MORE ON POLLINATORS

May is the time of the year when many of us begin to think about our vegetable gardens and all the delicious vegetables and fruits we will enjoy throughout the summer and fall. As was mentioned in last month's *Saints Alive* a pollinator is an animal or insect that causes plants to make fruit or seeds. They do this by moving pollen from one part of the flower of a plant to another part. This pollen then fertilizes the plant. **Only** fertilized plants can make fruit and/or seeds and without them plants cannot reproduce.

Bees, hummingbirds and some kinds of butterflies are the best pollinators because they get their food from the plant and brush up against parts of the flowers. We need to invite these pollinators into our gardens by planting flowers that are beneficial to the pollinators.

ANNUALS (plants that last one season): alyssum, marigolds, cosmos, lantanas, petunias, snapdragons and sunflowers. As the flowers fade on these plants they need to be deadheaded (the old blooms cut off). This will encourage new blooms.

PERENNIALS (plants that last more than one year and bloom at different times of the summer): purple coneflower, black eyed Susan, milkweed, coreopsis, bee balm, Joe Pye weed, aster, goldenrod, yarrow, butterfly bush, veronica, phlox, foxglove, liatris, Russian sage, dill weed, violets, clovers and even the common dandelion.

For vegetable gardens plant some of these flowers in your garden to attract pollinators to your plants in order to fertilize the plant which will in turn produce your fruit and vegetables.

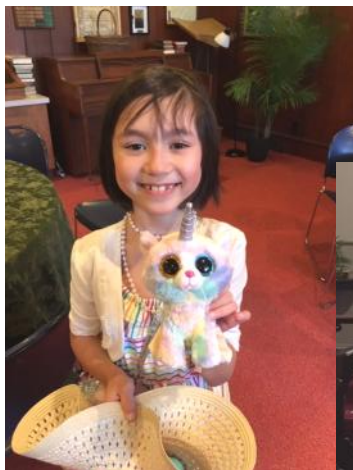

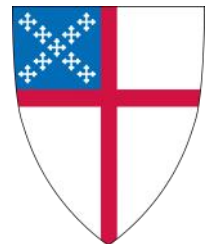
