## Prayer Requests


Your prayers are requested to know....

#### **Meet Petals Graduate Mitchele Atieno**

After four years at Petals of Africa School, Mitchele graduated in 2015. She is now in her final year at Kapsabet Girls Secondary School and exceling academically. Mitchele and her four siblings are being raised by a single mom. Her father was killed in 2008 during the post-election violence in Naivasha, where he was working at a flower farm.

Mitchele's mother is a subsistence farmer, growing enough to feed her family and selling any surplus to help meet the needs of her family.

Mitchele took advantage of her time at Petals, working hard and finishing as the top student in her 8<sup>th</sup> grade class. Thanks to a generous sponsor, she was able to attend high school, and her grades have been consistently outstanding. Her report cards usually include remarks like this one: "Excellent work. Keep it up to maintain these encouraging results."

Mitchele has never failed to write her sponsor thank you letters several times a year, and she is grateful for the opportunity she has been given. Recently she wrote, "Thank you for your support all this time. I think I am the luckiest of people on this planet. From the bottom of my heart and much sincerity, I am grateful."

As a reminder, only \$250 allows an orphan to live and be schooled at Petals for one year.

There have been big improvements to the infrastructure at Petals, including new toilets and showers for the girls, repairing cracks in buildings and



stabilizing foundations, re-cementing floors, painting classrooms and roofs, adding water tanks and gutters, repairing playground equipment, and more.

We're so grateful to an anonymous donor for making all this possible!

Thanks to WIN, Petals now has two grain silos that will each hold 45 bags of grain. This not only provides safe storage for the maize, but will allow Petals to buy maize when prices are low, helping the school to save on food costs.
