Business items:

- **1)** Treasurer's Report:
 - a. Treasury balance was \$4,251.66 (total of bank + CoH expenses).
 - b. Bank balance was \$3,510.55 (included deposit of \$75 and expenses of \$1,182.90).
 - c. Cash on Hand (CoH) reported by the treasurer last month (Feb) was \$741.00.
 - d. Income this month (Mar) was \$75 for contest awards sponsorships.
 - e. Expenses this month (Mar) were \$775 for medal order, \$307.90 for two-year website renewal and \$100 to purchase monthly raffle prizes (total expenses \$1182.90).

Reminder: Club Annual Dues of \$12 per member for 2018 are due starting in January. Still \$12 for adults with no dues for juniors under 18 years old. New adult member dues are prorated at \$1 per month for the remainder of the calendar year, first month's meeting attendance excluded. Please see the treasurer, Ralph Nardone, if you need to pay your dues.

Reminder: If you pledged to make a \$25 donation to the NACM paver fund that the club has already paid your donation in advance. Please see Ralph and make your reimbursement payment to the club.

Note: The mini NACM pavers for each of the individual donors have already arrived, so once you reimburse the club you will receive your mini paver. Ralph will have the mini pavers at the meeting. **Bring your money.**

- 2) This month we made a purchase of 24 kits to use as monthly raffle prizes. The kits were offered by David Bridges for \$100 to cover the cost of postage. An inventory list of the kits has been made and will be passed around for review at the meeting. These kits should cover us for the next two+ years of meeting raffles.
 - a. This month we also raffled off the first one of these kits, Meng's "British Heavy Tank Mk. V Male, with Full Interior", kit #TS-020, won by Rebecca Hettmansperger.
 - b. This kit collection is top notch, so you'll want to bring some extra money for raffle tickets each month. There will be a really great kit on the block every month for the next two years. Don't miss out!
- 3) Our club website came up for renewal this month. The cost was \$307.90 for the next two years. We are still using Go Daddy. If any member is willing to take on the job as web designer / web master and build us a site from scratch, please let Mike know. Jeff Nelson continues to manage and update our site.
- **4)** Our Gold-Silver-Bronze medal order was received this month and is now paid in full (\$775 for 200 medals). We now have 130 gold, 130 silver and 90 bronze medals on hand. At the

current average issue rate of 50% gold, 30% silver and 20% bronze these medals should cover us for at least this year's and next year's shows.

5) June Show Report:

- a. We currently have 25 vendor tables reserved / sold.
- b. Our show poster was on display at the AMPS Atlanta show. We distributed show flyers and vendor solicitation letters there, too.
- c. See Mike or Jeff to get show flyers and mini-posters to put in other hobby shops if you plan on traveling out of the local area and will be patronizing other hobby shops.
- d. We received \$75 this month in show award sponsorships. Remember that every member of the club can (and should) solicit award sponsorships. Info on costs and promotion benefits to the sponsors are available from any of the club officers or show committee members.
- 6) Our current 2018 Membership Roster has been updated. We have 34 active members (i.e. paid dues and attended at least one meeting in the past year) and 5 "honorary / associate" members (members who have moved outside the area). A copy of the membership roster is available for any member who requests one. Send Mike an email on the club email account to request one. Please do not distribute the membership roster outside of the club.
- 7) We had 11 club members patronize the Atlanta AMPS / AMFS show last month (Feb). Everyone who entered models / figures in the shows earned medals. In addition, we had 3 members earn their AMPS Table Captain certifications: Phil Cavender, Tom Wingate and Trevor Edwards. Bryan Moeller attended the TC training seminar.
- **8)** The floor was opened for new business:
 - a. There was no new business.
- 9) Following the business portion of the meeting, we took a short break for shopping and social mixing. After we reconvened we had **Show & Tell** with new stuff, builds and WIPs (see the list above). - **10)** After the meeting we had about 14 members go to the "meeting after the meeting" at Schiano's Pizza across the parking lot.

2) June Scale Model Mega-Show Report:

- a. We currently have 35 vendor tables reserved / sold.
- b. We received \$150 this month for vendor tables.
- c. We will need to order our special awards soon. If you have any ideas or comments about what we should do for these, please let me know. If we're going to do the acrylic awards again, I would like to do new artwork. Needed are new line drawings of tanks and AFVs to get engraved on the awards. If you have any such drawings, or come across any, please send them to me ASAP!
- **3)** The situation and physical organization for our monthly meetings at the HobbyTown store is becoming a hindrance and detractor to the purpose of the club. The cons:
 - a. The current location in an aisle in the middle of customer foot traffic sets us up for constant disruptions during meetings from customers and store patrons not affiliated with the club.
 - b. The long, narrow table and seating arrangement means that members on opposite ends of the meeting cannot see or hear what's going on. This makes it very difficult to run the meetings as well as hindering the social aspect and meeting purpose. Our club has dramatically grown in size, and our average meeting size is now near 20 members each month with some meetings around 25. The currently allocated space in the model aisle is inadequate to our needs. There is no room to set up AV equipment (a screen and projector) for presentations.

