Holiday Beech Villas has been busy this summer. Here are a few projects we have accomplished:

- since pressure washer was stolen we used algae remover for all the front decks and stairs
- repaired a ceiling in the F building due to a water leak from the outside of the building
- Fixed rotted wood at a unit at the B building
- fixed a water leak at the front of a unit at the E building, and all of the first floor front wall, which has caused algae on the inside of the unit
- When cabinets were removed, it was found that there was no wall behind those cabinets. Added front wall and insulation.
- fixed front landing to the F building where deck was unstable
- fixed B building 2nd floor deck boards
- reinforced and repaired deck boards at E319

H building is coming along and is expected to be complete by the deadline of December 26, 2017.

B2O4, which was in a tax foreclosure, has been sold. HBV is likely to received back approximately \$8,500.00 from this sale to recoup some of the dues that had not been paid since 2013.

John has placed shovels and ice melt buckets on all floors of all buildings. We do not shovel any decks unless it is an emergency. Arrangements have been made with Matt of Mile High Landscape, who not only does our weedwhacking, but also plows when we receive at least six inches of snow. Matt will continually check our driveways for ice and put down ice melt, as needed.

I'm excited about the progress we are making at Holiday Beech Villas. I wish each of you a safe and happy holiday and a healthy and prosperous New Year.

Treasurer's Report

At the end of October, we had \$5,270.00 in Homeowner's dues delinquents for the current fiscal year.

The H/G buildings assessment has a delinquency of \$4,065. The bulk of these delinquent amounts are from 3 units. One unit has been foreclosed, as mentioned in the President's Message, and we will receive back payments. Claims of Lien are being prepared for the two other units if payments are not received.

Our reserve account has a balance of \$32,000.00.

The balance in our checking account is \$22,648.97

The balance of the Special Assessment account is \$31,330.05.

Woolly Worm Festival Winter Predictions

Aspen is the winning woolly worm of the 2017, 40th anniversary, Woolly Worm

Festival in Banner Elk.

As tradition and folklore beckons, official festival forecaster Tommy Burleson predicted the upcoming winter's forecast based on the color of the 13 body segments of the woolly worm. Each segment represents one week of winter; black segments represent a harsher winter, while brown segments predict a milder winter. According to Burleson, the forecast is as follows:

Week 1 through 3 below average temperatures with snow.

Week 4 through 9 average temperatures, meaning 27 degree temperatures.

Week 10, average temperatures with light snow.

Week 11 average temperatures.

Week 12 and 13 below average temperatures with snow.



Rays Weather Winter Fearless Forecast

10% to 15% less snow than the long-term average overall, with the western edge of the Appalachians getting a better share than the rest of the region in the form of NW Flow snows. Temperatures about 1 degree above long-term averages (with big swings warm to cold). Below are forecast totals for snowfall total including snow/ice falling between October 2017 and May 2018.)
