Minutes January 22, 2023

- 1. Call to order: President Whelan called the meeting to order at 6:48 pm.

2. CenCON Business

- A. President's Report, <u>C.J.Whelan</u>
 - Because of renovation at the library admin. building, we'll be meeting at different sites:
 - o Feb. 26, Centennial Public Works, 7272 E. Eagle St.
 - o March 25, Trails Rec. Center,
 - April 22, back to the Centennial Center of Generations
 - An audience suggestion was the South Suburban Sports Complex
 - C.J. brought up a proposed July Field Trip to Project Cure to include a service project. The members thought it would be a good idea.
 - Cummins said she could prepare a sample newsletter for neighborhoods.
- B. Secretary, Andrea Suhaka
 - A motion was made, seconded, and passed unanimously to approve the 10/23/23 minutes as emailed. (Hamilton/Rosser)

- Suhaka told the members present that her nonprofit, Transportation Solutions Arapahoe County, has been lending their subscription for Zoom for CenCON use. The bill just came in and it was \$159, \$30 more than last year. CenCON uses the subscription every month, she would request that CenCON pay something toward the subsription. C.J. said we should talk about it next month.
- C. Treasurer, Jill Meakins
 - The amount we have in the bank is \$2277.99. Meakins commented that we were now eating into our reserves and she was worried.
 - Library donation: Meakins made a motion that CenCON donate \$300 to Arapahoe Library Dist. as a thank you for letting us use their building for 2023. Cummins seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
 - Holly Whelan was in the audience and she thanked CenCON.
- D. VP of Membership, <u>Andrew Spaulding</u>
 - CenCON should promote this Center of Generations.
- E. VP of Plans, <u>Rhonda Livingston</u>:
 - She has arranged for this field trip on 7/22. Project Cure is located in Centennial ans delivers medical supplies & services according to dire need in the world.
 - Our service project will be to collect medical supplies in our homes & neighborhoods to donate to Project Cure.
 - We'll tour the facility and see a video on what they do. We might possibly help with the packaging of some supplies. Junior high and high school youth may accompany their parents on the tour. Your neighborhood boards are invited and it will include a free supper supplied by CenCON. Start planning & collecting now.
- 3. **Centennial Government and Special Districts (**We asked our special district guests to limit their comments to 7 minutes.)
 - A. <u>18th Judicial District</u>, <u>Aurora Ogg</u>
 - BoCC's in Arapahoe County (ArapCo) & Douglas County (DougCo) passed a Procla-mation/Resolution on anti-Trafficking of people.
 - The 18th Judicial Dist. will be split, to be completed in early 2025. ArapCo will be the 18th Judicial Dist. DougCo., ElbertCo, & LincolnCo will be 23rd.
 - In early April we'll sponsor another quarterly town hall on retail theft.
 - The Dist. sponsors a Senior Safety Summit every 2 years. It's time, 2024, to have it again this summer. It's a day of workshops & information on safety.
 - B. South Metro Fire Rescue, Kristin Eckmann: not present
 - C. Arapahoe Park & Rec., Delos Searle, Exec. Director
 - APRD is rebranding as Trails Park & Rec. Dist. The Rec. Dist. Is always explaining that it's not part of the county or any city. Hence, a necessary name change.
 - Chantel Erickson has been hired as the marketing director.
 - The Trails Rec. Center is 40 years old this year so, it needs a little brush up, some brightening, remodeling, to be done this fall or next year.
 - Lookout Pool needs significant improvement & will be shut down for this year.
 We're trying to figure out what to do about it.
 - We have some construction projects coming up. We've submitted plans to the Centen-nial Open Space Advisory Board for grants.
 - Klutho: Where are you located? Delos: Our boundaries are basically E470, Hampden/Smoky Hill, Parker Rd. We serve 120,000 residents on 6.14 mills, 1/3 live in Centennial.

 - When staff went remote, a lot didn't come back to the office. We'll translate a lot of the empty space in the building into meeting rooms.
 - Klutho: How many meeting rooms will there be? Holly: We don't know for sure, yet, but there will be a café.

- E. County Commissioner Warren-Gully
 - State Legislature:
 - Rethinking land use & housing in cities & counties
 - Making the Homestead Exemption portable
 - Workforce development board: #1 job market is for folks 70+
 - Homelessness coordinating committee: strategic plan collectively working together to get homeless inside & help for not being homeless again
 - ArapCo got opioid settlement money, parcels out the money
 - Large portion will go to Cherry Creek School Dist. & Public Health Dept.
 - We'd like to set up a detox facility in the west part of the county.
 - The Judicial Dist. split is exciting but, they will be losing efficiencies for admin.
 - We passed our County budget.
 - By 2030, ArapCo will be the most populous county in the state.
 - Spaulding: Are you going to lower your mill levy (11.4 mills)? No answer.
- F. City of Centennial, Council member District 1 Robyn Carnes
 - The City has a Futures Committee to discuss what's going to happen in the next 20-30 years.
 - There's a shift in our buying habits so, developers aren't wanting to build commercial right now.
 - Some new restaurants are coming in but, we'll need foot traffic to support any retail.
 - We are watching out for blight and safety issues.
 - There's been a legislative preview breakfast.
 - Legislature says they've heard the communities.
 - There is a housing shortage in the City.
 - Referring to the construction defect law: Condo insurance is 4x greater than in CA.
 Meakins commented that the insurance lobby will fight any changes.
 - Affordable housing strategies have been narrowed down from 9 to 4.
 - ADUs: expensive to build, rent
 - Land banking
 - Expedited review of plans
 - Inclusionary zoning: developer has to dedicate certain amount to affordable
 - The Point in Time Count is happening on 1/24 to count the homeless.
 - 2/21: Human trafficking art show (See the attached flyer.)

- Imaging Equipment Must be 10 years in age or less and submitted for approval.
- Items are not limited to those listed. The final descision on acceptability of donations is up to the Operations Director or National Director of Procurement
- Highest priority items are bolded

- Expiration Dates Currently we accept items which expire in 2022 or beyond

- No Medication