- c. We have been customarily devoting more than 25% of our meeting time each month to shopping (~30+ minutes out of each 2-hour meeting). There is a lot of pressure to spend money. Yet, over the last months, the store has become less and less accommodating to the product requests of our members. The time we allot for shopping is time that we do not have for the meetings resulting in rushing through our Show & Tell and limiting our demos and presentations.
- d. In response to this situation, on Saturday, 31 March, Mike Roof, Ralph Nardone and Matt Goodman conducted a site survey of the meeting facilities available at the new Richland County Library Branch located at the Village of Sandhills shopping center.
- e. This facility is less than one mile from our current meeting location at the hobby shop. It is open to 9 pm on our regular meeting nights. The meeting room has seating for 30, although the table space available is slightly less than what we now have. No food or drinks are allowed. We would not be allowed to conduct demonstrations involving the use of paints. However, there is a craft room which we could possibly use with some advance planning and coordination.
- f. The library meeting room is in high demand and requires a Richland County resident with a library card to reserve it. There is no charge, but meetings are limited to two hours. Strategic scheduling would likely make it possible to occupy the room from 6 to 9 pm by reserving it from 6 to 8 pm and showing up a few minutes early (to set up) and just staying late. The odds of someone reserving the room for the last 45 minutes of a weeknight are very low which means that we would be able to linger in the room until closing (technically at 9 pm, but the library starts clearing patrons out at 8:45).
- g. The question this month is: Do we want to make a reservation and test out this potential new meeting venue? The earliest available date will likely be in June.
- **4)** At the present we have 11 club members who are planning on attending the AMPS I-Con next month in Dayton, OH. This meeting is the last opportunity to conduct any face-to-face coordination for activities.
- 5) Floor will be open for New Business.
- **6)** Following the business portion of the meeting, we'll take a short break for shopping and social mixing.
- 7) When we reconvene, we'll have a **Round-Table Regular Show & Tell** of new builds, finished models, works in progress and cool new stuff bring it all with you to share! We'll draw for the monthly raffle prize winner at the end of the meeting. See Ralph, our treasurer, for raffle tickets at any time during the meeting.

Don't forget the "Meeting after the Meeting" at Schiano's across the parking lot next to the Publix. Make plans to hang out and eat dinner if you can. Everyone's welcome – no special invitation required!



Tony Kelly, "For me personally it's several.

First, is subject. Certainly, with the influx of new kits, new companies that just seem to spring up overnight, the possibilities seem endless. What was once a question of whether or not we'd ever see certain "subject's" in styrene is now a complete after thought. With today's technology and companies (R&D Programs) devoting so much time, money and resources into a certain subject(s), and with the help of Countries/Curators assisting in the development and accuracy of a kit is certainly a draw for me.

Secondly, going to model shows. That's something that's always seemed to be the main driving force for me. Seeing other modeler's work, learning new techniques and just the camaraderie as well. And lastly, looking at magazines, reference material, (both old & new) websites and may be doing a subject that I've not seen a ton of. Just a few notables from my perspective."

Interruptions of present builds for me come from different sources, new kit releases, new conversions becoming available. Sometimes new and better references for something in my stash or even prompted by current events.

Our AMPS show theme recently nudged me into picking up one of my older finished, or so I thought kits, updating it and placing on a terrain base. Not really a new build but did qualify as my last new build.

Having said all of that, my 'next build' will be a modern German Marder Mk.5 with thermal covering as seen in Afghanistan. A resin conversion kit plus stowage. I am waiting for the conversion to arrive in the next week or so from Germany. It is designed to fit the Revelle Germany kit.

The reason being for me is, it has a different look and a little out of the normal day to day run of the mill builds, a little something different and I like items like that. I find it difficult these days to start and finish expeditiously, I certainly cannot build to a deadline and won't undertake building for compensation.

For me I like to build my next build when the urge hits me nothing more."

Interesting Articles - Razor Saws

At our March 14, 2018 AMPS meeting I spoke to Mike about a problem I had created with my M51 Israeli Sherman. I glued the fenders down...not good. Mike told me I should cut the fenders where it connects perpendicular to the glacis and that would need a really thin razor saw.

I own a thin razor saw. I have the JLC Razor Saw from the Czech Republic and that's really thin. I bought my JLC Razor Saw through UMM USA. As I was about to grab the saw, I remembered that I bought a set of Tamiya photo-etched saws at Hobby Town. I had no reason to buy them except that I wanted to get something and I like Tamiya products. Turns out they came in very handy and made quick work of the offending fenders. I don't remember the Hobby Town price, but they are \$9.32 on Amazon.







They come in a pack of 6 on a steel fret. 3 have the saw edge on the hypotenuse of a triangle and the other 3 have the saw edge that goes around a curved edge, including the tip. These are 0.1 mm thick.





They are very flexible and strong being made of steel. I guess the JCL razor saw is also made of steel, but it broke easily (during a different project). It seems more that the blade is brittle, though I may have been a bit too rough with it. The Tamiya saw blades are the same size as a #11 hobby blade, and they will fit into your Xacto handle without issue.



I want to cut in the red circle. Which to choose, JCL or Tamiya?



Because they are small, you can easily get into tight places where the JCL saw won't or with great difficulty. I probably could have used the JCL saw blade without the handle, but I like my fingers too much. I bit awkward.




The straight edge and diminutive size of the Tamiya saw blade worked great against the flat side of the fender.

It fits just right.



It made a nice straight cut and without a lot of effort.

From the front however, the fender looks way too thick so I wanted to remove the cross hatched area.





To take the extra fender off, I used the blade with the rounded saw tip and easily removed the extra plastic. I wouldn't have been able to do that with the JLC razor saw and it would have taken a while using a knife blade. Not saying it couldn't have been done, just that it would have been more time consuming and I'm sure I would have made a blood sacrifice as well.




What once was a project destined for shelf of doom, became a happy project again. I owe it all to Mike's recommendation and my Tamiya Saw blades that I bought just because I wanted to spend some money. It's always nice to have the right tool for the job.




