Proper Concert Audience Etiquette

The WHS Vocal Music Department is proud to showcase our students at concerts. While everyone may have different reasons for attending this evening's concert, please keep in mind that the most important reason is to watch and listen to the performers. Good concert etiquette helps the singers perform more effectively and improves the audience experience. Please respect and set a good example for our students by observing the following rules of etiquette. Thank you!

- Remain silent during the performance. Please turn off all electronic devices before the concert begins. Refrain from making verbal contact with anyone on stage.
- Remain still during the performance. Please refrain from waving to anyone on stage, or in the audience, to allow the performers to focus.
- Show respect for all of the performers by staying for the entire concert. Students are responsible for staying for the entire duration of the concert as part of their performance grade. Please stay seated during the performance. If you must leave your seat, please exit and re-enter only during times of applause.
- Show your appreciation to the performers by clapping appropriately at the end of each selection. You will know that a selection has ended when the conductor's hands are lowered to his/her sides. Please refrain from cheering. whistling or yelling. Wait until a number has finished before acknowledging any soloists. When the applause has faded away, return to quiet mode so the performers can focus on the next selection. Also, please refrain from talking while choirs enter and exit the stage.
- Younger children are always welcome at our performances and should remain seated with their parents for the entire performance. Children should also remain with a parent at all times before and after a concert.
- Courtesy to the performers and other audience members is appreciated. Anyone coughing excessively, or any parent who is accompanied by a crying child, should exit quietly and return during the applause.
- Please do not use flash photography. Flashes can disorient the performers and detract from their focus on the conductor.
- Remember that most performances are recorded by professionals. Please avoid any disruption that would negatively impact the quality of their recording. Likewise, audience members who are using video recording equipment should position themselves in a manner that does not obstruct the view of others.

Westside to Stage Fiddler on the Roof

Fiddler on the Roof first appeared on Broadway in 1964 and set the record for the longest-running musical in its day. It earned 10 Tony Awards and inspired four Broadway revivals for a grand total of 4,484 performances. During intersession, Westside will perform this extraordinary show at 7:00 p.m. in the high school auditorium on October 15th, 16th and 17th, and at 2:00 p.m. on October 18th.

In many ways, WHS's *Fiddler* production is epic in its own right—from the size of the cast, to the grandeur of the set. Like the original *Fiddler*, it has required collaboration among many talented individuals. Once again, *Kyle Avery* and *Jeremy Stoll* are teaming up to lead the production and have secured some valuable help from the community. Stoll explained that he and Avery selected *Fiddler* because it supported a large cast with a good balance of roles and songs for males and females, but soon discovered other benefits as well. "It has a great message for a modern audience and also has great potential for students to learn about the Jewish faith, customs and traditions," Stoll said.

Appropriately honoring Jewish culture was extremely important throughout the process. "To that end," Stoll said, "we've hired some really incredible, knowledgeable people. Michelle Garrity, our choreographer, has choreographed the show several times and is familiar with all of the traditional dances. Esther Katz, Cultural Arts Director at the Jewish Community Center, is serving as a researcher and consultant to ensure we're not missing any details or misrepresenting any part of the Jewish culture. Finally, our Production Assistant, Kim Clark-Kaczmarek, who has worked on other *Fiddler* productions, is on board as head costumer and is helping with scene design."

The scenery, in fact, has a story of its own. Last summer, a handful of students traveled with Avery and Stoll to Red Oak, Iowa and loaded a 26-foot moving trailer with pieces of scenery that were largely from a 2009 Omaha Community Playhouse *Fiddler* production. Stoll said the scenery is beautifully made and that they "...are doing some very interesting things with the set to make it a uniquely Warrior Theatre production."

In total, Westside's production of this iconic show involves 76 students—as cast, crew or members of the orchestra. Each

group is challenged in unique ways. The 42-member cast rehearses two hours every weekday and longer on weekends. However, only four rehearsals were devoted to learning the vocal music. "Beyond that," Avery explains, "we have to perfect vocal performances individually and in small groups. It's definitely a lot less time than these students get to work on music in choir or show choir. We really depend on having smart performers who are willing to learn a lot of it on their own."

The crew has its own set of challenges due to the number of logistics to be managed. For example, Avery said, "We put body mics on actors who have lines or solos in the show so they can be heard over the pit orchestra. A play without singing/music typically doesn't need amplification, but musicals are different." Since it would be too expensive to rent microphones for all 42 cast members, they put a student crew member in charge of assigning and trading mics to actors throughout the show.

Another challenge the team faced was directing the title role. Avery said, "The fiddler plays an important part in the show, but the role isn't described well in the script, so we are figuring it out for ourselves. In many productions, the violin music is played from the pit orchestra and an actor fakes it. Fortunately, we have a very talented student violinist, Emily Hammans, who will actually be playing the fiddle on stage."

The show benefits from many talented instrumentalists. Avery said, "There are 19 orchestra members, and 11 of them are WHS students. We are very grateful for these student performers since they are so busy with marching band, show choir band, school orchestra, community ensembles, etc. They get a total of 10 rehearsals to perfect over two hours of music—and it isn't easy music. It was written for Broadway professionals! The other eight musicians are adults from the community and even some Westside teachers!"

Of course, the bottom line is that Westside's *Fiddler on the Roof* is not to be missed. "It's an iconic show that a lot of people have been in or seen, and it's exciting to become a part of that Tradition! (get it?)" Stoll jokes.

Handel's *Messiah*: A Collaborative Event

This year's Choral Collaborative involves choirs from Omaha Benson, Creighton Prep, Bellevue East, Lincoln Southwest, Papillion La Vista South and Westside. They will perform in partnership with the Omaha Symphony in the Holland Performing Arts Center under the baton of Ernest Richardson. This year's "Master Work" is GF Handel's Messiah, which is perhaps his most famous oratorio. Handel composed nearly 30 oratorios and close to 50 operas. Written in 1741, and first performed in Dublin in 1742, the Messiah is Handel's most renowned work. The Choral Collaborative performance is Sunday, November 15th at 2:00 p.m. Tickets are currently on sale through the Omaha Symphony and Ticket Omaha. This event is expected to sell out quickly. All-State Chorus

Again this year, Westside High School's choral students will be among the many students from across Nebraska who will audition for the All-State Chorus. Participating students will video record their auditions on Friday, October 9th and Saturday, October 10th. The video format allows students to audition in a familiar environment while alleviating any schedule conflicts. With over 70 Westside students auditioning this year, students will only be given one chance to create their recording. Auditioning is optional for seniors, juniors and sophomores.

All students who plan to audition must learn seven required pieces in advance. However, they will only be recording small sections of three of the pieces. They will also be required to sing scales and arpeggios as part of their audition. All participating students have received recordings of the required music, which they should be rehearsing outside of class. We wish all auditioning students best of luck in this music tradition.
