Strasburg American Legion Auxiliary Unit #289 – Gold Start Bike Riders stop in Strasburg

The Gold Star Mission is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that honors and supports Gold Star families by preserving the memory of our Fallen Heroes through service to others in need.

The 7th Annua Gold Star 500 Mission Ride, a 510+ mile, five-day endurance bicycling event, will raise funds for scholarships named in honor of the Fallen Illinois Service Members. This event honors the service and sacrifice of nearly 300 servicemen and women from Illinois who gave their lives in Iraq and Afghanistan in honor of our great nation. They died so others could have a better life. Their names must live on.

German Heritage Tour... Faith, Farming & Family

A group of 30 travelers, a majority from central Illinois, traveled to Germany the last two weeks of July on a tour which was about Farming, Faith, and Family. The trip was designed by Dave & Cathy Allen of Arthur, who had Rincker family ties, and Donica Halcom of Champaign. Destinations included farming areas where Dave interned as a college student in 1984, towns where Martin Luther (Protestant Reformation Leader during the 1500's) frequented and the Rincker Bell Foundry in Herborn, Germany. The trip was planned to be taken in 2020 but was postponed three years due to Covid.

The group enjoyed seeing how bells are made in the Rincker Bell Foundry (Glockengießerei) and toured a bell museum at the castle, (Glockenmuseum at Burg Greifenstein). They enjoyed visiting with Hanns Martin Rincker and his nephew Christian Rincker (14th generation of the Rincker family to work at foundry). Church bells at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Strasburg have all been made at the Rincker Bell Foundry in Germany.


~We Remember~


