There being a quorum, Mayor Simmons called the meeting of the Vienna City Council to order at 6:30 p.m.

NEW BUSINESS

Alderman Hill made a motion to Approve the Omnibus Consent Agenda consisting of the February 19, 2020 Council Meeting Minutes and the Warrant (\$11,242.78). Alderman Tuey seconded the motion. All in favor, Motion carried.

Alderman Hill made a motion to Authorize and Approve the City of Vienna to open two checking accounts with Banterra Bank for the purpose of Illinois Dept of Natural Resources and Illinois Dept of Commerce and Economic Development grants for amphitheater/restroom project. Alderman Owen seconded the motion. All in favor, Motion carried.

Item number #5 on the agenda was tabled and would be placed on the next scheduled meeting's agenda.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Joseph Emery announced the grand opening ribbon cutting ceremony of The Art Gallery Off the Square. The event would be held Saturday, March 21 from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. at 206 West Vine Street. Emery invited the mayor and officials to attend.

Mayor Simmons announced that he would be undergoing surgery on March 17th therefore he would be absent for that week's meeting. Simmons noted he had not missed a meeting since he took office in 2009. Mayor pro-tem, Richard Owen will be filling in for Simmons during recovery.

Clerk Wright announced the spring city wide cleanup would start Monday, April 27th as Bulldog would pick up miscellaneous items. The rest of the week the city would pick up white goods and e-waste items.

Wright also mentioned receiving information of a small grant the city could apply for through AARP community challenge, geared towards parks and recreational areas. Wright said there was no match needed for the grant and she would place it on the next agenda for approval to apply.

Treasurer Meyers briefly mentioned several properties that were delinquent with utilities saying the council will need to decide whether or not to pursue placing liens on properties. The issue would be discussed with city attorney.

Fire Chief Williams said he was working on a fire dept billing ordinance with City Attorney Presser including discussion of outstanding fire call invoices. Williams also said he applied for a small equipment grant through the State Fire Marshall.

Phil Morris said Johnson County Revitalization was raffling off a zero turn mower as funds would go towards beautification. Morris also said he was approached about placing a souvenir penny machine in the depot. Morris said it would be at no cost to the city and the city would receive 40% of sales.

As there was no further business to discuss Alderman Owen made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Alderman Racey seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Mayor Simmons declared the meeting adjourned at 6:59 p.m.

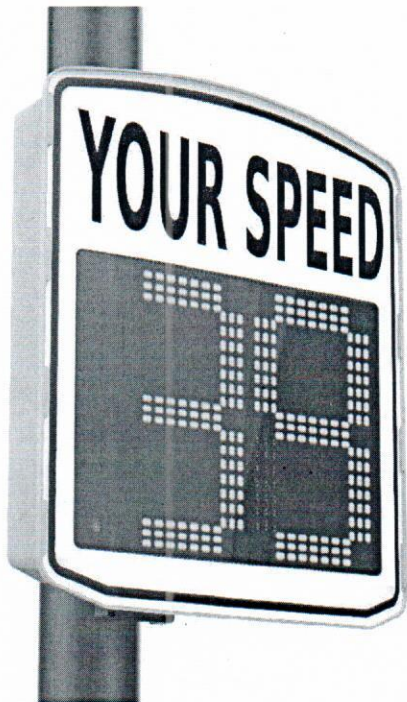

The following Project Proposal has been submitted to the City requesting consideration for the provision of TIF Funds in support of the costs expected to be incurred. We have reviewed the applicant's proposal and have outlined key project features and economic impact aspects below:

Project: Construction of new warehouse facility

Applicant/Developers: Rick Nannie, CEO, Highly Favored Properties LLC & UCOA, LLC

Project Location: 45 Industrial Drive (TIF #1)

Johnson County PIN: 08-04-201-028

Estimated Total Project Cost: \$67,500 (Breakdown on following pages)

Project Overview: The applicant would like to construct an additional building of approximately 2,100 square feet in size to use for inventory warehousing.

It is their belief that by expanding their ability to stock more items, they can capture additional market share from contractors in the area and increase their overall sales figures.

Potential Employment Opportunity Impact

Due to the expansion of the service ability of the facility, the applicant has indicated that they could hire up to 3 new employees as a result of the project.

Estimated Economic Impact on Sales Tax Revenue

The City will collect the usual 1% from all taxable sales which occur at this location. (\$100,000 in taxable sales will result in \$1,000 in tax revenue for the City's general fund).

The applicant has indicated that they estimate \$1.4M in taxable sales to occur at this location annually. This represents \$14,000 in sales tax revenue for the City. This figure could increase if the business succeeds in growing its customer base and level of sales.

Note #1: This parcel was the location of a project undertaken in 2015 where the original UCOA building was constructed. **The applicant was awarded \$20,000 in TIF assistance for this project (75% reimbursement for 10 years).** This reimbursement agreement is still on-going.

- Projections indicate that this new project could result in approximately \$5,500 in new TIF Revenue over the next 10 years.

Request for TIF Assistance: The applicant has requested assistance with the costs for site preparation & foundation construction.

Opinion on the Provision of TIF Assistance

Should the City wish to provide TIF funds to support this project, the recommended strategy for assistance would be a one-time grant payment to reimburse the Developer for a portion of the site preparation costs incurred

Suggested Assistance Package to offer:

Grant Amount: TBD by the City Council at their discretion – suggested between 25%-50% of the site preparation costs (\$2,250 – \$4,500).

Term: Payable upon completion of the entire project as determined by the City.

No payments are recommended to be made prior to the review of the eligible costs incurred, as verified and confirmed by the City or its consultants, in their sole discretion. No payments utilizing TIF Funds may exceed the total Eligible Redevelopment Project costs verified to have been incurred in conjunction with the project.

Project Location: 903 Galeener Street, Vienna, IL (Vienna TIF #1)

Estimated Total Project Cost: \$70,700 (Breakdown on following pages)

Project Overview: The applicant has proposed to renovate and redevelopment the existing building and property located at 903 Galeener Street for the purposes of operating a daycare and child development facility. The facility will cater to children from 6 weeks to 6 years old and offer daycare and early learning services for up to 45 children. *More information available in attached letter from the applicant.*

The proposed work includes:

- Installation of new roof
- Installation of new siding
- Kitchen remodeling and new appliances
- General interior remodeling
- Installation of outside play equipment & small bicycle track
- Installation of fencing and shade providing elements
- Paving the front parking area

Opinion on the Provision of TIF Assistance
