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Pantry at Thanksgiving. Next, we turned our efforts to our annual Toy Drive and contributed to The Little Saint Nick Foundation by sponsoring 145 gift bags which were distributed to local hospitals. Most recently we came together with the LBSEA and ASPPG, and raised \$8,100 for the Bats Out for Lazar Foundation at our annual bowling fundraiser. These are just some of the many charitable events that we sponsored, not to mention all the individual and building Sunshine sponsored events that happen every day.

We need to make sure we stay strong in our advocating to restore our Foundation Aid. I want to thank everyone who answered the call and allowed us as an organization to send over 1,000 electronic letters and over 2,000 printed letters to our legislators to make sure they heard us loud and clear. It's amazing to see that even when faced with hard challenges our membership does not get discouraged. That time and time again we step up and fight for what is right. We will continue to fight this battle and so many other important ones, like Fix Tier Six and fixing APPR.

The connections and partnerships that we make with our students, their families, and the stakeholders in the district, allow the community to see the commitment that we have made to Long Beach. It is those relationships and our commitment that gives the community the confidence to support Long Beach Public Schools, including the annual budget. We are fortunate to work in a district that time and time again comes out to support their public schools.
