Made In Canada! Yes, these were invented in Canada!

IMAX

Canadian filmmakers Graeme Ferguson and Roman Kroitor first pioneered the technology of highresolution images on huge screens at Montreal's Expo '67. With businessman Robert Kerr and engineer William Shaw, they founded Multi-Screen Corporation, which later became IMAX (short for "Image Maximum"). The first permanent IMAX theatre, the Cinesphere, opened in Toronto's Ontario Place in 1971. Originally used for science films and documentaries, IMAX was bought in 1994 by an American company, who turned it into a Hollywood powerhouse. Its headquarters remain in Toronto.

Goalie mask

Hockey itself may have actually originated in England. But the hockey mask, which has helped keep many a goaltender's face intact, was first worn regularly by Montreal Canadiens player Jacques Plante in 1959. He was at first mocked for wearing the mask, and his coach didn't like it because he thought it would be a distraction. But once Plante donned the mask, the Canadiens went on to an 18-game winning streak, proving players could perform just as well—if not better without the threat of a puck to the face. Plante's equipment innovation is now standard gear for professional and amateur hockey players.

Global time zones

Clocks telling the time in cities all around the world wouldn't be possible without Canadian railroad engineer Sandford Fleming. In centuries past, local times were based on the sun, making them all slightly different from place to place. This didn't matter much until rail travel made a standard system of keeping time across distances much more important.

After missing his train and getting stuck on a railway platform due to nonsynchronized clocks, Fleming came up with the idea of creating 24 time zones across the entire globe, which would form "international standard time." In 1884 at the International Meridian Conference in Washington, D.C., he presented his ideas, which were eventually adopted worldwide.

Trivial Pursuit

We can thank two Canadian journalists for setting off the quiz trend that's still going strong today (think of how many online trivia quizzes you've taken!). In 1979, *Montreal Gazette* picture editor Chris Haney and sports journalist Scott Abbott came up with their own game while playing Scrabble. They scraped together a few investors, and after a slow start, Trivial Pursuit became "the biggest phenomenon in game history," *Time* magazine reportedly said. Over 100 million copies of the game have been sold, and 50 special editions have been created. Sadly, Haney died in 2010 at the age of 59.

Rotary snowplow, or "snowblower"

The first rotary snowplow, which used a spinning mechanism to lift snow and shoot it away, was invented by J.W. Elliott, a Toronto dentist, in 1869. Soon after, Canadian Orange Jull improved the design with a new patent, with that machine first utilized in 1887, pushed by locomotives to clear snow along railways. In 1925, the blower was adapted for trucks by Canadian Arthur Sicard, a milkman tired of climbing over snow to make his deliveries. He called his invention the "Sicard Snow Remover Snowblower."

Garbage bag

In the 1950s, Winnipeg's Harry Wasylyk used flexible plastic polyethylene to create the first garbage bag. At the same time, a couple of other Canadians, Frank Plomp and Larry Hansen, were working on their own version of the plastic garbage bag. But it was Wasylyk's that came up on top when Union Carbide Company bought his product and manufactured it for home use under the name *Glad* in the 1960s. In 1971, University of Toronto chemist James Guillet created a more ecofriendly, biodegradable version.

IMSA Revises the 2020 Racing Schedule

Corvette Racing's schedule for the remainder of the 2020 season has been revised again. The most recent, as of June 25^{th} , is shown at the right.

Corvette Racing will participate in the IMSA WeatherTech 240 At Daytona on July 4 but only 5,000 Florida residents are eligible to attend in person at a mere \$30 per ticket. That race restarts what is now an 11-race season for the Weather-Tech Championship that runs through to November, ending with the Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring on November 11-14.

The green flag will drop at 6:05 pm, with qualifying being held the prior day. Corvette will compete against the two-car Porsche team and the two-car BMW team. Corvette has been given a 0.2 mm larger air restrictor, 3.0L fuel capacity up to 97.0 L, and a minimum rear wing angle of +3.5 deg.

Both the July 4 and July 18 races will be broadcast live on NBCSN and if you have *Velocity* on your dial, you may be able to see them. Also online at <u>www.IMSA.com</u>

At the conclusion of the season, Corvette Racing will lose a fierce competitor when the Porsche team withdraws from competition. That will leave only BMW and Corvette Racing, and the occasional appearance of a single Ferrari from Risi Competizione. No. 3 driver Jordan Taylor, when asked, said "It's disappointing to see them gone..." Sportscar365.com suggests this is "the first official causality of the Coronavirus pandemic..." and the sanctioning body to "take note of the situation and respond to what's likely to be a challenging road ahead for motorsports in general."



Inducted in 2013, Johnny O'Connell embodies what Corvette Racing is all about: determination, focus, fiercely competitive, relentless and obsessed with victory. Out of the car, however, he is very approachable, fun, engaging, and always ready to talk with fans about what makes the Corvette so great. His accomplishments include four wins at the 24 Hours of Le Mans, the overall winner of the 2001 Rolex 24 at Daytona, eight class titles, a three time ALMS Champion with 38 ALMS wins. After Corvette his success in racing continued with

Wilmer Cooksey Jr. served as Corvette Plant Manager from February of 1993 until his retirement in March 2008. As the first African-American to earn the position and the man who held it the longest, he brought a life-long love of Corvette to the job. Believing in the phrase that "none of us are as smart as all of us," he worked with the United Auto Workers Union and listened to customers to make the Corvette exceed the expectations of all who dreamed of having one someday. Wil earned a B.Sc. degree in electrical engineering and a Masters

degree in industrial engineering; he graduated from Officers Candidate School and served as a 1st Lieutenant in the U.S. Army where he was awarded the Bronze Star. He is the winner of a number of honors and was inducted into the NCM Hall of Fame in 2013 in the GM/Chevrolet category. Wil is the author of "*No Time to Cry*" – an excellent read! John Heinricy's influence on the Corvette can be seen in the 1989 Corvette ZR-1 "Record Run" - not only the car, but as homage paid to the team that set 12 international world time / distance speed records in a ZR-1 and L98 Corvette. Heinricy was a key member of the Corvette Racing C5R effort in 1999. He worked for decades behind the scenes to create the kind of finely-tuned driving dynamics that allowed modern Corvettes to compete with and beat the best sports cars in the world. Heinricy served for many years as the manager of the Corvette Development Group at the GM Proving Grounds at Milford, Michigan and in 1990 was named Corvette Assistant Chief Engineer responsible for the C4 through 1996,

including the 1995 Corvette Pace Car, 1996 Grand Sport and Collector's Edition. He was inducted into the NCM Hall of Fame in 2014 in the GM/Chevrolet category. Read more about John Heinricy at https://www.corvettemuseum.org/learn/about-corvette/corvette-hall-of-fame/john-heinricy/

In case you have yet seen/read this... Since the C8 weight distribution is 40/60 with the engine behind the driver, the jack or lift must be mounted to the chassis locations properly or the unthinkable could happen as the lift is raised.
