatment by family nurse practitioners or physicians assistants for a number of minor illnesses and injuries. You can get flu shots and birth control, treatment for sprains and poison ivy, sports physicals, and diabetes and high blood-pressure tests. If you have allergies, nausea or a bladder infection, they can help.

Not all conditions will be covered, however. If, for example, you have a temperature of 103 F and higher, you don't qualify for care there. If you have chest pain or think you've been poisoned, don't go there. If you need a prescription for a controlled substance, they can't help you. If you need an X-ray for a broken bone or injuries from a car wreck, they will send you elsewhere.

If you're in Arizona and need a referral, call the Phoenix VA Health Care System Help Line at 602-222-6550 or 800-574-7174. Meanwhile, take a look at the MinuteClinic website to see what it will cover, so you'll know whether to go there first. After each visit, your medical information will be forwarded electronically to the VA.

Mega Price Hike

Five years after Powerball ticket prices were increased to \$2, the multi-state Mega Millions game is following suit. Mega Millions tickets will increase from \$1 to \$2 later this year, and the odds of winning the jackpot will decrease. The move is meant to boost headline-grabbing jackpots for the multi-state lottery game, which is offered in more than 40 states. Mega Millions will make the price change and tweaks to the game for the October 31 drawing. The rule-changes will have players pick from 70 numbers for the first set of picks, and 25 numbers for the second. Currently, players pick from 75 and 15 numbers, respectively. The changes will alter the probability of winning, making it harder to win the jackpot, but easier to win the second prize. Chances of winning the jackpot will decrease from 1 in 258.9 million to 1 in 302.6 million,

while the chance of winning any prize—which will run from \$2 to the jackpot—will go from 1 in 14.71 to 1 in 24. The second-place, \$1 million prize will get easier to win: From 1 in 18.5 million to 1 in 12.6 million.

Soldier's Wild Bonanza

An Army soldier based in Fort Drum has won a \$5 million New York Lottery jackpot. Jesse Vonderhorst, 36, bought the winning scratch-off ticket at a gas station in Watertown, New York. Vonderhorst, who's from Vancouver, Washington, stopped to gas up his car and decided to try his luck on a New York Lottery \$25 Wild Bonanza Multiplier ticket. He plans to use his winnings to help his three daughters and take a family vacation.



Players Fail to See the Signs

Dear Aunt Bingo:

My husband and I were visiting Florida earlier this year and chose one cloudy day to stop in at one of the local Bingos we'd seen while driving around town. It was a pleasant little place that was clean and layed out nicely, so we decided to buy-in and play.

While it was fun to be playing Bingo in a new place, what was not fun was when I spotted the caller subtly signaling to someone. I looked around and saw a player signal back. The caller did it again, and another player signaled something. It was very suspicious. Were these people cheating?

I whispered to my husband

what I saw, and that I suspected there was something funny going on. A woman at our table overheard me. "They aren't signaling, they're signing," she said. "We have deaf players and the caller sometimes signs to them."

I felt like a complete idiot. My husband found it hilarious. — **Name withheld, Michigan**

Dear Reader:

Wow, that's really embarrassing! If it had been me, I think I would have quietly packed up all my Bingo things and bolted from that hall as fast as my feet would carry me. I certainly applaud you if you stayed for the entire Bingo session! — **Aunt Bingo**

Dear Aunt Bingo:

Lots of us players feel that the prize money is too low at Bingo. We think that games would be a lot more popular and successful in collecting money for charity if they offered players higher/more jackpots.

What is the process for getting the prize money raised at Bingo? Do we talk to the people who run the Bingo? Do we maybe do a petition with supporting signatures and submit it? Who makes this decision? — **Ellen C., New York, via email**

Dear Ellen:

It would certainly be convenient if Bingo operators had the power to determine the limits on

jackpots. But, unfortunately that's not the case.

While Bingo halls can lower prize amounts awarded per Bingo session (when there is low player turnout, for example), they can only raise prize money to a maximum which has been predetermined by the state where the Bingo is being offered.

State laws control Bingo prize limits—as well as pretty much everything else that happens in Bingo gaming. If someone offers prize money higher than what the law permits, they are breaking the law and can be arrested and jailed! Pretty serious stuff for such an otherwise fun and friendly game.

There is a way to get limits increased, and it does occur from time to time. But, it takes legislative action on the part of state lawmakers to make that happen.

Typically, it begins with Bingo operators banding together and making a pitch to lawmakers on why current limits are too low and why they need to be increased for the sake of the charities which receive support from Bingo. If the operators can get one lawmaker to bite, that lawmaker will sponsor a bill to amend the current law and introduce it to the legislature. Next, there is legislative debate, revisions, more debate, more revisions and, hopefully and eventually, a favorable vote.

