

Procedures & Preparations for Bedbugs

Thorough adherence to these instructions is mandatory in o	rder to properly treat and eliminate the bedbug
infestation.	

Prior To Treatment:

Before our Bed Bug Specialist can perform a proper bed bug treatment, Customer must complete the following:

- Seal in plastic bags ALL items below and place in the center of all rooms scheduled for treatment:
 - Items inside the closet, including closet floors
 - Items under beds
 - Items on top and inside furniture (dressers, desks, cabinets, etc.)
 - Bedding (including pillowcases, mattress pads, sheets, blankets and any other items from bed)
 - Data disk, tapes, audio, cassettes, CD's, DVD's, etc..
 - Umbrellas, hats, scarves, shoes, linens, and towels.
 - Unwanted items: after treatment, you may discard these items.
 - Vacuum cleaner bag
- In All scheduled treatment rooms:
 - Remove all pictures from walls
 - Unplug all electrical equipment, (i.e. computers, printers, scanners, TV's, DVD's, clocks, cable, etc..)
 and move this equipment away from walls
 - Remove walls plates and electrical outlet covers
 - Disassemble bed frames, including head boards
 - Move all items (expect heavy or secured furniture and appliance) 2-3 feet away from the walls
 - Cover all fish tanks and turn off pump. All people and pets must leave the area during treatment.

Post Treatment:

Do NOT remove any items from infest rooms until **AFTER** the bedbug treatment is completed. This will help prevent the transfer of bedbugs to other areas within your property.

- **Do not enter** treated room(s) before the specified re-entry time. (4 hours after treatment has been applied)
- **Upon arrival, ventilate** treated areas by opening doors and windows for at least thirty (30) minutes to exchange inside air with outside air before re-occupying structure. Fans will help speed ventilation.
- Keep adults, children, and pets from touching or stepping on treated areas until surfaces are completely dried. Thoroughly wash hands or any items that accidently come in contact with wet surfaces.
- Perform the following infested items, especially for those items enclosed in the plastic bags you placed in the center of rooms:
 - Wash infested clothing, bedding, and all washable items in hot water and dry at the highest temperature
 setting. Place items that cannot be washed such as drapes curtains, upholstery and clothing that cannot
 be washed or dried in your regular laundry dryer into plastic bags for drop-off to a professional dry
 cleaner. Include warning signs with each bag indicting possible bedbug infestation so the dry cleaner can
 take necessary precautions.
- Attempt to determine how your rooms, units, home, r building were infested, and avoid the same factor that caused the infestation in order to eliminate or minimize the possibility of future bedbug infestation.
