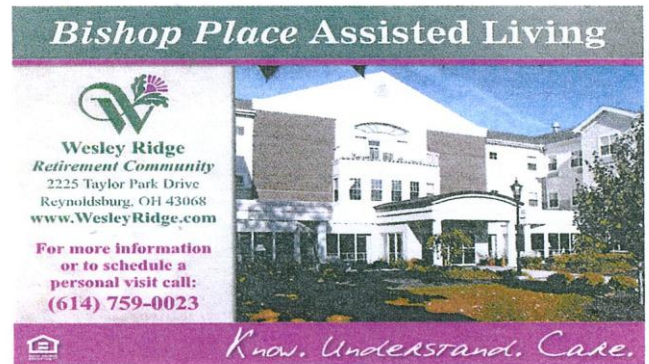


BOARD NOMINEES

They just implemented a new trip scheduling software (Ecolane) and they are pleased to report it is allowing them to provide more trips than they have done in the past! What does this mean for you. You will need to book your trip at least one day in advance for the cheaper fares \$1/\$2 versus a \$5.00 same-day fare. You are still able to book your trips up to two weeks in advance. They will continue to take reservations Monday thru Friday from 8:00am until 4:00pm via telephone, or you may use a new "self-service" portal that allows you to book/manage your own trips! In addition they will be adding a feature that will allow you to receive a text message alert and/or a phone call to remind you of your trip or the location of your bus. They thank you for your patience and support during this transition. They are very excited to implement this new software product that will become the backbone of Fairfield County transportation system.
