



Diorama Backgrounds Formatted to fit shoe boxes up to 14" wide when printed on legal sized paper.



Originally sized at width 14" x height 7" x depth 6", 150 DPI. Can be resized for different sized boxes.




Can be run on legal or letter sized paper, depending on size of shoe box.

Printed on plain paper in fast draft mode to conserve ink.



These free flannel and magnetic board pieces can be printed (card stock works best) and cut out to glue in student dioramas. They are NOT clip art, so they are not easy to resize, but students can cut off the white or black bubbles around the images, leaving a half inch on the bottom edge. Fold back the bottom and glue it to the base of the diorama so the item can stand up. One or two items may be useful in your students' dioramas.
