Spike in UOF reports. Make sure they are as accurate as possible. D.A.'s not "shy" about filing against officers for false reports.

Body-worn cameras are coming soon to a department near you. PORAC BOD and LDF is currently in the process of coming up with a position and recommendations as to their implementation and use. Some of the issues identified and discussed with respect to BWC's, legislation, and POBAR amendments, included:

- 1. Officer absolute RIGHT to view video recordings prior to providing statement, testimony, or writing of reports.
- 2. Right to privacy through amendments to the California Public Safety Records Act; adding privacy, in addition to safety, as a basis for non-disclosure.
- 3. Entire preclusion of disclosure of any recordings depicting the death or serious injury of any person.
- 4. Amend POBAR to notice officer prior to release of video
- 5. Meet & Confer prior to implementation of BWC's.
- 6. Implementation and use of BWC responsibly

An item discussed at the meeting, with respect to BWC's, is the costs associated with their use. Many at the meeting were of the position that if legislators are going to mandate BWC's, they should also mandate who is going to pay for file storage; the ongoing costs for which are significantly higher than the one time cost for the purchase of the cameras.

Probation (Criminal) Jury Duty exemptions bill is in its 2nd attempt. Unfortunately, the 1st attempt did not exclude civil cases, and State Legislators felt that Probation Officers could still serve on civil juries. AB989 (Juvenile cases – Sealing) Currently, after a juvenile terminates probation, the department no longer has access to the juvenile's records, including violations, treatment plans, etc.; resulting in duplication of efforts. This bill would fix the unintended results of the sealed records.
