



SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Francesco Antonio Fasani
(1681 – 1742) lived his whole life as a
loving, devout, and atoning man. He
entered the Conventual Franciscans
in 1695, and 10 years later taught
philosophy to younger friars, served as
guardian of his friary, and eventually
became provincial minister. When his
term of office ended, St. Francesco
became master of novices and finally
pastor in his hometown of Lucera.

Known throughout his various ministries as being loving, devout, and penitential, he was also a well-known confessor and preacher. St. Francesco was a loyal friend of the poor and worked tirelessly to find ways to support them. He was a mystic with such a profound prayer life and supernatural gifts that he was known to levitate during prayer. He was canonized in 1986 by Pope John Paul II.