As a player, you are not usually part of the process, except to let Bingo operators know that you

are not happy with prize limits and would like them increased. A petition signed by players and submitted to multiple Bingo managers could certainly help get that message across. But it is a very long legislative road to getting any detail, including prize limits, changed. — **Aunt Bingo**

Senior Travel Assistance

Dear Savvy Senior,

Do you know of any services that help seniors with the rigors of traveling? My youngest daughter is getting married in a few months and would love to have my 82-year old mother attend, but she needs help flying across the country. — **Searching Daughter**

Dear Searching,

Traveling can be daunting under the best circumstances but for elderly seniors, those with disabilities, or those recovering or rehabilitating from an illness or injury, it can seem particularly overwhelming or unmanageable.

Fortunately, there are a number of companies that provides traveling companion/escort services to help older adults with the rigors of travel.

Whether it's seniors going on vacation or grandparents wanting to join their far-off families for weddings and graduations, travel companions help clients who need help moving through airports, managing luggage, navigating busy terminals and hotel lobbies and much more.

Some companion services even provide personal care like medication reminders, dressing, bathing and feeding. And for those with specific medical needs, traveling nurse services are available too.

But be aware that these services aren't cheap. You will pay for the travel companion's tickets, the companion's hotel room if necessary, meals, incidentals and fees for the service. The price to accompany a client on a plane trip within the United States, including the companion fees and travel costs for all parties, can range anywhere from \$1,500 to \$5,000 or more for coach airfare. Business or first class would cost more.

To locate a travel companion service in your area, search online for "senior travel companion" or "senior travel escort," followed by your mom's city or state. Or use an experienced national service like Flying Companions or FirstLight Home Care, which has a national network of franchises that provides in-home care for seniors, and offers travel companion programs in about one-third of its 130 franchises.

Or, for medical travel companions do a search for "traveling nurse escort" or "medical travel companion," or checkout Travel Care & Logistics, which provides registered nurses as escorts.

If, however, your mom doesn't require a lot of assistance, or if you can't afford a travel escort, consider asking a trusted family

member or friend that has some air travel experience.

Questions to Ask

If you're interested in hiring a travel companion service to help your mom, there are a number of things you need to check into to ensure you get the right escort.

First, if your mom requires personal or medical care while traveling, find out if the escort is trained to manage her healthcare needs. What sort of medical certifications do they have (nursing credentials? C.P.R. training? etc.).

Also, find out how many trips the companion has taken with clients. Have they completed trips with travelers like your mom? How long has the travel service company been in business? What is the company's safety record? And what sort of insurance does it carry, and what and who does it cover?

Also, get a quote breaking down exactly what you'll be required to pay, in addition to the companion's fees. And, get a list of two or three clients/references who has used their service and call them.



Poker Talk

After eight years of reporting on poker tournaments around the world, there isn't a bad beat you can tell me about that I haven't either seen or experienced firsthand. Even so, every once in a while a hand takes place that leaves me shaking my head.

Such a hand took place late on Day 1B of the Mid-States Poker Tour Running Aces \$1,100 Main Event in Columbus, Minn., back in February.

With the blinds at 1,000-2,000 plus an ante of 300, Chris Meyers raised to 4,000 holding As Ac and was met by an all-in three-bet to 20,700 from Whitney Bell, who shoved with the 9c 9s. When action reached Jason Hartwig in the big blind, he four-bet all in over the top for 45,800 with Ad Kh. Meyers, of course, called off his stack of 41,000.

As far as strategy, all three played their hands exactly as they should have. Meyers was obviously going to raise with the best hand in poker, and in order to get action, he raised the minimum. Unfortunately for Bell, he looked down at a nice pocket pair, which justified him shoving his 10-big-blind stack (a 20,000 stack, a big blind of 2,000, so 10 big blinds in his stack). Hartwig also looked down at a quality hand and understandably moved all in to try to isolate Bell. Meyers had an easy call.

As the cards lay, Meyers was a 72 percent favorite, Bell had a 19 percent chance to win, and Hartwig had a 7 percent chance. Even after the flop came down 10h Kd 4d to pair Hartwig, Meyers' chances to win increased to 77 percent.

Bell needed to find one of the two remaining nines in the deck on the turn or river in order to survive - something that would happen 9 percent of the time - while Hartwig had a 13 percent chance of either catching another king or hitting running straight or flush cards.

Remember, this is a hand about bad beats, so you can probably guess what's coming. The dealer burned and turned the 7d, which gave Hartwig the nut flush draw, which he'd hit 24 percent of the time. Still, Meyers was a 71 percent favorite to more than double his stack.

The dealer burned one last time and put out the 3d on the river. Hartwig hit the long shot to make an ace-high flush, crack Meyers' aces and go from worst to first. Meyers was understandably upset to lose the hand, while Bell accepted his fate and headed for the exit.

