The maximum total eligible exhibits from a breeding unit are 10 head. For junior female, dry cow classes where prize money is offered, exhibits per breeding unit are restricted on multiple exhibits for milking female classes.

All exhibits must be owned by and registered in the name of the exhibitor.

1.	Female - calf born between Sep of last year - Feb this year from a dam with at least one record with a minimum B.C.A. of 125 for milk and fat.	45.00	35.00	25.00

4.	Female - two years old born between the months of Sep - Aug. In milk, dry or not yet calved for the first time. 5.	Female - three years old born between the months of Sep - Aug. In milk or dry. If dry, must be within approximately eight weeks of calving. At least one record with a minimum B.C.A. of 125 for milk and fat.	45.00	35.00	25.00
6.	Female - four years old born between the months of Sep - Aug. In milk or dry. If dry, must be within approximately eight weeks of calving. At least one record for a minimum B.C.A. of 125 for milk and fat.	45.00	35.00	25.00
7.	Female - five years old born between the months of Sep - Aug. In milk or dry. If dry, must be within approximately eight weeks of calving. At least one record for a minimum B.C.A. of 125 for milk and fat.	45.00	35.00	25.00
8.	Female - mature cow born six years ago prior to Sep. In milk or dry. If dry, must be within approximately eight weeks of calving. At least one record for a minimum B.C.A. of 125 for milk and fat.	45.00	35.00	25.00
9.	Breeder's Herd (bred and owned by exhibitor) - group of four animals but not more than one bull. Each animal in the group must have been exhibited in one of the classes for single animals. The registration certificate for each respective animal must show the exhibitor as "breeder" and as "owner". In both cases, either as an individual or in partnership. In other words, the exhibitor may be a "joint owner" of an animal and/or the "joint breeder" of an animal. All the animals must be from one farm or breeding unit.	45.00	35.00	25.00

Production Records

A.R.O.P. Inspection Report PL113L, R.O.P. certificate, a similar inspection report or certificate issued by an approved supervised D.H.I.A. (P.A.T.L.Q, Quebec) plan or official breed association document signed and certified by the association is acceptable proof of performance. A projection of milk production computer printed on an inspection report is proof of performance provided that the inspection report was printed within 60 days of the day of judging and that the projection is based on a lactation period of at least 90 days.

NOTE: A projection of a cow’s milk production may be used to qualify the cow or her daughter, where applicable, but not her sons. No photocopies of sales catalogues will be accepted as proof of performance.

A fair has the authority to make the B.C.A. requirement more restrictive.
