# UNION VALE TOWN BOARD MEETING JANUARY 19, 2017 TOWN HALL 249 DUNCAN ROAD LAGRANGEVILLE NY 7:00 PM

**PRESENT**: Supervisor Tompkins

Councilmen: Steven Frazier, Corrina Kelley, David McMorris, John Welsh

#### THE MEETING WAS OPENED WITH THE FLAG SALUTE.

#### **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

Supervisor Tompkins made a motion to enter into Executive Session which was seconded by Councilman Welsh. All members of the Board were in favor.

Supervisor Tompkins made a motion to exit Executive session at 7:28 PM and reported no money was spent and no decisions were made. Councilman Welsh seconded the motion and the regularly scheduled meeting resumed.

#### REPORTS OF SUPERVISOR AND COUNCIL

Patty received a letter from Marc Molinaro thanking the Town of Union Vale for their efforts in the 'Think Differently' campaign. She also reported she and Confidential Secretary, Mary Pearson, were working on organizing her office and discussing grants that Union Vale may apply for. In addition, they have been working on the employee handbook. A meeting was scheduled with a commercial realtor for the Route 55 property however, the broker did not show up for the meeting. She has another meeting with a different agents' office which she Councilman Welsh and Assessor Robert Taft will be present.

Councilman Frazier offered an apology for missing the prior organizational meeting due to illness.

#### **PARKS**

Mr. Gosnell had been in touch with AECOM regarding the Furnace Pond Dam and had a representative survey the area to assemble a report for an inspection and maintenance log that needs to be put in place and he has been helpful.

A flood in the large hall in happened last week and NYMIR has be very accommodating and responsive. Security cameras have been installed throughout the park. The ice skating rinks are up but not useable until the weather allows temperatures low enough to freeze for approximately a week. They have also repaired a deck to make it safe for use again. Eagle Scout John Cox built 2 ADA compliant picnic tables as part of his Eagle Scout project.

# BOOKKEEPER

Mr. Courtien reported on the A-Fund Revenues \$86,004.55 A-Fund Expenditures \$298,092.92 and the D Fund expenditures \$123,438.58.

He also reported that he is working on the final numbers from 2016, and preliminary numbers indicate after subtracting the Expenditures from the Revenues that total is a \$194,000.00 which increases the fund balance. He will work with the accountant to determine exact figures. The property tax decreased approximately 4.69%.

Councilman Frazier inquired if the \$194,000 were unspent funds. Mr. Courtien said yes and clarified the numbers.

In summary, the Town spent less money than it brought in which resulted in an increase in the fund balance and therefore taxes went down. He also received paperwork about the Bond the town will be getting and the interest rate is in the high 2% which is lower as the initial estimate which was around 3.25%

## RECREATION

The recreation registration website is up and running is operational for residents and community members. They can pull up invoices, information for taxes and see level of activity. Credit cards will be accepted as well through the new site. Camp registration will be open February 1<sup>st</sup>. A few upcoming events are free family movie night with "Finding Dori" January 27<sup>th</sup>. Youth entrepreneur's will be beginning this month and each month as well which is a new program along with a free both at Community day. There will be a 2<sup>nd</sup> annual kids overnight Saturday, February 4<sup>th</sup>. Full Moon Hike on February 10<sup>th</sup> for further information on any program, feel free to reach out by phone and email to ask any questions.

## **HIGHWAY December & January**

Mr. Wisseman reported the department plowed and sanded several times, and salt and sand were delivered during the month. They also washed the trucks several times. They repaired a lower section on the side of the salt shed and fixed 2 mailboxes. They did some work on Cutler Lane and Mack Road and removed a dead deer from Darren Road. They installed a new window in the backhoe and serviced truck #3 while also having some warranty work done on truck #4. They are in the process of replacing the hydraulic tank on Truck #3 and replaced the cutting edge on truck #14. There was work done on a minor water problem on Tompkins Road and picked up some orange garbage bags on Tompkins as well. A few potholes were filled with cold patch. Larry Paggi noticed a sag in the roof of the metal building which needs to be dealt with by professionals who work on steel buildings. He will have someone take a look and report on the repair costs. The 2004 Chevy fly wheel is no longer working and needs to be repaired and is not something that can be done in house.

## MOTION TO REPAIR FLYWHEEL (Resolution #17-17)

Councilman Welsh made a motion based on the two quotes to award the repair work to Ed Davis to repair the fly-wheel. Councilman McMorris seconded the motion

Councilman Frazier noted that this may be a cause from a larger problem so asked that additional repairs be included in the motion if so needed.

Supervisor Tompkins Abstain due to a conflict of interest.

Councilman McMorris asked if Mr. Wisseman could take a look at Hoofprint Road as there is a sag in the road near the beginning by the culvert.

#### **MEDIA**

We need a new battery back up the meeting and explained the failure in a cost of around \$350.00 which he will work on with Ryan Courtien, the Board did not need to approve this purchase as it is under the procurement policy as long as it is budgeted.

## **DISCUSSION OF ASSOCIATION OF TOWNS**

Supervisor Tompkins said that two Town Board Members could attend which was budgeted. It was surveyed that Councilman Frazier and Councilman McMorris could attend for \$400 each or \$800 total. Supervisor Tompkins stated both were able to travel back and forth by train. Councilman Frazier stated that he would like to stay over as networking is a large part of the Association of Towns and would like to request funds for lodging. Mr. Courtien added

registration costs are \$100 and therefor any remaining costs may cover the additional lodging. Councilman Welsh said that any money that is not covered can be transferred after all costs have been determined. Councilwoman Kelley added that the costs might even out if Councilman McMorris uses less of the \$800 and Councilman Frazier uses the extra for lodging.

#### DISCUSSION OF JOHN DEER SURPLESS

Memo from Jake Gosnell: The Parks and Recreation Department has excess equipment that we would like to sell at auction. Some of the equipment is past its usable lifespan, the rest of the equipment is not used and he would like to auction off the equipment to add revenue for the town The equipment:

- Gator Utility Vehicle 6X4: over 3,000 hours on it; it is past its usable lifespan and has been decommissioned.
- Scag Zero-Turn Mower; model szc36A-19KA; this mower was purchased by a previous park manager and it is rarely ever used. It is too small to be a viable resource for the park.
- John Deere Heavy Duty 72inch Plow & Kit; originally purchased for the Gator Utility Vehicle xuv325i; in the years since it has been purchased, it has never been used.

In his opinion, we should sell these items now before they sit and deteriorate past the point where they cannot be sold.

Supervisor Tompkins said a resolution was created for this item. Councilman Frazier said he would like to use Absolute Auction because they are local, they do not have listing fees and they were used last year. Councilman Frazier also recommended that the profit be put into Mr. Gosnell's Parks Equipment line.

#### **PROPERTY**

Supervisor Tompkins noted she had a meeting with a realtor that never showed up. She is currently looking to set up another meeting with another realtor. Councilman Frazier inquired on the last appraisal, things change and that is why Supervisor Tompkins asked Assessor Robert Taft to assist as he is an appraiser as well. Councilman Frazier asked if the workshop sessions can be set up starting next meeting to change things to make the property more attractive to buyers.