As the old poker saying goes, the game is 90 percent skill and 10 percent luck in the long run, but in the short term, the reverse is true. Clearly, luck plays a big role in each individual hand. Everyone can play their hands to perfection but not get the outcome they want and oftentimes deserve.

All you can do is play your cards the best you can. Once you do, keep your fingers crossed.

Consider the Amount Bet

A reader writes: "I read where you recommend playing a single zero rather than double 0 roulette game because the casino edge is lower. I normally bet \$5 to \$10 per spin, but my local casino only offers \$25 minimum single zero games. Should I increase my betting level to take advantage of the better odds?"

In order to answer the reader's question, you need to consider not only the difference in the casino's edge, but also the amount bet. It's a fact that the casino's edge is higher on a double 0 wheel rather than a single 0 wheel. The casino's edge is 5.26% on the American wheel for all roulette bets (except the bet on 0, 00, 1, 2, 3, which is higher). On a single 0 wheel (also known as a European wheel), the lack of

one 0 reduces the casino's edge on all bets to 2.63%. At first glance making a bet on a single 0 wheel appears to be the better choice than betting on a double 0 wheel because the casino's edge is lower.

However, comparing the casino's edge of one bet to another without considering the amount of the bet is dangerous. What you must do is factor the amount of the bet to calculate your average cost per bet. The latter is simply the amount bet times the casino's edge.

Let's take the example of betting \$5 per spin on the double 0 wheel. For our calculations it doesn't matter whether you make one single \$5 straight up bet on the inside or outside of the layout or make five different \$1 bets on the inside of the layout. The result is the same. If your total bet per spin is \$5 and the bet has a casino advantage of 5.26% then your average cost to make that bet is 26 cents (\$5 times 5.26%). Likewise, if you had a total of \$10 bet per spin, your average cost is 52 cents (\$10 times 5.26%).

What does the "average cost mean?" It's simply a measure of how much money the casino expects to win on every \$5 (or \$10) bet in roulette over time. Obviously on any one spin you will either win more than \$5 or lose the entire \$5, but over time you can expect to lose an amount of money equal to the total amount bet times the casino's edge (i.e., your cost for playing). In the short term, you could be ahead (due to volatility), but if you continue to play roulette on an unbiased wheel, the casino's edge

will eventually overtake the short-term volatility. The casinos bank on this fact every day that they are in business.

Let's calculate the average cost for making a \$25 bet on a single 0 wheel (casino edge is 2.7%). If you do the math, the average cost is 66 cents. This is 40 cents more expensive than making the \$5 bet on double 0 wheel and 14 cents more expensive than betting \$10 per spin.

The bottom line is that on a per bet basis it will cost you less money over the long haul if you bet \$5 (or even \$10) per spin on a double 0 wheel compared to betting \$25 per spin on the single 0 wheel, even with its lower casino edge. The comparison gets even worse when you consider the number of spins per hour. Normally at a crowded \$5 (or \$10) minimum bet double 0 table, you will average about 30 spins per hour. On less crowded \$25 minimum single 0 tables, you are more likely to average 40 to 50 spins per hour. If we use 45 spins per hour as an average, a player's average hourly cost to play roulette for the \$5 bet on double 0 wheel compared to a \$25 per spin bet on single 0 wheel is:

\$5 per spin multiplied by the 5.26% casino edge X 30 spins per hour = \$7.89 per hour cost

\$25 multiplied by the 2.7% casino edge X 45 spins per hour = \$30.37 per hour cost.

Notice the cost per hour on the single 0 wheel is 2.8 times more than double 0 wheel. The reason

is the more spins per hour and the higher betting level. These two factors more than compensate for the lower casino edge on the single 0 game. Therefore, when comparing the merits of making one bet to another in a casino don't just compare the casino's edge. Factor in also the bet size and the number of decisions per hour to get the true picture what the bet will cost you.







CHICKEN A L'ORANGE

- 4 whole chicken breasts, split and boned
- ½ cup flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- ½ teaspoon paprika
- 2 teaspoons grated orange peel
- 5 tablespoons butter
- ¼ cup white wine
- 1 ¼ cup orange juice
- ¼ teaspoon thyme
- 1 teaspoon marjoram
- 1 11-ounce can Mandarin oranges, drained
- 1/3 cup toasted sliced almonds

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Pound the chicken breasts between sheets of wax paper. Shake the chicken in a bag with flour, salt, garlic powder, paprika and orange peel. Using a large skillet, brown in butter; when browned, transfer to a shallow baking pan.

To a large skillet, add wine, orange juice, thyme and marjoram. Heat to a boil. Pour over the chicken. Bake chicken at 350 degree for 15 minutes. Top with the Mandarin oranges and the almonds and bake for another 15 minutes, for a total baking time of 30 minutes.

Serve with a rice dish, such as rice pilaf. Serves 8.
