Our August 9th speakers will be Congressman Jeff Flake, candidate for United States Senate, Teresa Wright and radio personality Mike Broomhead about a special project for the Arizona Republican Party.

CHAIRMAN'S CORNER - Doug Little

This past weekend, I was visiting a friend of mine in the Salt Lake City area. While Arizona and Utah are many miles apart, both are "Red" states, with predominately Republican voters and many of those Republicans share conservative values.

My friend shared a story about a 5th grade program at her son's elementary school that if successfully completed would result in her son receiving a "Patriot Award". I was impressed that such an awards program would even be offered in a public school, since most public curriculums barely include American History and rarely include 'government' studies. With all the stories we hear about liberalism in the education community, seeing this program for the kids was indeed refreshing.

I asked to see what the requirements for the award might be and was surprised to find them quite challenging for the 5th grade level. Students were required to learn the names of all 50 states and their capitals. They were required to be able to name every American president in the order of their holding office. They were required to name and label each of the 13 original colonies on a map and multiple book reports from a required reading list were also a part of the program.

Another requirement was to do a presentation on the major phases in the evolution of the American flag, from the original Betsy Ross flag in 1776 through the "Stars and Stripes" as they fly over our country today.

One of the requirements that I found to be the most interesting was a test they had to take to match historical quotes to the person that said them. I thought I would share some of the most meaningful of them, because in my view, the selection of quotes was impressive. I'd be curious as to how many of them we could name if pressed for an answer.

A few of the more significant ones were:

"And so, my fellow Americans: ask not what your country can do for you - ask what you can do for your country.

"Mr. Gorbachev, tear down this wall!"

"I have a dream that one day little black boys and black girls will be able to join hands with little white boys and white girls as sisters and brothers. I have a dream today!"

"We must all hang together, or most assuredly, we will all hang separately."

"Genius is one percent inspiration, ninety-nine percent perspiration."

"This was not an act of terrorism, but it was an act of WAR."

"A government of laws and not of men."

"I know not what course others may take; but as for me, give me liberty or give me death!"

Certainly these are worthwhile quotes to reflect on, whether you are a 5th grader or an adult.

Overall, this was work that would take a student an entire academic year to complete and that required a lot of support from parents to insure that everything was correct. Of course, in the process of completing the project, the student and parent would have a lot of time to talk about what American values are all about and why they are so important to preserve.

The only sad part was the fact that out of entire 5th grade class, only two students chose to embark on this program. Only two...out of over 120. My friend's son did it because his Mom encouraged him to do it and promised her help. Apparently, many of the parents didn't think it was important enough to spend time on. This is truly heartbreaking to me.

For us to preserve American values, we must take the responsibility to pass those values down to our children...to help them see what makes this great nation unique in the world. It is our responsibility to help them understand why what we have is worth defending, if necessary, with our very lives. The preservation of those values enshrined in the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution are essential if we are to preserve our way of life. But in order to preserve it, we much first teach others about why it matters which is hard work that requires time and effort.

I'd like to share a quote which was not included in the award requirements but perhaps should have been; outside Independence Hall when the Constitutional Convention of 1787 ended, a certain Mrs. Powell of Philadelphia asked Benjamin Franklin, "Well, Doctor, what have we got, a republic or a monarchy?" With no hesitation whatsoever, Franklin responded, "A republic, if you can keep it."

Truer words were never spoken....
